Report a near miss



Last week we had a TRI when a Bulk Loader Driver fell as he was pulling on a silo product valve. He stumbled and fell backwards breaking a bone in his hand as he put his arm down to cushion his fall. Apparently there was a known issue with the valve being stiffer than others in the same area, but this had not been reported via a Near Miss Hazard alert card.

Please remember to use a Near Miss Hazard Alert Card every time you think something is unsafe – however trivial you think it might be. It could mean the difference between someone getting hurt or not.

It is up to us all to look out for anything that might be a potential danger at work - Look after yourselves and each other.

Run, Hide, Tell.....

From here to Monte Carlo



The Supply Chain Team decided to enter a team in the pedometer challenge again this year. Given the fact that they are largely office



based, it was a good opportunity to show that exercise can be done with just a few tweaks to how you plan your day.

Nicholas Watson explains what they did: "Before we started, I was asked to set a geographical challenge based on 10,000 steps a day and a team of 8 people (this included a friend of one of our colleagues and a 7

year old who wanted to take part). Giving some leeway for the youngest member of our team it was decided we should try and walk the combined distance from Dove Holes to Monte Carlo, which is just under 1,050 miles, with the aim of hopefully being there in time for a glass of something cold and a good seat for the Grand Prix (Stock photo I'm afraid)

Unfortunately, since the target was set, we had an injury to a member of the group, who still persevered and completed over 200,000 steps, and, as a group, we pulled together and completed our initial challenge with a week to go (Early Delivery). We didn't stop there and carried on walking the equivalent of another 341 miles (or 164 laps of the circuit).

In the month we achieved the following: -

- A bike ride by one person which raised £770 for Yorkshire Air Ambulance
- One member of the team walked at least 10,000 steps every day with no additional steps claimed (this included 30,000 steps on one day)
- One person made sure they kept going even on a well earned holiday no let up allowed
- Our 7 yr old completed over 400,000 steps, which is an incredible effort, not only the number, but the commitment for 4 weeks. Nice to see the right messages getting across early in life that will hopefully shape a great health future

All in all a great challenge for Colleagues, Friends and Family and some targets met for a much healthier lifestyle and future. Two of us plan to continue to challenge each other with targets to make sure it isn't a one month effort."

Dave goes the Extra 14.7 miles!



Also during the Pedometer Challenge month Dave Dench, Logistics ALM and part of the Southern Logistics Aggregates team, set himself a personal target of running into work.

However, Dave lives 14.7 miles from Datchet! He left it until the last working day of the challenge, but he completed the run in a commendable 2hrs 16 mins and accumulated 23k steps before breakfast.

Special thanks should go to Cluster 16 Technical Manager Gilbery Morgan for his assistance both on and off site, as well as Relief Plant Supervisor M Winnard for whom nothing was too much trouble (including numerous trips to and from the fibre shed).

And to top it all off, we sold an additional 6 x tubs of curing agent and a sprayer for the Evolution."

Changing to adapt to our customers



The team in the Asphalt planning office demonstrated how being flexible to the customer needs have paid off in Asphalt.

Phil Guest, Supply Chain Manager explains: "In the Preston Brook Planning Office, we've always tried to work on the basis that every Planner should be able to deal with every customer enquiry or order -

essential to deal with the volume of calls we receive. However, one particular Asphalt customer, Resurf, has proved difficult to please due to the number of jobs they have on at any one time, and the number of amendments that the customer makes to each job both before and during delivery.

These multiple amendments were leading to mistakes, which can be very costly on Asphalt, so we're trialling having one Planner who manages all their orders and amendments, thus keeping a much better track of the jobs. Melissa Whitby, the Planner concerned, has so far made a big difference in the way this customer is managed. And it's not just us who think this, it's the customer too. Their Order Co-ordinator (and daughter of their MD) Jodie Curphey says:

"There has definitely been a noticeable difference since working alongside Mel. Everything is running a lot smoother. We have both agreed it causes a lot less headaches for both CEMEX and ReSurf dealing with Mel only.

I personally think it makes sense having one point of contact. It saves so much time and confusion when placing orders or making amendments - the process just seems a whole lot easier.

Thank you Mel".

Whilst we'll never have the resources to handle every customer this way, we're looking to see if we could extend this to other key customers with some of the other Planners.

If we get the loyalty benefits shown above, it should be BEST for Customers and Shareholders too.
