Stop And Think EVERY Time



Last week we let two people get hurt in our business. One suffered an electric shock and the other trapped a finger and had ten stitches.

In both cases if they had **STOPPED TO THINK** about the potential risks of their activities and followed these **SAFETY ESSENTIALS** it is likely that injury would have been avoided:

- ISOLATION PROCEDURES Never work on live or moving machinery always 'lock out'
- SAFE SYSTEMS Follow safe systems of work, site rules, signage and traffic signals
- PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT Always wear the correct PPE

And no one **STEPPED IN** to stop them.

Here are the key details of the incidents:

In the first incident an electrician suffered an electric shock whilst working on some laboratory equipment. The electrician had initially locked the equipment off at a local isolator before re-energising the circuits to test certain parts. Unfortunately, after taking a phone call from his office, it seems he forgot to isolate the circuits again before connecting a power cable to a control box and as a result he received a 415v electric shock through one of his fingers. Fortunately an employee who was nearby was able to stop the power supply.

In the second incident contractors arrived at one of our sites to remove some redundant sleepers in preparation for the installation of steelwork on a receiving hopper. They arrived on site before their CEMEX point of contact and, rather than waiting to receive their induction and Permit to Work, they started on site. Whilst two of the contractors were manually lifting the sleepers into a loading shovel bucket one of the contractors failed to let go of the end of a sleeper and trapped his left hand middle finger against the loading shovel bucket; he required ten stitches as a result. Effective planning and

co-ordination of the works, along with the use of suitable gloves for the task, would have minimised the risk of injury.

Nicola Steps In



With all the recent bad news of us hurting people, some good news where one of our employees stepped in to help a member of the public.

Whilst out walking in Buxton with her partner and children Nicola Drabble stepped in when she heard a gasp and a bang. She turned and saw a middle aged man on the floor fitting. Nicola immediately put her CEMEX first aid training in practice and went to the man's aid. She put the gentleman in the recovery position, spoke to him and

ascertained his problems. Another passer-by called an ambulance and her partner went to a local store and borrowed a first aid kit. She put her skills to use calming the gentleman and tending the injuries to his face caused by the fall.

Nicola tended the gentleman until the ambulance arrived 30 minutes later. A big thank you and well done to Nicola.

We took a good 30 minutes to walk the site, go through CEMEX's standard health & safety procedures and risk assess the day's work. We then got to business! The first row of fence went in at a slow pace as the posts were large and required a lot of labour. Apart from one tough section we were finished the first row by lunch.

The job was complete by 3.30pm and the horses were back in the paddock moments after the last tool was taken back to the van. Sandra Haddon (owner) was over the moon at a job well done.

State Of Nature 2016, The RSPB Publishes Its Report



The RSPB recently published an updated State of Nature report which measures changes to ecosystems from a report originally published in 2013. It's a collaborative report with contributions from several wildlife groups, input from universities, academics and a forward from Sir David Attenborough.

The report aims to highlight issues and report progress on different types of ecosystem across the UK. The report states loss of priority habitat as the major issue affecting many species which are under threat or facing possible extinction from the UK.

It's encouraging that the report highlights the importance of old mineral workings in helping to restore habitats and help nature. In particular,





restoring sites which include freshwater lakes and ponds. It also shows the importance of continuing to work with the RSPB in helping create more priority habitats on working and restored sites.

Sean Cassidy, Regional Environmental Manager, has highlighted some examples of good restoration/habitat management with these great photos. The top photo is of the woodland flowers at Newbridge Quarry in Pickering and the other is of Coweslinn Burn (protected SAC and SSSI in the Scottish Boarders.) Here is the link to the report:
