Another Zero Week - Keep It Up!



Another ZERO week ... "This is great news! Let's extend our ZERO performance one more week," commented Jesus Gonzalez our CEMEX UK President. "Our statistics show that February is a month where we experience a spike in incidents, especially slips, trips and falls. Please take extraordinary precautions to keep everyone safe and always STEP IN when you see an unsafe behaviour.

It is very sad to read that we had 5 fatalities across CEMEX worldwide operations in January. This is a reminder that we need to stay very vigilant 24/7. I'd like to share with you the message from our CEO Fernando Gonzalez with regard our performance in

January. Please share it with your Teams":

"January has been a terrible start to the year in terms of fatalities and I'm deeply saddened by the events that have occurred. In fact, over the past few months we have witnessed an adverse trend in fatal incidents and I do expect all Line Managers, especially in the operations where they have been occurring, to help reverse this situation as quickly as possible. We can do this by properly implementing our Improvement Plans in a timely manner and by ensuring we introduce additional controls where needed across all our operations as we learn from the tragic incidents that have taken place. The Safety Alerts that are issued following the release of investigation reports provide you with valuable information, so please make sure that you personally review each one and that together with your Management Team you agree what additional steps need to be taken to prevent a recurrence.

On a more positive note, it is pleasing to see that 30 countries achieved the first month of the year with ZERO employee and contractor LTIs and that our employee LTI Rate has reduced by 44% when compared to the same period last year. We still have many challenges, but performances like this convince me that we can overcome them and achieve the ultimate target we are all striving for, which is ZERO fatalities, ZERO LTIs and all other types of injury. I rely on you all to keep insisting that safety is at the very top of everyone's agenda so we can achieve our ZERO-4-Life target."

9 Years LTI Free For Northfleet Concrete Products



Congratulations to all employees and associated contractors at Northfleet Concrete Products for achieving 9 years without a lost time injury on the 19th January 2015. This demonstrates that all the hard work and effort that everyone, past and present, has put in over the 9 years to achieve this goal has been very effective.

The site produces around 50,000 breeze blocks and 144,000 block pavers for the housing markets on a daily basis, as well as loading these products on the wagons

during the day it becomes a very busy site! So it is a MASSIVE pat on the back for the Team's commitment in managing to maintain the high production levels and loading the many wagons which come in on a daily basis, whilst keeping health and safety top of their priority during their working shifts.

Our priority at Northfleet is for all employees and contractors to continue to go home healthy and uninjured, this means that we will not stand still but continue to focus our efforts to make Health and Safety our number one priority.

David Harrison's Bright Idea



David Harrison, who works in Ash Operations at the Drax site, has won an award for submitting the best bright idea for 2014. David implemented a new winch and lift at the Drax site to allow for the safe transportation of ash sample buckets from the classifier building to the ground floor. This eliminated the need to regularly carry heavy buckets up and down an external set of stairs.

In the picture David is shown receiving his award from Ash Operations Director, Laurence Dagley, who commented: "During 2014 we received many excellent bright ideas from our workforce. David's idea was chosen as it was fully implemented by our Drax Team, leading to a valuable safety improvement."

Get A Grip! Don't Fall In Feb



This week's Slips, Trips and Falls poster focuses on getting in and out of the cab correctly using the vehicle's grip handles.

Far too many drivers use the wrong hand holds - using the steering wheel and door as grip points - both of which are not a fixed point and can move.

The incident used on the poster demonstrates the consequences of not having the correct grip - a bad back and several weeks of suffering. This driver was lucky he was wearing a safety helmet as he fell backwards to the ground.

So remember when getting in and out of the cab:-

- Do not carry objects keep both hands free
- Keep steps and boots clean
- Report defects such as broken handholds or steps
- Use the correct cab hand holds
- Use all the steps do not take a short cut

Please ensure you STEP IN and display the poster (in the download section of UK News or at the end of the print out) in a prominent position on notice boards, particularly in areas where drivers are likely to see this. Use the poster as a focus point of discussion at safety meetings and STEP IN if you see drivers not using the right grip.

Mobilmix 2.5 will be able to supply at a rate of up to 90 cubic metres per hour. Its sister plant, also a Liebherr 2.5, which will be on the Widnes side of the crossing, is due to start being built later this month.

The book 'Engage' tracks the life of Matt Hampson, a young rising star at Leicester Tigers and England who was involved in a scrum accident which damaged his spine and paralysed him from the neck down. It charts the way he overcame the negatives of such a serious and life altering situation and created **The Matt Hampson Foundation** which now helps many young people who have been seriously injured whilst playing sport. Their ethic is to GET BUSY LIVING and certainly aim to help people to do so.

This inspirational charity provided Mark and Rob with the platform to develop their music festival and events from which Hamplified was born. Since 2012 Hamplified has gone from strength to strength raising over £12,000 to date. It is a great event which is only successful with the help of Rugby St Andrews RFC, Matt Hampson, CEMEX, musicians, comedians, local rugby clubs, stall holders, local media, the community, friends and family.

Hamplified is now recognised by the Matt Hampson Foundation as one of the foundation's Top 10 fund-raisers in the UK. Rob and Mark were invited to meet Matt Hampson at last year's Aviva Premiership cup final which was a great experience and they wish to thank everyone involved for helping make Hamplified the success it is today.

- 1x Northampton Saints shirt signed by the winners of the 2010 LV cup final squad



This week Rugby Cement Plant successfully completed its EU-ETS Greenhouse gas emissions verification audit with BSI for 2014.

The verification process was completed over a number of stages throughout 2014, with the final verification being completed early in the 2015. CO2 emissions for Rugby Cement Plant are calculated utilising: cement sales figures, production, fuel and raw material consumption data, physical stock measurements and laboratory analysis results.

As such, many functions at Rugby and business areas throughout CEMEX are involved in generating the CO2 calculations including: Cement Operations, Sustainability, Cement Logistics, Projects and Business Performance to name but a few.
