Remember:

<u>Never</u> overtake when you <u>think</u> it is safe – <u>Only</u> overtake when you <u>KNOW</u> it is safe to.

London Says 'Hi' To New Hymix 'Lite'



14th September was the culmination of a lot of work from CEMEX, Volvo and HYMIX as the very first Hymix mixer unit landed at Canning Town. The kit was on the latest Volvo N3 urban chassis with additional cameras and a N/S lower door window. IHC, Dennis Blanks, has been waiting a while for the unit to arrive and commented: "This is the best mixer I have ever had!"

Boasting a number of new features to aid the driver in comfort and as an aid to reduce driver fatigue, these new additions to the London fleet have fully automatic gear boxes, storage for the all important tools of the trade and a lower chassis height to help with spotting VRUs.

The mixer unit is also a change from the norm with CANBUS electric mixer controls and a very well thought out quick release hatch that can be opened in less than 60 seconds. A lot of time has been spent on getting this to be the lightest vehicle we can possibly put on the road. The vehicle will only weigh 12,750 kilograms which in today's era of Euro 6 vehicles is impressive. In fact, we will go as far to state that for the spec and safety on this mixer there is not a lighter vehicle on the roads of London.

This, the first of seven 8m3 Volvo Hymix units, has helped in the learning which will be applied to the next batch of vehicles due to hit London from March 2018, and from this exercise we estimate that we can deliver a further 200 - 250 kilogram saving meaning that the new vehicles in London are not only one of the safest but also the lightest ever seen.... helping in our strive to deliver value to the business without compromising on safety.....



FORS For All



Following a systems audit by the governing body CEMEX Readymix have now received the green light to extend the roll out of the Fleet Operators Recognition Scheme (FORS) to all remaining IHCs in the UK Readymix business.

FORS is an accreditation scheme for fleet operators encompassing all aspects of safety, efficiency, and environmental protection by encouraging and training fleet operators to measure, monitor and improve performance. It is a really effective scheme for promoting best practice and focusing drivers and their vehicles on the safety of vulnerable road users. Many of our customers are now requesting deliveries on FORS accredited vehicles and this will now allow us to position CEMEX at the front of the queue.

CEMEX began rolling out the FORS scheme in London in 2015 and then opening up to major conurbations around the UK with approximately 52% of the UK fleet having achieved FORS Accreditation so far. Now we have received the additional approval for all the remaining IHCs in the UK we can really push on and demonstrate to our customers that our IHC fleet is committed to being the best!

Ilkley Triathlon Truck Safety



Phil Hutchinson (Asphalt Business Performance Manager) recently contacted the Area 2 Logistics team to highlight an opportunity to demonstrate road safety around large vehicles at this year's Ilkley Triathlon. The event is very popular with athletes travelling long distances to compete in the grueling competition, which was sold out in just four hours. 2017 also represents the Triathlon's 25th year

anniversary so a fantastic opportunity to engage with a wide spectrum of people really wasn't to be missed!

A pre-event safety visit to the site was arranged with the Triathlon organiser to ensure a safe and suitable location for the truck to exhibit.

The event took place on Sunday 17th September and went very well, with a large number of visitors and competitors climbing into the cab to see the road from the truck driver's seat. Demonstrations of the additional safety features fitted to the CEMEX fleet vehicles were well received, along with the high level



of training given to develop driver skills. This helps them understand where the danger areas and blind spots associated with large vehicles are and how to avoid them.

Thanks go to Phil Hutchinson and Ian Phoenix for organising the event and to North East lead driver, Mark Mann, and Jarrow driver, Lawrence Stobbs, who both gave up Sunday to support the event. Ian Phoenix commented: "Although it was a long day excellent feedback was received and a large number of visitors now have a better understanding of how to share the road safely."



Sand Heron's Safe 'Floating' Refit



The Sand Heron is in effect a floating factory. She is a dredger vessel that collects, processes and delivers sand from the ocean floor to our sand wharfs. This vessel has been responsible for the delivery of 1,027,000.00 tons of Aggregate during the year of 2016 and as can be understood, this does take its toll on all of her machinery.

The floating refit took place within Southampton docks at the repair berth, quay 49 which is adjacent to the new Ocean Cruise Terminal. Here the bright glow of party lights from vessels such as the QE2

and MV Britannia were replaced by the sound of heavy hammers and sparks from welding machines.

This refit was the first of its kind for CEMEX Marine, the idea being to cut down on lost time with the ship being out of service. A usual refit involves work loss on either side of the down time with travel times to and from the refit venue. As the ship is usually based on the south coast of England the port of Southampton made for a good choice. The key contractor chosen for this refit was a company called IME Fabrication, a contractor that has built up a healthy working relationship with CEMEX and one that also shares the same work and safety ethos as we do.

Work commenced on Monday morning 24th July and was completed, with the vessel ready to sail, on the afternoon of Thursday10th August. This was three days ahead of the proposed three week repair

schedule - a big congratulations to IME Fabrication and the teams onboard the vessel. IME adapted quickly to all requirements and changing circumstances, the weather being one with some of the wettest days recorded over the past five years.

As with all refit periods there were trying times and due to the quick action of all involved, LTIs were kept to ZERO. When we consider the stats; with 20 contractors present, over 100 inductions and 9,900 work hours involved, that is a result! Positive feedback was received from various individuals, one in particular coming from the Lloyds Surveyor who reported that the safety onboard the Sand Heron was positive and re-assuring, particularly with regard to confined space entry and evacuation arrangements. This is credit to all involved and another big thanks to the CEMEX teams.



The Sand Heron is now back in action and earning her keep, another million odd tons of Aggregate later and we will not be shy to shake the hand of IME fabrication again.

A very big thank you to all the team members involved, particularly Andy Hoskins's team and all the drivers, a lot of them having to dedicate their weekend and time for this pour. A tremendous job! There is now a new 'tower' which can be seen from the motorway, as the photo shows."
