Creating a cleaner, healthier River Thames

Another Friday was spent last week in the National Technical Centre (NTC) laboratory at Southam showcasing one of our bespoke concrete designs for a high profile contract to a high profile customer - in this case two customers - Vinci and Bachy. The concrete is required to have a six hour consistence retention at an F5,

be placed by tremie with good rheological properties to limit static segregation. Customers were impressed with the concrete design and commented on the professionalism of the Team at NTC. Further lab trials are now required to complete the plastic properties tests as well as hardened tests for durability. Thanks to John Shrimpton and Sean ODonnell for carrying out the trial and to Paul Griffin for advice during the preliminary trial work.

Readybase Helps Give Clear Views From New Brighton Tower

The £46m project consists of a 162metre observation tower with a restaurant below. The paving is one of the final pieces of the puzzle as the attraction is due to open to the public on 4th August so we had to act fast and turnaround an order within 48 hours - thanks to Andrew Bright, Virginia Spencer and their Team for organising everthing so quickly. This might not be the biggest order ever but 32 tonnes at circa. £45.00/t margin and an opportunity to supply one of our perhaps lesser-known products to such a prestigious site is worth blogging!

Andy's War On Waste



Sustainability Director, Andy Spencer, was inspired by the BBC1 programme 'Hugh's War on Waste' which explained how paper cups used by coffee chains cannot be recycled due to the plastic lining contained within them and also how the cups are all made from primary material.

Andy said: "As many of you are aware we use this type of paper cup in some of our offices costing both money and environmental impact. They are at least 5p each to

buy and then we have to pay to dispose of them. Raw materials are used but they can't be recycled.

Amazingly we use around 50,000 of these cups a year in Rugby office alone! On the 7th Floor today in Rugby we've stopped using paper cups and moved to washable mugs, taking responsibility for washing up and keeping tidy. It would be great if we could roll this practice out - we have plenty of mugs available at Rugby and would be able to distribute them around offices as people travel so do let us know if you can make the change and we'll get some across to you. This will save the business money, help our EP&L and the environment. I'll be touring the Rugby office to rally support over the next few days! All we'd ask is that you take responsibility for washing up your own mug. We're very close to starting to implement some better office recycling initiatives on sites where we haven't had up to date facilities, and ditching our paper cups would be a great way of starting this initiative! 

UK HEALTH ALERT



BLOOD PRESSURE – KNOW YOUR NUMBERS



Blood pressure is a measure of the force that your heart uses to pump blood around your body.

How is blood pressure measured?

Two measurements are recorded:

- the pressure when your heart pumps blood through your arteries (systolic pressure): this is when the pressure is highest, and
- the pressure when your heart is resting before it pumps again (diastolic pressure), when the pressure is lowest.

Blood pressure is measured in millimetres of mercury (mmHg). Readings are given as two numbers or levels. The systolic reading is first, followed by the diastolic reading. For example, if your systolic reading is 120mmHg and your diastolic reading is 80mmHg, your blood pressure is 120 over 80, commonly written as 120/80.

Is my blood pressure high, normal or low?

Blood pressure can be high, normal or low.

If you consistently have a reading of 140/90 or higher, you may have high blood pressure (hypertension).

Generally, the lower your blood pressure, the healthier you are. As a guide, the ideal blood pressure for a young healthy adult is 120/80 or lower.

It is possible to have abnormally low blood pressure. People with a reading of around 90/60 or lower are generally considered to have low blood pressure; there may be an underlying cause that could need treatment.

Check your blood pressure – Know Your Numbers

High blood pressure is often referred to as a "silent killer" –the only way to know if you have it is to have your blood pressure checked. Health professionals such as nurses, pharmacists and GPs can check your blood pressure with a simple test.

High blood pressure increases your risk of having a heart attack or stroke, but there are things you can do to lower your blood pressure and reduce your risks.

- Take regular exercise
- Eat healthily
- · Maintain a healthy weight
- Limit alcohol intake
- Don't smoke

If you have been diagnosed with high blood pressure and prescribed medication, ensure you take it as instructed.

Do you know your numbers?

1 in 5 of our employees have high blood pressure.

High blood pressure usually has no signs or symptoms, so the only way to know if you have high blood pressure is to have yours measured.

Know your numbers,
