

A photograph taken from the bridge of the Sand Heron approaching the Selsey dredge area (just off the Isle of Wight), shows some of the challenges our Marine colleagues face when winning materials for us.

The first photo was taken at 15.00 on 23rd Feb with 3-3.5m swells and no chance of loading. The second was taken at 10.00 the following morning with 1.5-2m swells as the vessel started to load. Shortly after



taking the picture Captain Peter Dixon was forced to abort the loading operation after a freshening Westerly wind caused increasing swells.

So next time you are out in the wet and wind on site spare a thought for our dredging teams too!!!

Readymix announce proposal for customer centre changes



On Monday Readymix announced a proposal to reorganise 5 Customer Service Centres at Thorpe, Fulham, Rugby, Preston Brook and Uddingston to one Centre. It's proposed that this would be together on one Customer Centre floor at the Rugby Office.

We are fully consulting with employees who are in roles affected and recognise it will be a difficult and concerning time for them - it is no reflection of their commitment and individual effort and the existing Centres have served us well over the years.

However we are always looking to improve what we do and this proposal, if it goes ahead, would be another step in our journey to improve efficiency and serve our Readymix customers more consistently and effectively.

The proposal is that the changes will be phased between July and September 2015, with Centres in the Southern, London, Northern and Scotland Regions being closed in that order. The company will of course make every reasonable effort to find suitable alternative employment for those directly affected if the proposed changes go ahead. As usual in these situations it is our priority to ensure that everyone is communicated with on a regular basis and to make sure people are treated with integrity and honesty.

CEMEX UK launches Ready Wallform at Ecobuild



Last week our housing solutions team launched a new ICF (insulated concrete formwork) product aimed at housebuilders in partnership with Beco Wallform.

Ready Wallform is more thermally efficient and quicker to construct with than traditional blocks and bricks. Current pressures on housebuilders to complete more properties and shortages of labour and materials will all contribute to the attractiveness of ICF, now





and into the future.

As part of our contribution to the Global Grow the Pie effort, Housing Solutions has been created to grow and develop our share of the housing market here in the UK. This will be done in a number of ways with various sectors of the housing market requiring different solutions.

Over the last 12 months a team from CEMEX UK has been working very hard on bringing innovation into our housing offer. Part of this was to establish a relationship with an ICF (insulated concrete formwork) manufacturer to align us with the global approach to housing. Just last month we finally signed an agreement with Beco Products, based in Brigg, North Lincs, to become our UK partner for the supply of ICF. Beco have a strong history of providing ICF, under the Beco Wallform brand, particularly into the selfbuild market. Their product, produced locally, was also technically assessed both here and at our global research facility in Switzerland as being far superior to other systems on the market.

This week we are launching our own brand of ICF, Ready Wallform at the Ecobuild show in London.

Gold dust....new West London reserves



Last week the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead resolved to grant permission for 2.1M tonnes of new mineral reserves and a concrete plant at Riding Court Farm, Datchet. As with all sites in the South East, this was not the most straight forward site, especially as one phase is Grade 2 listed park land, but thanks to a fantastic effort by both the internal and external teams we got there in the end. Well done to everyone involved!

Climafuel Production Starts at Malpass



Following the construction phase during 2014, SITA began commissioning their new Climafuel production plant at Malpass in January. Initial deliveries of waste were received into the facility at the beginning of February and the first load of finished Climafuel was received into Rugby Plant on 1st March. We will be reviewing the quality closely over the next few days to ensure it meets our specification but regular deliveries to site are expected to start over the next few days.

This is an important milestone in our 25 year partnership with SITA as both companies have put in a great deal of effort to get the project to this stage. The facility will be receiving up to 300Kt per year of input waste and this will come from

mainly commercial and industrial sources but SITA also have a contract to receive some municipal waste from Northamptonshire. In combination with the other SITA facility at Landor St in Birmingham, SITA will eventually supply all of the Climafuel required for Rugby Plant.

Last week, 10 members of the SITA team that will be operating Malpass visited Rugby Plant to have a presentation of how our process works and they also went out onto site to see how the Climafuel is received and fed into the kiln. Return visits for the CEMEX team to visit Malpass will be organised over the next 2 weeks to improve their understanding of how the SITA plant will operate and how best to optimise the fuel quality. These visits will also help to promote good communication links between the plants as this will be essential to get maximum benefit from our partnership with SITA.

One Vision...



Last week 50 of the senior managers held a strategy day. The day included a launch of the global CEMEX vision and values. Our current Helping to Build a Greater Britain vision and values fits perfectly alongside them and the managers were asked to sign a giant vision board to show their commitment.

Minister visits Attenborough
