A ZERO Week But Be Vigilant



Whilst we maintained ZERO lost time injuries and recordable injuries last week, there were three incidents that could easily have resulted in significant injury. These included a buried electrical cable strike on one of our sites, a collision between a company van and a cyclist, and a trespasser who became stuck in mud during the very cold conditions and had to be rescued by the emergency services.

When considering these incidents, along with others we have already experienced this year, including a truckmixer roll over and a cut to the face when an angle grinder cutting disc failed, it highlights that just because we have started the year with ZERO 'recordable injuries' we cannot allow ourselves to become complacent for even a moment. It is important that we Step In if we see anything we believe may be unsafe... we may be preventing someone being seriously hurt, thereby looking out for them and their family.

Mersey Gateway Pour Success



Congratulations to everyone working on the new Mersey Gateway project. Work has started on the approach viaduct decks, with the first continuous 34 hour pour of 1,148m³ concrete using 12 trucks having just taken place.

An innovative moveable scaffold system (MSS) has been used by Merseylink to build the concrete approach viaduct decks and the CEMEX Team, in partnership with the contractors, is providing the technically demanding concrete and supply expertise.

The Mersey Gateway road bridge across the River Mersey will provide a new link between the towns of Runcorn and Widnes and shortened journey times for those travelling further into Liverpool and Merseyside.

Due to be opened to traffic in Autumn 2017 CEMEX UK is working with client, Merseylink Civil Contractors Joint Venture, to deliver the project which features a reinforced concrete decked three pylon cable-stayed bridge linked to approach viaducts on each side of the river.

The MSS is 157m long, 22m wide, weighs 1,700 tonnes and is a giant section of formwork enabling the project team to cast deck spans of up to 70m at every location. Once poured the MSS jacks itself forward to the next span.



Collaboration Is Key



Matt Saunders, RMX, Product Support Advisor, reported back on a delighted customer in the West Midlands.

"At Product Support a call was recently received from Higgins Bailers in the West Midlands looking for a solution to a tricky and technically challenging job to refurbish their workshop floor. A high performance concrete with good abrasion resistance was key.

Naturally, Microtech was discussed. We outlined to the customer the benefits of a product that comes with the added assurance of

being rough and tough enough to rise to the challenges of its environment, which in this case was to have 30+ tonne agricultural and industrial machinery literally dragged across it on a regular basis. The addition of fibres for long term durability was also discussed and agreed on.

The product was sold in by Area Sales Rep, Dave Taylor, batched by Peter Crosby at the Kidderminster Plant with assistance from Tom Jeffries and Ken Land. On the day the pour was overseen by ATM Gilbert Morgan and assisted by Technician Richard Brindle. Needless to say, the customer was delighted with the finished result.

A job such as this, which represents excellent value for both the customer and CEMEX, is a great way to showcase how effective collaboration, good product knowledge, intelligent communication and thorough analysis of the customer's requirements can be to provide a solution that is both Best for Customers and Best for Shareholders. A great win for everybody involved."

Brighton's First Time Evolution



"We supplied the first 7 cubic metres of a 250 cubic metre order of Evolution Flooring from Brighton Readymix to our customer GPB at their Isfield, Sussex site where a development of houses is being built," comments Stephen Thorpe, RMX Technical Manager. "The customer has previously used a competitor's SCC product and approached us for our similar concrete. They had also had a 'bad experience' at another site with another competitor's equivalent!

The load was batched and slump flow tested at Brighton before dispatch, and again tested on site which is about a 45 minute run from the Brighton Plant. The product on site was exactly as intended with a 750mm slump flow. It was placed into an oversight by two site personnel who were watched by six others, some of

whom would have been used to place, compact, and finish conventional concrete. The customer was extremely pleased with the concrete and is looking forward to the next supply!

My thanks to Ernie Coleman and Paul Marshall at Brighton Readymix for producing the concrete; to Technician, Darren Webb, for testing at the plant and on site and also thanks to Mario our IHC in his new truck which looked very smart!"
