A Very Difficult Week



Last week was a very difficult week; a truckmixer driver, working for one of our Independent Haulage Contractors, was involved in a fatal road traffic collision last Wednesday in which a 75 year old male pedestrian sadly died. The exact circumstances of the incident have not been confirmed and we are supporting the Police with their investigation. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of the deceased, and also the truckmixer driver at this tragic time.

In addition, another truckmixer driver suffered a serious injury on a customer's site. It seems that whilst walking on the site, as he went to turn around, the driver suffered a spiral fracture to his left femur (thigh bone). It is unclear whether the movement of his foot may have been restricted by some formwork or if there is another reason for the injury. We hope to learn more once we have had an opportunity to talk with the driver on his release from hospital.

We are carrying out investigations into both these incidents and will share any learning points once the full facts have been confirmed.

Jesus Gonzalez commented: "A very difficult week indeed with two serious incidents, one of them with fatal consequences. My thoughts and prayers are with the family and friends of the deceased. Let's all use these accidents as a reminder that Safety has no memory and that we must continue working very hard to keep our employees and contractors safe. I'm particularly concerned about our contractors safety performance this year with 3 LTIs year to date compared to ZERO last year. Please remind your Teams about how important is to look after our contractors and keep them as part of the Team with regards to Health and Safety."

Take Care In The Sun



With the nicer weather coming along take extra care not to get sunburnt. After our sun deprived winter we are prone to getting a little carried away when a bit of sun comes our way!

While sunburn is often short-lived and mild, it is important to try to avoid it because it can increase your chances of developing serious health problems such as skin cancer in later life. - On the next screen enter your employee number again when it asks for Username, and repeat the password you just created
- Then download the App from the store





Rail Solutions Get Curves In All The Right Places...



A little over 12 months ago CEMEX Rail Solutions were asked to attend a meeting with London Underground. This was to help them come up with a design of concrete bearer for curves of less than 200m radius. The particular issue with tight curves is that of wheel / rail alignment around the curve. The way to ensure that wheels remain on the track is by use of a check rail next to the running rail; this guides the wheel and keeps it on the rail.

London Underground had designs of 2 base plates, one for the check rail end and one for the running rail on the other end of the bearer but needed to mount it on a concrete bearer. This was not straight forward as there were 2 complications highlighted by a Finite Element Analysis carried out by Durham University.

- 1) The method of attaching the base plate to the bearer was via a cast in plastic dowell. This is a known crack inducer in pre-stressed concrete due to tensile forcesset up around the dowell.
- 2) The dowells on one end need to be in close proximity to mounting positions for 3rd and 4th conductor rail mounting positions. These conductor rails are bolted on again into a plastic insert (another crack inducer).

To overcome these issues we have adopted industry practice from Germany and placed a tight fitting helical reinforcement around the plastic dowells to contain cracks. The plastic inserts for conductor rail mounting have been replaced by metal inserts. A second finite element analysis by Durham University concluded that these changes had significantly reduced the risk of crack propogation within the unit. A further 2 variants of check rail bearer were designed (short ended at either end) at the same time to allow for drainage catch pits which are sometimes in the way trackside.

Thanks to the contribution of our Operations, Maintenance and Quality Departments the 3 variants went into full production of around 100 units per week at Somercotes in early April and our client is forecasting a demand of 2,500 units by Christmas of this year. This is especially good news for our business as it replaces volume lost by the phasing out of the old hedgehog sleepers used in deep tube between stations.

A further variant is now being looked at to incorporate standard pandrol fastclip fastenings and inclined concrete; this would be used where the client has noise and vibration issues where a soft undersleeper pad could be used.

Gilbert Morgan: An investigation into the continuing issue with pyrites contamination in the materials supplied to CEMEX Concrete Products at Northfleet.

James Tyghe: An evaluation on the use of 0/4 concreting sands at static Readymix Plants in the production of Roller Compacted Concrete (RCC) and the impact this has on delivery options.
