Roll Over Warning



Fortunately a Driver for one of our Independent Haulage Contractors avoided injury when the truck mixer he was driving overturned. Initial indications are that the nearside wheels of his vehicle went into a soft roadside verge as he passed an oncoming van, causing the truck mixer to roll over; the Driver was wearing his seat belt and there were no loose tools, etc. in the cab, thereby minimising the potential for injury. It is some time since our last truck mixer overturned; however, our competitors have reported suffering several such incidents recently, some of which

have led to serious injury. An investigation into this incident is underway to ensure we learn from it and any relevant points will be shared via a Safety Alert.

SAFETY ALERT - Motorway Hard Shoulder Safety



One of our competitors shared some sobering film footage via *safequarry.com* of a Driver narrowly escaping serious injury on a motorway hard shoulder when, following a tyre blowout, he got out of his vehicle on the wrong side adjacent to the live traffic.

It is well worth watching the attached footage which acts as a very effective reminder of the potential hazards and the need to follow relevant safety advice if you breakdown on a motorway. In addition to sharing the resulting Video Safety Alert with colleagues, you

may want to show it to family and friends. It highlights the need to always leave a vehicle from the nearside if you breakdown on a motorway, and also to allow as much room as possible where you see a stranded vehicle:



New Aggregate Weigh Hopper For Bristol



Bristol Concrete Plant has recently had a new aggregate weigh hopper fabricated and fit by Response Engineering. This meant that the Plant was on a week's downtime once they returned to work in 2016.

The work that was carried meant that one side of a building had to be taken down to get the weigh hopper in. A hazardous task that was constantly monitored by A.Hoskins/R.Priday, and was carried out with the minimal of fuss. The Health & Safety standards from Response were excellent.

While the Plant was not producing several other maintenance tasks were carried out, including the installation of a 'Stone Out' bay for the IHCs, which will drastically reduce wash waste costs (and keep the Plant tidier). The pan

mixer was also given a thorough clean/service, with 5 refurbished wash heads fit, which will help maintain the cleanliness of the mixer. This will also help with Customer Focus and the quality of our products.
