Ensuring safety – nothing is more important...



As we heard from our CEO Fernando Gonzalez last week, June has been a terrible and sad time in terms of health and safety performance across CEMEX globally, with the deaths of 9 people as a result of 8 incidents.

Fernando highlighted that, whilst the investigations into these incidents might conclude some were not caused by the actions of people working for the business, it is apparent that this is not the case with several of them.

With one of our new corporate values as ensuring safety, nothing is more important to our global business than keeping people safe.

He stressed that, as we have seen all too often, the fatalities relate to either road traffic collisions or contractor activities, most often both, and asked all operations to focus on three specific areas in order to stop this tragic pattern of incidents:

- Review control measures for contractor management and road transportation activities, referring to the requirements in the CEMEX Health and Safety Management System. (Link:

- Where gaps are identified in control measures, formalised plans should be developed to address the shortfalls, with weekly updates being provided to line managers.
- Regularly recognise good performance, but also hold people accountable for any substandard health and safety performance, including contractors.



Fernando Gonzalez added, "The health and safety of our employees, contractors and others who we interact with is our number 1 priority. There is nothing more important than preserving the lives and integrity of people and I expect you all to ensure lives are preserved, not lost, within your area of responsibility."

Whilst safety has no memory and we need to push relentlessly to maintain our accident and incident free status, please do take the time to celebrate the success locally and reflect on the achievement. Well done and thanks."

Graham, (not Dolly) Parton has hit a whopping 4 5years with CEMEX. Graham reflects on his 45 years. "On 10 August 1970 when I was aged 16 I joined Rugby Cement, working in the Laboratory as a Trainee Chemist. In 1983 I transferred to the Central Laboratory until 1985. Between 1985 and 1995 I worked in the Laboratory at Southam Works before returning to Rugby. In 1999 when the new plant opened I left the Laboratory to train as a Process Controller running the new kiln in the Central Control Room where I still work.

The main change since I started with the company is Health and Safety. In 1970 PPE wasn't compulsory as it is now; people walked around the plant in just overalls – no glasses, high vis jacket, safety shoes or ear protectors. Also all laboratory analysis was 'wet chemistry', now it is mainly XRF analysis and automatic sampling. We have come a long way since 1970.

You may be interested to know that I met my wife Joan in 1978 when she worked for Rugby Cement in the office at Rugby Works and we have been married for 34 years and have two children. My father Jack also worked with the company from 1958 as a Driver and then later in the Despatch Office until retirement in 1983. My sister Lin, brother Les and brother-in-law John also worked at Rugby Cement. So cement has been a real family affair for us!"
