Loud And Proud....



Grey concrete needn't be boring or hidden away. Check out our handy work on this new feature wall in Basingstoke.

We have supplied 5,274 m3 to a project in Basingstoke for the John Lewis/Waitrose landmark store. In March this year we were asked by A D Bly for a mix solution for the construction of a retaining wall flanking the main road through the site. This was to have a high quality facing finish using a Reckli System mould textured form liners to provide the high quality patterned finish. The mix had to be of high workability to allow the mix to fill all the shapes of the moulded forms.

Martin Middleton, our Technical Manager, designed a mix. Trial panels were cast on site and after some fine tuning by Martin they were accepted by John Lewis.

The concrete had to be produced to a consistent appearance over a 2 month pouring programme. Sand had to be supplied from one source so our aggregate colleagues stock piled Bramshill Sand for use and the overall supply has been a credit to all involved. A total of 255m3 has been supplied at a healthy margin.

The wall is situated on the main bus route from the business area of Basingstoke to the railway station and main town centre shopping area - viewed by hundreds every day. The rest of the project looks great too.

Brighton Marina Rising Up At Last



After some major setbacks on site, we are now pouring Supaflo on Midguard's £285million redevelopment of Brighton Marina in Sussex.

We received an order for circa 900m3 Supaflo to start in February 2015, but due to serious flooding on site and other setbacks, we have only just begun pouring. We are now underway and pouring every

Demolition At South Ferriby

Christina Is Our First Woman Logistics Apprentice!



The second cohort on CEMEX's Logistics Apprenticeship scheme has started their one year course to become highly skilled large goods vehicle drivers. The 15 young people, all under 23 years old, include the first woman logistics apprentice, Christina Wilcox.

Following on from the first successful year it was decided to extend the apprenticeship from the Aggregate Logistics Team and include Cement Logistics, with apprentices based at 2 cement plants and 9 aggregate sites. Christina Wilcox, as well as being the first woman Logistics apprentice is also one of the first 6 cement apprentices.

"After leaving school I soon realised I wanted more from life than being officebased and I love a challenge. The CEMEX Logistics Apprentice scheme

attracted me because it is a challenge and a challenge working predominantly in a man's world. I am the fifth woman in the Logistics Team so there are not many us. Already the scheme has been enjoyable with every day bringing something new," comments Christina.

The need for the Apprentice Scheme highlights a recognised UK skill gap, that of an aging population of large goods vehicle (LGV) drivers. This is reflected within CEMEX Logistics with 10% of all company drivers over 60 and only 0.2% under 25.

The year-long programme is run in conjunction with training provider, Systems Training, and offers a training framework to achieve a Driving Goods Apprenticeship Level 2 and Category C licence. 70% of the programme is hands-on experience, 20% involves coaching and mentoring and 10% coursework and training so apprentices gain experience driving, develop skills to work with customers, learn about health and safety and are rewarded with a nationally recognized qualification.

Currently, CEMEX has over 400 aggregate and cement vehicles covering over 15 million miles a year.
