Take Extra Care Over The Summer.....



With the summer holiday season upon us it is vital that we take extra care:

 During school holidays there is a greater risk of trespass - ensure site boundary protection, including fencing, bunding

and signage, is in good order. Rescue equipment must be readily available at water hazards and access should be restricted to plant and equipment, with signage identifying any remaining danger areas. It is important that inspection schemes include regular checks on fencing, signage, rescue equipment, etc.

- We generally see an increase in injuries over the summer months... whether this is a result of increased production, fewer people due to holidays, people doing unfamiliar tasks, etc., it is essential that we **STOP**, **THINK & CHECK** before starting any new activities.
- Sickness absence generally peaks over the summer months Managers and Supervisors should monitor and manage absence closely to ensure the impact in the workplace is minimised.

Remember this week is Slips, Trip and Falls Awareness Week. With slips, trips and falls accounting for approximately half of our more serious injuries, we are promoting a Slips, Tips and Falls Awareness Week.

Manchester Metrolink Win...



Transport for Greater Manchester has formally signed the contract for £350m next phase of the Metrolink expansion with Laing O'Rourke, VolkerRail and Thales UK. CEMEX UK is set to supply 45,000m3 of concrete to the contract over the next 36 months.

The new 3.4 mile Trafford Park line, which will increase the size of the Metrolink network to more than 64 miles served by 99 stops, will branch off from the existing Pomona stop and call at six new tram stops.

These include stations at Wharfside, near to Old Trafford Football Stadium, the Imperial War Museum, key business areas through Europe's largest industrial estate, and to visitor destinations such as Event City and the intu Trafford Centre.

Work on the new Metrolink line is due to be completed by the end of 2020.

ONE CEMEX Pulls In The Projects....



CEMEX Paving Solutions Northern has secured two large schemes in the space of a week totaling over 42,000t of Asphalt, with thanks to many parts of the business acting as ONE CEMEX.

The first scheme won is Peppermint Junction in Lincolnshire for Eurovia Contracting (approx. 12,500T). Work is to commence next

week for two months. During the initial tender stage and later on during contract negotiations we collaborated with John Godley from CEMEX Materials in Lincoln, and after some lengthy discussions with Eurovia, we finally managed to secure the job. Eurovia are working for Lincolnshire County Council who recommended they use CEMEX for the surfacing and also commented on the quality of the HRA supplied by Lincoln Coating Plant.

The second scheme won is A63 Selby Bypass Reconstruction Phase 3 (approx 30,000t). Work is to begin in August for three months. This scheme was awarded through the North Yorkshire County Council Framework where Jenna Louise Swain did the initial hard work completing the quality/submission information 18 months ago. During the tender stage members of the Paving Solutions team including David Duszczak, Thomas Dav Mason and Matthew Crowder, collaborated with Trevor Golding from Asphalt, Graham John Wilson, Marie Tiernan and Miranda Dunsden from Aggregates. Along with the backing from Garry Gregory and support from Martin Ashfield, CEMEX secured this major scheme which will see many parts of the business benefit.

It will hopefully be a scheme where all parts of CEMEX can continue to work together as one and show North Yorkshire County Council and the Selby public what a great company we are!

New Quarry At West Deeping



As reported last week, CEMEX UK is in the process of constructing a new Quarry at West Deeping. This week we have a few more details from Tony Groom, our Senior Engineering Manager.

West Deeping Quarry is due to be fully operational by the end of August this year. The new facility is required to replace our Manor Pit Quarry (approx 5 miles away) which has now nearly exhausted all its reserves.

The new facility will produce 350,000 tonnes per annum of finished Aggregates and has been designed to produce eight

different grades of sand and gravels. It is estimated that there are some 2.4 million tonnes of reserves at West Deeping which will meet CEMEX's market requirements for the foreseeable future.

Duo Manufacturing were selected to design and install the washing and screening plant to meet our production requirements with RMB Contractors constructing the Plant foundations. The new site entrance was constructed by Paving Solutions and the internal civil infrastructure by Vision Groundworks.

This new site will incorporate two weighbridges, a wheelwash, together with office and welfare facilities for the staff and drivers.

Have You Done Your 1-2-1 Yet?



Employee feedback during our Engagement Survey told us how important it is that you (CEMEX employees) have 1-2-1 time with your Line Managers. It also told us that you value having these 1-2-1s to help you understand how you are performing and to identity any developmental opportunities.

For 2017 to support this process a new template has been launched for use in these 1-2-1 discussions between Line Managers and employees.

For employees who supervise others this also includes their responsibilities in relation to the Health & Safety Management System (HSMS).

We know that a key element in motivating people is to hold regular 1-2-1s with team members and focus on providing individual feedback; to focus on Safety and to address any concerns.

So be sure to agree with your Line Manager a date for your next 1-2-1 before the end of September.

Well done to Area 6 RMX Ops Manager, Chris Rudd, on his charity bike ride for Wigan & Leigh Hospice on Sunday 9th July.


He raised an impressive £1,750 in sponsorship money.
