Driving In Fog....



Following on from last week's article on Winter Driving this time of year is a good reminder about driving in fog.

On 4 November 2011 a multiple-vehicle collision occurred on the M5 motorway near Taunton, Somerset, in South West England.

The crash involved dozens of cars and articulated lorries, and a large fireball ensued.

Seven people were killed and 51 others were injured. At the coroner's hearing the coroner concluded that the accident was caused by dense fog, although smoke from fireworks may have been a contributory factor, but fog was the prime cause of the incident. So here are just a few hints and tips from the Highway Code:

Before entering fog check your mirrors then slow down. If the word 'Fog' is shown on a roadside signal but the road is clear, be prepared for a bank of fog or drifting patchy fog ahead. Even if it seems to be clearing, you can suddenly find yourself in thick fog.

When **driving in fog** you should:

- use your lights when visibility is seriously reduced, generally when you cannot see for more than 100 metres (328 feet). You may also use front or rear fog lights but you MUST switch them off when visibility improves. If your lights are set to come on automatically, check they work in reduced vision such as fog
- keep a safe distance behind the vehicle in front. Rear lights can give a false sense of security
- be able to pull up well within the distance you can see clearly. This is particularly important on motorways and dual carriageways, as vehicles are travelling faster
- use your windscreen wipers and demisters
- beware of other drivers not using headlights with newer cars having auto headlights, these don't always activate in fog
- not accelerate to get away from a vehicle which is too close behind you



- check your mirrors before you slow down. Then use your brakes so that your brake lights warn drivers behind you that you are slowing down
- stop in the correct position at a junction with limited visibility and listen for traffic opening the windows and switching off the radio is good practice to make sure you can at last hear other vehicles if you cannot see them. When you are sure it is safe to emerge, do so positively and do not hesitate in a position that puts you directly in the path of approaching vehicles.
- You MUST NOT use front or rear fog lights unless visibility is seriously reduced as they dazzle
 other road users and can obscure your brake lights. You MUST switch them off when visibility
 improves.

Simple Solution Could Help Prevent Scary Incidents For Cyclists



The Near Miss project was carried out in 2014/15 by Dr Rachel Aldred from the University of Westminster to look at near miss incidents amongst cyclists. Her research highlighted, amongst other findings, that the scariest incident is 'near dooring' when a driver opens their vehicle's door without looking around them with the potential of knocking passing cyclists off their bikes.

One possible solution could be found in Holland where the Dutch open their car doors with the hand furthest away from the door. Try it.... you'll find that by using your

left hand (assuming right hand drive); you have to twist your body and turn your head so you are now looking alongside your vehicle. Hopefully you would see a passing cyclist before you've opened the door.


Cementitious Demonstration For Fox Contracting

1st Station For Crossrail 2 Is Almost Complete



With the first station at Liverpool Street, London in the major infrastructure project Crossrail 2 almost complete, it was time for Kevin D'Souza, Technical Manager and Nigel Bateman, Operation Manager, to look at the tunnel and station.

We provided the concrete for the tunnel, track and platform of the station which is 290metres long. It was certainly a challenging contract, both logistically and technically, with the site situated right in the heart of the City and involving the concrete being pumped vertically the height of a 10 storey building and crucially, there had to be no gaps in supply!

The work is being undertaken by Laing O'Rourke and both parties agree that is a job well done, many congratulations to everyone involved.

CEMEX has been supplying materials to Crossrail since the start of the project with three Plants involved - Stepney, Angerstein and Canning Town. 30 trucks are based at these Plants with additional day trucks involved when needed.



Crossrail 2 will be a new railway connecting National Rail networks in Surrey and Hertfordshire with new tunnels and stations between Wimbledon, Tottenham Hale and New Southgate so south to north. For more information see www.crossrail2.co.uk

Crossrail 1 includes 42km of tunnels from Reading and Heathrow in the west to Shenfield and Abbey Wood in the east. It's now 75% complete and involves 10 new stations and upgrade of 30 more at a cost of £14.8bn, Europe's large infrastructure project.

The new railway is to be known as Elizabeth line with services planned to begin in 2018.

Be Aware Of Fake IT Support Scam



Operation Mode

Criminals call their targets posing as IT Tech Support Staff. They mention that there is a potential risk on the user's computer and that it requires a special diagnostic. If the victim follows the instructions a program will be installed and the attacker will take remote control of the computer. Having access to the computer, the criminal will damage the computer and warning windows will appear on the user's screen. The attacker will then offer the victim a solution that costs at least 300 euros.

Recommendations

If you receive phone calls from a Tech Support Staff requesting unusual things:

- Ask the caller his name, phone number, company and additional information and write it down.
- Say that you will contact him later; meanwhile, consult your help centre or IT Department.
