Contractor Fatality



We have not added any Lost Time Injuries (LTIs) or Recordable Injuries (TRIs) this week however, tragically a driver working for one of our contract hauliers in Stirlingshire died in a road traffic incident last Thursday morning whilst delivering materials on our behalf. The driver was only 42 years old and our thoughts are with his family, friends and colleagues at such a difficult time.

A message from Jesus: "It was a very sad week ... our thoughts and prayers are with the contractor driver and his family and friends. The circumstances of the accident are

still unclear. We will share the learning points once we finish with the investigation. In the meantime let's remind ourselves about the risks associated with road safety. It is important that we follow the driving essentials 24/7.

Meanwhile congratulations to Aggregates North West area for their LTI free achievement. Let's build on this good news to achieve ZERO this coming week."

Hi, my name is Thomas Christopher Lutitt and I work at Angerstein Wharf in Greenwich. I'm an Operative on days and I'm composing this email to personally thank you and CEMEX for introducing a health monitor system. I never realised how high my blood pressure was (195/90). I was close to having a stroke or even a heart attack until after using a blood pressure monitor that was implemented by the company. Only after being alerted to my condition was I able to get the help I needed from my doctor and the hospital.

I've been given blood pressure tablets and I am now on the road to a full recovery. I'm only 30 with a young family and it is a huge weight off of my mind. Thanks again for the full support of the new procedures in keeping everyone CEMEX safe. Yours thankfully, Thomas Lutitt.

It's All About Flooding



Last week CEMEX had a stand at the Flood & Coast 2017 Exhibition, where we show cased our flood defence products, specifically ReadyAquawall, our rapid assembly flood defence wall structure and Permaflow, our permeable concrete technology. The exhibition, which was led by the Environment Agency, was held at Telford's International Centre and had over 1,500 visitors over the course of the three days (the picture shows the CEMEX Team ready for the opening).

The aim of the exhibition was to pull together key stakeholders from

the Flood and Coastal Erosion Risk Management (FCRM) community, including local authorities, infrastructure owners, consultancies, contractors, businesses, community groups and universities.

"The exhibition is a specialist exhibition and was very busy, with our Technical and Commercial Team talking to over 150 visitors, resulting in 21 promising leads. Examples include the opportunity to price for 200m of ReadyAquawall for a National Grid Substation and information on Permaflow for a contract in Bridgeport West Bay in Dorset," comments Head of Marketing, James Fairclough.

A Busy Time In Hull




The last two weeks in Hull have seen some fantastic branded products being produced for the first time in Cluster 7. With Clusters 7's first production of PoroFoam for Cairn Cross Civils who needed a specific strength to fill a 18th Century basement in the heart of the city, and with the UK's first shipment of CEMEX Advanced Design 45SF 40 for Manor Crest Developments to the new Hilton Hotel in Hull.

The CEMEX Advanced Design mix was created in partnership with ProPex and a full fiber solution was created in order to remove the need for any steel mesh in the hotel floor. The mix was created to include 45kgm3 of Steel Fibers, to be pumped, and to then be powerfloated.

Through the sale of the Advanced Design mix we have also cross sold into the Advanced Decking range with 265m3 of Advanced Decking to go into the hotel as well as working alongside ProPex to create a mix suitable for the Hotel floor in order to rectify a design fault in a slab is only 200mm deep and not 250mm. Through the partnership this has led to CEMEX becoming the national provider of concrete to Manor Crest and for our Advanced range to be the standard products used in the design of the future hotels.

Celebration Of 15 Years For CEMEX El Carmen



CEMEX is celebrating 15 years of continued scientific research, habitat preservation, and species restoration for its El Carmen Conservation Program. With over 140,000 hectares, this cross-border private conservation region between Mexico and the United States is one of the most biodiversity rich areas in North America and one of the five great wilderness ecosystems in the world.



Located in northern Coahuila, Mexico, and southern Texas, United States, El Carmen represents an extensive key biological corridor for wildlife migration and distribution. This territory is home to more than 1,500 plant species, 289 avian species, 80 types of reptiles and amphibians, and 78 mammal species. Among the highlights of its protection efforts is the reintroduction of extinct species in the region, such as the bighorn and pronghorn sheep, which currently number approximately 400 specimens. Other species with considerably increased populations include the desert mule deer, the white-tailed deer, and the black bear, which is the largest population of this species of bear in Mexico.
