It was a very sad week for all our operations following the death of Jimmy Brownlie at West Calder Block Plant a week last Saturday. Jimmy's death is a stark reminder of how quickly things can go wrong, with devastating consequences, and the importance of always following the basics:

THE 12 SAFETY ESSENTIALS – look after yourself and each other

STOP & THINK – before starting any task **ALWAYS STEP IN** – if you see unsafe behaviour

I would encourage anyone who has not yet seen the video about the incident, and the effect on our people, to take the time to watch it, before discussing what more we can do to keep everyone safe with our teams.

It is vitally important at a time like this that we ensure we support Jimmy's family and close colleagues.

Thanks go to the team who have been doing all they can to help with this.

We are carrying out a full investigation into the incident and supporting the authorities with their enquiries. We have already taken steps to share preliminary findings with Managers, not only in the UK Operations but also across CEMEX globally and the wider UK industry via the Minerals Products Association. It is essential that we review these initial findings and any subsequent learning points fully on every site to ensure we prevent any further tragic incidents.



How Are We Doing With Our Steps?

Look After Your Health



We are now into Week 4 of the Pedometer Challenge and those steps are really adding up - let's keep the momentum going!

With that in mind, let's think about one of our Health Essentials – Stay Active, Hydrated and Eat Well. If you are looking after yourself and keeping fit and healthy you give yourself the best chance of being alert and aware of potential hazards at work and home.

The World Health Organisation recommends we do 30 minutes of moderate exercise at least five days a week.

Drink Plenty of Water



It is vital that we stay hydrated and drink plenty of water. Your body needs water for a wide variety of reasons including transportation of nutrients around the body and for waste products carried out of the body in the form of urine. It also allows organs to function, regulates body temperature, aids digestion and helps our muscles to contract and relax. Being well hydrated will help concentration levels, performance and general wellbeing.

Because your body loses water through breathing, sweating, and digestion it's important to rehydrate by drinking fluids and eating foods that contain water.

How to Improve Hydration

Our bodies can't store extra water so try to drink regularly throughout the day to stay hydrated.

- Give your digestive system a boost in the morning with a cup of hot water and a squeeze of lemon.
- Create a daily routine i.e. drink a glass after breakfast, one before lunch etc.
- Drink water instead of caffeine and alcohol.
- Have water constantly available throughout the day. Keep a water bottle on your desk to top up your glass and carry a bottle of water with you.
- If you are cold, drink warm water or herbal teas instead of coffee or tea which can dehydrate you.
- Eat plenty of fruit and veg as they have high water content and contribute to your daily intake.
- Keep a daily record of how many glasses of water you drink per day. Try to reach 8 glasses.

Quick Thinking Rory Prevents Pile Up

Huge thanks to Driver, Rory Clark, whose quick reactions prevented what could have been a mass pile up on the M25 last week.

Rory is an Agency Driver working out of Tilbury Docks on the bulk cement tanker fleet. He had completed his first delivery of the day and was heading back along the M25 to reload at Tilbury when he noticed the lorry in front of him starting to weave across the lanes and hitting the barrier on the hard shoulder; rebounding him back into the live traffic lanes before finally coming to a stop in the

Rory immediately turned on his hazard lights and pulled on to the hard shoulder. Getting out of his vehicle he signalled for the traffic behind to stop. He then gained access to the driver's cab where he discovered the driver had passed out at the wheel and a very shook-up drivers mate was sat in the passenger seat.

Rory asked the passenger to put the vehicle's hazard lights on to warn the vehicle behind of the problem. By the time he got to the driver he had regained consciousness and began to get out of the cab. He helped the driver and, once again stopped the traffic which was still moving around the stranded vehicle. He helped the driver to the hard shoulder where he could rest safely. Rory then went back to the lorry and drove it to the hard shoulder making the vehicle safe. He waited with the driver until an ambulance arrived and took him to hospital.

CEMEX received a letter of thanks from the driver's CEO commenting on the commendable actions of Rory: "Who, through smart and excellent reactive driving, averted a major road incident on the M25. I am told that Mr. Clark, having quickly foreseen that our tanker was going out of control and was going to run across the motorway, immediately used his own vehicle to slow down and block vehicles passing his, preventing them coming into contact with our roaming vehicle that would unquestionably have resulted in serious injury and more probably fatalities. I gather Mr. Clark then also quickly attended my injured staff and made the vehicle safe from other road movement once it ran off the road.

I would be very grateful if you can pass on my personal thanks to Mr. Clark for his actions and the thanks too of my driver team who I am pleased to report are recovering well albeit with fractured limbs. Clearly you have a very competent and decent man on board."

Important Cyber Security Warning



Due to a massive Malware infection (WannaCry's ransomware) initiated recently and affecting different companies around the world, CEMEX has reinforced software update distribution and a mandatory patching application released by Microsoft, in addition to enabling specific protection and monitoring mechanisms against this threat. The Malware takes advantage of a Microsoft vulnerability, encrypts information on computers, and asks for payment in exchange for decryption, and additionally uses the network to infect other computers.

The most effective protection mechanism is the prevention from each of you as computer end users.



We ask you to please follow the recommendations:

- If your computer shows a message related to a reboot, this is part of the updates. SAVE your documents, REBOOT, and continue working normally.
- DO NOT OPEN ATTACHMENTS, if you receive unsolicited e-mails containing unusual files, or from an unknown sender.
- DO NOT BROWSE OR DOWNLOAD FILES from websites or links you do not trust.
- Share the recommendations with external employees or contractors with access to CEMEX network and systems if you have direct contact with them.

In case you detect a suspicious behaviour or Malware in your computer, IMMEDIATELY turn off the network connection (WiFi and cable) and call the Help Desk to inform the Information Security Team or, using another device, send an email to: <u>incident.management@cemex.com</u> and <u>ism@cemex.com</u>

Sheffield's Biggest Train Delivery So Far.....



2017 has seen a big upturn in the consistency of supply from box wagons into Sheffield depot.

They were running with an average of 18 wagons in midweek and 11 on a Saturday, giving a weekly delivery total of 4,225 tonnes that often required additional road support to ensure they had sufficient volume to supply the local Readymix Plants and the external market.

Due to work from Nicola Drabble, Nick Watson and Adam Rickett (DB Cargo), they now have 24 brand new high capacity MMA

wagons each carrying 75 tonnes payload per wagon. That is a whopping increase, per train load, of 1,850 tonnes per delivery - the equivalent to 64 articulated lorry movements. That now means they can get over 7,400 tonnes in a week, by rail, over the four paths available.

Come on Sales Teams - get those orders in and let's get batching!!!!

Craig Hooper and the team at Halkyn are testing a Volvo A60H Articulated Hauler following the loss of a substantial part of the stockyard at the top of the Quarry.

Stone will need to be transported to a lower level within the site on occasions at up to 400 tonnes per hour. The Volvo A60H, with its rated payload of 55 tonnes, is being tested against this criteria as well as being able to transport as blasted material from the face to the primary crusher.
