

New Waste to Fuel Facility Launched for Rugby Cement Plant



Fernando Gonzalez, our Global CEO, came to the UK for the opening of the new Suez waste facility which will supply the CEMEX Rugby Cement Plant with a sustainable alternative to fossil fuels for the next 25 years.

The Senior Executive Vice President of SUEZ and CEO of CEMEX, along with the Mayor of Rugby, (pic right) officially opened the new Rugby Solid Recovered Fuel (SRF) facility on Friday September 18th.

The SRF facility, owned and operated by international recycling and waste management company, SUEZ, will supply our Rugby Plant



with a direct replacement for fossil fuel, manufactured using nothing but local rubbish.

The fuel, known as *Climafuel*®, produces a similar amount of energy to traditional coal and new facility will supply up to 250,000 tonnes of it to CEMEX every year to help meet the significant energy needs of the plant and improve its environmental performance.

The Rugby Solid Recovered Fuel Facility was built as part of a 25-year contract between SUEZ and CEMEX, which was signed in 2012, and it is understood to be the first of this duration in the UK outside of the PFI mechanism.

The SRF facility can process up to 400,000 tonnes of residual waste each year and around 70 per cent of the input material comes from businesses in the region, while the remaining 30 per cent is household waste, much of it originating from Northamptonshire County Council. The majority of this waste would otherwise be destined for landfill or Energy from Waste (EfW).

Jean-Marc Boursier, Senior Executive VP of SUEZ in charge of Recycling & Waste Recovery Division for Europe said:

"We are very pleased to officially open the Rugby Solid Recovered Fuel Facility and formally mark the start of this long term partnership between SUEZ and CEMEX. We are committed to operating a world class facility in Rugby and our focus is very much on manufacturing excellence and a high quality of production."

Fernando A. Gonzalez, Chief Executive Officer of CEMEX, said:

"This long term partnership with SUEZ in the UK reinforces one of the main drivers of our strategy: ensuring that sustainability is fully embedded in every aspect of our business. More than 90% of our active cement plants consume alternative fuels, with 9 of them having surpassed a 50% alternative fuel rate and 5 exceeding 65% last year. We remain committed to setting ambitious targets to keep CEMEX moving toward a sustainable future."

Pigs to Clean 92km Long Pipeline



CEMEX UK Cement operates a 92km pipeline which runs from Kensworth Quarry on the Dunstable Downs to its cement manufacturing plant at Rugby. **The pipeline transports around 5,000 tonnes per day of chalk slurry** which represents around 80% of the raw material requirements for the Rugby kiln.

With the line operating at 124 bar, maintaining its integrity is not only critical to the operation of the plant but there are also wider safety and environmental responsibilities since it passes through hundreds of different land ownership boundaries and beneath numerous roads, motorways, railways, canals and

rivers on its way to Rugby.

To assess the condition of the 26km Kensworth to Brogborough section of the line, an internal cleaning and inspection operation was recently successfully carried out using a series of pipeline inspection gauges (or PIGs as they are known).

The PIG's comprise a number of close fitting discs mounted on a central carrier and travel inside the pipeline in a similar way to the piston in a bike pump.

Each PIG has a different function and initially cleaning PIG's are used to remove accumulations of build up and debris from the wall of the line. These are followed by intelligent inspection tools which carry a number of sensors and data loggers to record and measure in detail the features on the line such as weld locations and also anomalies such as pipe wall loss due to corrosion.





The operation was carried out "on line" during normal pumping operations using the Kensworth slurry pumps to propel the pigs through the line in a slug of water sandwiched in between slurry being pumped to Rugby. A total of 13 cleaning pigs were run followed by 2 inspection PIG's over 11 days. All thankfully reappeared! (see pic right: a cleaning PIG on arrival at Brogsborough)

A special thank you to Paul Russell (CEMEX Pipeline and Project Engineer) for managing this activity and making sure it did not impact on the kiln operation at Rugby. (Pic above left is of the catcher at Brogborough.)

Data collected by the inspection tools is currently being analysed to determine the overall condition of this section of the line including corrosion locations and rates. This will enable potential problem areas and their location to be identified and repairs to be carried out in good time in order to maintain the integrity of the line and ultimately keep the slurry flowing safely to our biggest UK kiln in Rugby.





Thanks to the Teams for all the effort put into getting Stirling and Troon RMX Plants accredited to ISO 14001 this week. No non-conformances were found during the audits which is a great result. Thanks to Ken (Stirling) and Steve (Troon) who both helped get their respective Plants up to standard. Also thanks to Bryan Walkinshaw who rebuilt the water

recirculation system which has stopped our illegal discharge and cleared the build up of waste at Stirling.

The target is still to have all Plants in Scotland accredited by year end - the remaining Plants being Leith, Tinto, Cumbernauld and Polmadie.

Rugby Plant Accreditation Success



Rugby Plant recently had its annual accreditation audit for ISO 9001 and BS EN 197-2. Two external Auditors spent the day reviewing the quality systems and procedures, touring the Plant and talking to the operators as part of the audit process, and were very complementary about the standard of quality control as well as the knowledge and attitude of the Rugby Plant Team.

The audit was a success with the plant maintaining its accreditations with only 5 observations and one minor non-conformity recorded.

Congratulations to all involved in this achievement.

Another 100% Success for Kensworth Quarry!



Congratulations to the Kensworth Quarry Team whose recent FM Global Insurance visit to the Quarry and Chalk Processing Plant was a 100% success.

The Insurers awarded another perfect score to the site. Last year the site received their first 100% score with zero recommendations and this year they managed to maintain the same excellent mark. To put this achievement into context, the

Insurer commented that "Kensworth is the only site that he visits (across all clients) that has nil recommendations and a 100% score."

What led to these excellent scores? The Rugby Quarries Maintenance Coordinator, Mark Gough, and Quarry Manager, Martin Lithgo, work together to build a good Team ethos on the site, resulting in area ownership. Other factors include having a good maintenance regime in place which includes up to date NDT inspections, oil and vibration analysis, electrical inspections including HV switchgear testing and fixed wire testing along with thermal imaging surveys of running equipment and wiring.

The final elements which Mark commented helped tip the scales, was holding a good set of contingency plans for failures such as a main power loss.

Additionally, the Pipeline Engineer, Paul Russell, has implemented an excellent inspection regime and developed measures to increase the pipeline life span, including a UV treatment plant to treat the site



water which reduces pipeline eating bacteria. (Kensworth supplies Rugby Plant with chalk slurry for the cement production process which is pumped some 90 km along a high pressure pipeline!)

This fantastic achievement is a credit to all the members of the Kensworth Quarry Team.
