## **CEMEX Rail Solutions Collaboration Wins Award**



London Underground recently won the award for Track Technology at the UK Rail Industry Awards for their concrete check rail bearer which was developed jointly with CEMEX Rail Solutions.

The bearers are for use on tight radius curves where the addition of a check rail enables trains to stay on the track.

In the past the solution has been to use timber bearers. Life expectancy is poor and London Underground has been keen to move away from non-sustainable sources for some time. They anticipate the switch from timber to concrete will increase life of the bearer from 15 to 40 years.

Stephen Barber (Head of Track for London Underground) said, in his acceptance of the Award, that the development of this product would not have been possible without the support of their suppliers.

Cluster 3 Team recently completed the second of 3 x 500mtr steel fibre pours to C Spencer at Tyne Dock Biomass silos.

Each pour required a full Team effort to facilitate the manual handling of steel fibres.



They completed a pre-pour planning meeting with Sales, Operations and Safety Department. They reviewed manual handling techniques for the safe loading of the fibres by way of two mobile conveyors based at South Shields Plant where the fibres were added along with super plasticizer.

Concrete was batched from three supplying Plants: Sunderland, Newcastle and South Shields. To load fibres they used 15 mixer trucks over a 15 hour period, 3 Batchers, 3 Shovel Drivers, Team Leaders and Technicians.

The site Management contacted the SPCA who came to the site and collected the bird. It was found to be suffering from exhaustion and is now recovering at

a wildlife sanctuary, and will live to dive another day!
