Drugs And Alcohol Policy Review



After a review of the UK Drugs and Alcohol Policy it has been decided to introduce a lower permissible Alcohol limit in relation to all UK Operations. The new limit of 22 micrograms of Alcohol per 100 millilitres of breath is in line with most European countries and is the limit introduced in Scotland in 2014.

The reason for the change is to bring the limit in line with other similar industries and to have a consistent level across all of our UK Operations. Higher risk industries such as Rail and Maritime already have lower limits and as CEMEX Operations increasingly involve interaction with these industries it

is right that we have a consistent approach. The new policy will be available on the ETHOS Shift pages and a copy can be obtained from the HR or Health & Safety Departments.

As a guide to what this new limit means, it is reasonable to say that no Alcohol should be consumed less than 8 hours before to a shift (this is similar to what airlines stipulate for crew!).

Health Surveillance Changes



As part of our commitment to health we are introducing some changes to the health surveillance programme in 2017. From next year everyone attending health surveillance will receive a personal health report which will be posted to them after their appointment. The report will give them a summary of their test results, what the findings mean and advice on what to do if further action is necessary.

We hope this will be informative and help in a better consideration of health whilst working and making healthier lifestyle choices where desirable. In addition, an optional Blood Test will be offered which will test for a range of conditions and provide an indicator of general health. The Blood Test will only be available on request at the time of organising the health surveillance and



has to be booked with RPS as part of the normal health surveillance appointment; the need for advance warning is the additional time and equipment needed to carry out the test.

Coordinators of health surveillance will need to ask all personnel due to attend health checks if they require this additional check and advise RPS accordingly. As always, any information from health tests are strictly confidential between the individual and RPS, CEMEX has no access to any medical information on individuals.



RSPB #DefendNature - Thank You CEMEX



Behind the scenes the RSPB, among other nature conservation organisations, work to preserve nature across Europe. They fight for the preservation laws that protect wildlife, and are enshrined in the EU Nature Directives.

These directives outline common laws for wildlife, habitats and the special places for nature on a continental scale. This week, after

two years of hard work and dedicated campaigning to prevent the world's strongest wildlife laws from being opened up and weakened, the RSPB heard that the EU Nature Directives are safe.

Without the directives there would be no protection for wildlife across the European continent – which have been instrumental in setting up protection for such migratory species as the Turtle Dove. Nature does not recognise national boundaries!

Mike Clarke, Chief Executive of the RSPB, commented: "We've stood against an enormous political threat to the very foundations of protection for our wildlife and we've won. No campaign can do more. There has also been fantastic leadership from progressive business voices, such as CEMEX, and from politicians - including European Parliamentarians and national Environment Ministers... from my heart I thank you all."



It's A Wrap....



During the week Cluster 14 took part in a Lend-A-Hand supporting OPEN Youth Trust based in Norwich. Three members of the Cluster 14 Team, along with Nicola Hannant, Credit Manager, attended the day which entailed wrapping Xmas gifts for the general public with donations going to the charity.

Peter won it for installing ten empty IBCs (intermediate bulk container) to harvest surface ground water to reuse when recirc water is running low. Whenever it rains the containers are replenished and they have a total of 10,000 litres of extra water. They have installed the



system in both Pershore and Oakengates with Redditch to follow.

Andy Spencer, UK Sustainability Director, commented: "The quality and volume of entries was fantastic, with brilliant and simple improvements being made throughout our business to improve our Environmental Profit and Loss, and to help our business overall being Best for Communities. Some examples were:

- Laboratory aggregate drying ovens connected to timer switches turning off ovens out of working hours.
- Designing and installing a new and comprehensive dust suppression system.
- Replenishing the beach at Bournemouth.





- A new fuel monitoring system has been installed onto the Sand Falcon dredger.
- And many more!

Let Them Eat Cake.... Bird Cake.....



This year has been unusually mild so far resulting in plenty of natural food for birds but once this starts to run out you'll see more birds arriving at your feeders.

A bird's body clock works on daylight hours so in the winter months there are great opportunities to view the birds feeding at first light which can become a bit of a feeding frenzy. If you watch your garden birds regularly you'll notice that they'll come down to

feed again in the late afternoon before they go and find somewhere to roost overnight.

It's hard to believe but during cold weather birds can lose up to 40 per cent of their weight overnight just trying to keep warm.

Food that's high in energy is fantastic for birds in the winter month - peanuts, fat or suet based foods, seed mixes that contain Sunflower seeds or hearts, Mealworms and fruit will all go down well. You can also make your own fat balls and cake mix using lard and suet – a great rainy day activity with the kids or grandkids!

Place lard and suet at room temperature in a mixing bowl, add in uncooked porridge oats, mild grated cheese, peanuts, sultanas, raisins and bird seed. Mix it all together and roll into balls or use shallow dishes to create bird cake. Put them in the fridge to set and when they are solid place them outside. However, remember not to feed turkey fat to feed your birds as it's too soft and can get into their feathers which can cause problems.
