Thankfully the people involved did not sustain any major injuries; however, the potential for severe injuries was great. This is why root cause analysis and sharing learning outcomes is essential to help prevent any future accidents from occurring not just locally but across the UK business.

We need to continue our back to basics approach to Health & Safety: following the Safety Essentials, Stop and Think, using our Near Miss Hazard Alert system and Stepping-in in challenging unsafe behaviours and practices.

Once again, I would like to thank you for your efforts and please continue to be vigilant putting Health & Safety first, demonstrating your leadership and commitment."

Moriarty Haulage – IHC Receives GOLD FORS Accreditation



This week one of our IHC companies in London, Moriarty Haulage, received the Gold FORS Award. This is an amazing achievement by the company and they are the first of our IHC companies to get it.

Denis, John and the team at Moriarty are all totally committed to making their fleet the safest it can be with practices such as installing recording cameras allowing analysis of a complaint or traffic incident. Telematics have also been introduced identifying exemplary drivers, monitoring fuel use and allowing legal compliance to be maintained in line with tachograph laws.

The company feels it has really benefitted from the training provided by FORS. As a result the transport management team feels confident in speaking to drivers about what is expected of them in their day-to-day duties, while also emphasising the importance of considering vulnerable road users. Drivers are a valued part of the company, the company says, and are encouraged to report anything they feel is unsafe.

John Moriarty, Transport Manager, commented: "Becoming a FORS Gold member has meant we are now recognised as a reputable haulier. Moving forward I would like to see the business improve on its current performance while still maintaining high levels of health & safety and customer satisfaction.

It is interesting to receive feedback as a valued part of the company. Drivers freely report to the office any sites they feel are unsafe, allowing us to take action."

IHC Ryan Steps In...



Last week one of our IHC's, Ryan Gorman, brought a safety alert to our attention – he was concerned about potential hazards on a customer site. The site is for a new Biomass Plant and will require over 10km3 of concrete throughout 2017.

When driving on site Ryan's main concerns were regarding punctures. The site had loose pieces of rebar scattered around it following the demolition of an existing structure. In one instance the driver was unable to pull forward to the pump as there was a large piece of metal sticking up from the ground.

The driver explained to the operative how this could cause a blow-out whilst driving which is extremely dangerous - this was also a potential trip hazard too. As a result of this conversation with Ryan, Courtney Banham, CEMEX Sales Rep, immediately arranged to meet the Site Foreman to discuss the issue and see it for himself. Ryan, Courtney and the Foreman conducted a walk around the site and picked up on many points which concerned them all. A number of potential hazards were highlighted and the Foreman was appreciative and commented that it's good to have a 'fresh pair of eyes on the site'.

As a result of our "stepping in", the large pieces of rebar are currently being dug out and disposed. Today we are conducting a 200m3 pour and the drivers have been directed on an alternative route using a new road which has been designed specifically to avoid the hazardous area.

Jamie A Gentleman Of The Road...

I had no idea this was the case and was so thankful he did this for me. It was safe as there was no traffic moving around us, but I was really touched that he got out and helped me. Had I have continued driving my bonnet could have flown up! I'd really appreciate it if you could pass on my thanks again.

Save Energy...



As winter and the dark days are upon us please remember to do all you can to save electricity where you work. As you will all know from your household bills the price of electricity isn't going down, this is the same for our industry. Over the last 3 years our electricity costs have risen by 43%. UK electricity costs are the highest of all developed countries and second overall!!

Our business is an energy gobbling one... and we all need to do our little bit to save energy.

Think about switching off lights, only boiling the kettle once with the right amount of water in, switching off your computers at the end of the day and making sure heaters are turned off in offices/messrooms, and don't leave machinery running unnecessarily.

Every little bit helps. With the likes of Tilbury Grinding Plant leading the way – now producing more tones per hour with less electricity (May 2009 they produced 82 tonnes per hour with a KWh/t of 39.9, this June they produced 114 tph with a kWh/t of only 29.5) – we can all help to reduce our energy costs.

CEMEX announced today that CEMEX and CEMEX Concretos, S.A. de C.V. have entered into a definitive agreement to divest CEMEX Concretos' ready-mix concrete pumping assets in Mexico to Pumping Team S.L.L. for approximately U.S.\$80 million plus an additional U.S.\$29 million purchase price contingent on future performance targets.

The assets being divested consist mainly of CEMEX Concretos' 507 ready-mix concrete pumping units and other related assets.
