A Message From Michel



Dear All,

It is sad but overall very frustrating to have to report a contractor LTI after 17 weeks LTI-free in our organisation (see next story for details). And, what is even more frustrating, lies with the conditions that made this incident possible according to preliminary investigation conclusions that tend to raise a too long list of inadequacies with our procedures, starting with sub-optimal training and induction processes and failure to comply with the policy to wear

proper goggles during the discharge of cement in any of our site. Not complying with the latter puts anyone in situation of immediate danger! I believed this was well known and respected in our organisation.

After investigations are completed, if necessary, proper discipline actions along the chain of command will be taken.

With this fifth incident in Scotland for the year, Scotland is clearly our main regional hot spot regarding safety which is triggering special attention from Operational VPs, Chris and Lex, who will be organising, in coordination with Andy, a specific audit of current operating conditions and degree of compliance with our ONE CEMEX's policies.

With this being also the fifth incident for the year in our Logistics operations, Logistics being confirmed as a hot spot, I requested Dave Hart to reinforce our safety management process and to ensure me that policies are properly respected moving forward. It is indeed beyond imagination that in 2017 drivers decide not to not wear proper goggles when delivering cement. We, as management, must be inspired to do more and better in order to prevent such individual behaviours.

Keeping this incident in mind, I urge everyone to stay alert and conscious of risks - always STEPPING IN when we perceive any unsafe behaviour or risk. Consistency and risk awareness form the corner stone of consistent safety performance.

LTI This Week – Chemical Burns To Eyes



Unfortunately we have to record our first lost time injury in 17 weeks following an incident at one of our Plants where a contract tanker driver suffered chemical burns to his eyes whilst discharging cement. The driver had noted a leak at the junction between the delivery hose and the silo inlet, so attempted to release and then reconnect the securing clamp. Regrettably, he failed to consider that the line contained product under pressure and powder was blown into his face. It is estimated it will take the driver up to seven days to fully recover from his injuries.

An investigation is underway to establish the root causes of the incident, which will be shared via a Safety Alert, however, the following apparent shortfalls in the application of our procedures have already been identified:

- The driver was undergoing training in the use of cement tankers and may not have been signed off as fully competent.
- He did not hold an MPQC Driver Skills Card and this was not verified at the dispatch terminal or delivery point.
- He was not given a full induction at the dispatch terminal.
- There may have been a fault on the silo equipment.
- He was wearing safety glasses, rather than safety goggles.

It is essential that procedures are rigorously followed, without deviation, if we are to avoid injuries such as this.

Dust Mask Face Fitting



Scott Saunders, AQM at East Leake, has carried out face fitting for the wearing of dust masks at East Leake Quarry. He has also carried out the face fitting of staff at Cromwell Quarry.

Remember, this should be updated every two years as the contours of the face can change.

Winter Flu Vaccinations



Flu is an unpredictable virus that can cause mild or unpleasant illness in most people. It can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying health condition.

Over time, protection from the injected flu vaccine gradually decreases and flu strains often change. So new flu vaccines are produced each year which is why people advised to have the flu jab need it every year too.

Now is the time of year when people are advised to have a vaccination jab to help protect from or reduce the symptoms of flu. Some people in the higher risk categories get the immunisation free via the NHS. For others the jab is widely available through local pharmacies or local GPs. As usual, CEMEX will reimburse the cost of the vaccination for those that are not entitled to a free

jab. All that employees have to do is provide their Line Manager with an itemised receipt and they will arrange for you to be reimbursed the cost of up to a maximum of £20. Please note that some branches of Asda are offering the jab for £5.

Flu jab side effects

Serious side effects of the injected flu vaccine are very rare. You may have a mild fever and aching muscles for a couple of days after having the jab, and your arm may be a bit sore where you were injected. There is also evidence to suggest that the flu jab can reduce your risk of having a stroke.

As well as flu vaccinations, you should make sure all your 'jabs' are up to date; not only those you had as a child, but if you are planning to travel abroad. Ask your doctor which vaccines are right for you. Please display the Health Essential poster and 'Key Messages' on notice boards and brief your teams in the importance of keeping vaccinations up to date.

Mersey Gateway Bridge Opens As South Plant Comes Down

On Saturday 14th October the £600m Mersey Gateway Toll Bridge opened just as the second of the two site Plants was taken down and moved off for its involvement in the next major project CEMEX secures, in helping to build a Greater Britain.



Over the past two and half years we have supplied over 156,000m3 from the two site Plants, with over 9,000 separate pours supplied, with a large proportion of out of hours working. Within this we have completed 22 choreographed pours of over 1,100m3 each for the main river approaches on both banks, referenced as MSS pours, using a Movable Scaffold System (MSS) for some very complex and precise pours, with technically demanding mixes.

Paul Cheeseman, CEMEX Operations Manager, commented: "I am very proud of all the team involved in making this project a success. Our small operational team has had to endure long hours, frequently at short notice; had to overcome a variety of challenges, the biggest probably being a site power failure part way through a 1,200m3 pour at 7pm at night, which saw our contingency planning kick in without any noticeable effect to the client.

We have been well supported locally by our Technical Department, who have also endured challenges, with the client looking for a tolerance window of 10mm either way on consistency on all the deck pours and MSS pours - this was on top of a project where every load supplied was tested by the client for consistency. Our aggregates, cements and admixture colleagues have served us well and managed any issues with good communication through to resolution. All of the pours were placed with Preston Brook Planning office, with the Planning team also meeting the daily challenges the project threw at us and their support and assistance was greatly appreciated.

Having now taken time to step back and view the completed structure, it is testament to our ability as a business that we have had a successful involvement in such a complex engineering feat."

Up From The Rubble... Liverpool Asphalt Plant Is Born



The new Asphalt Plant in Liverpool's Docklands, Brunswick Place, is almost up and running. The site has been transformed from



rubble and tyres to a modern, squeaky clean, shiny new Asphalt Plant.



CEMEX UK secured the lease on the site and work started to clear it in December 2016. Once up and running the Plant should be capable of supplying 160 tonnes per hour.

We recently secured a project for Dyer & Butler Ltd at Bulford MOD tank track and wash down facility on the Bulford Campus at Salisbury Plain. The job was serviced from our Amesbury Plant.

The VAP mix agreed upon was CEMEX MICROTECH S MICROSILICA. This part of the project involved the construction of a tank track (road) from one of the tank exercise areas to a new wash down facility where the tanks are serviced and cleaned. As the title states: IT TAKES THE WHOLE TEAM to produce this production and technically-demanding product in a safe and timely way.

Everybody really pulled together, including the hands on involvement of Steve Thorpe and Dan Seller for fine tuning of the mix and batching process. A big thank you to Elliot Webb, Plant Manager, for producing a quality product and the considerable effort needed to switch materials from the 20mm Limestone back to our normal production materials for other products, and to Rob Zsigo for managing all of these elements.

The success of the contract would not have been possible without the input and effort of base IHCs, Ross and Will, and all involved including Area 24 external sales and internal teams at Rugby. Although Amesbury is plant shipped the support of Mariska's team at the Thorpe CSO was also a vital element of making this work. This is yet another example of CEMEX Helping to Build a Greater Britain.

Spear Phishing Protection



Email is one of our most important forms of communication. For this reason, criminals try to use emails to steal sensitive information, commit fraud, and damage computers. Usually criminals take advantage of the fact that potential victims can't see them to pretend to be coworkers, friends, banks, government departments, etc. and deceive their victims into doing thing they should not do.

One popular deceptive technique used by hackers today involves them posing as a company employee and sending emails to other employees requesting them to open malicious links and attachments. For this trick, the hackers don't necessarily need to compromise a legitimate company email account; instead, they use other email accounts under their control and change the name and email address tags on the messages to legitimate email addresses and names, thus confusing the recipients.



Recommendations:

- If you receive an email or chat message that asks you to open an attachment or click on a link that appears suspicious or unsolicited, verify the message's legitimacy by contacting the sender through an alternate method of communication.
- If you suspect that your computer is infected, please report it to the Help Desk.
- Be wary of emails in which: Someone tries to create a tremendous sense of urgency.

The sender's email address appears unusual.

CEMEX Fleet First To Obtain Carbon Neutral Certification In Colombia



CEMEX announced that it received the Sello Verde de Verdad (True Green Label), granted by the Colombian company Ecologic S.A.S., and the certification of neutralisation of greenhouse gas emissions linked to transport activities in Colombia, issued by the Colombian Institute of Technical Standards and Certification (ICONTEC Internacional). This certification makes CEMEX the first company in the country with carbon neutral certification on its entire vehicle fleet.

Through this certification, CEMEX joins Colombia's and other 190 countries' commitment at the 2015 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, celebrated in Paris.

Rare Burying Beetle Spotted At Molesey



Whilst monitoring bats on our site in Molesey, Ross Baker from the Surrey Bat Group, noticed this colourful creature. It is a very rare Sexton Beetle.

Sexton Beetles require dead Carrion for their larvae to feed on - they actually burrow beneath the carcasses of birds and small mammals to bury them, lay their eggs underneath, forming a "crypt" - hence the alternative name burying beetle. Unusually in the insect world both parents remain with the brood to assist in feeding.

It is a slightly ghoulish insect to mention to the kids during Halloween!!

Breathing New Life Into Former Charles Nelson Cement Site



We were contacted recently on Twitter by a local company who purchased some land from us near Southam, Warwickshire where Rugby cement used to own a Cement Plant. It was originally the Charles Nelson cement and lime works which operated in the last century and closed in about 1945.



The site is adjacent to the Grand Union canal which was used for transport of incoming raw materials and outgoing finished products, which included cement, clay pipes and bricks. It has now been redeveloped into a waterways training centre where boaters can learn the finer points of navigating the canals on narrow boats. There was originally an arm of the canal which went into the cement works this had been filled in and is now restored to its former glory.

Steve Vaughan of Willow Wren Training showed us some excellent pictures of the site at the turn of the century and the "before and after" pictures since they acquired the site from CEMEX in 2013. It was also great to see a picture of one of our trucks delivering readymix, Readymix Concrete, for the foundations of their new training facility - closing the circle nicely. If any local people are interested to visit, there is a public footpath running across the site, which is along the course of the old railway.

VACCINATIONS UP TO DATE

Check your vaccination records and make sure you and your loved ones are up to date with what is required. Protect yourself and your family at all times.









ILD A GREATER BRITAIN





- Immunization is the process whereby a person is made resistant or immune to an infectious disease, typically by the administration of a vaccine
- Your need of vaccination doesn't end when you become an adult. The protection from some vaccines you received as a child can wear off
- Vaccines not only protect you, but reduce the chance you 'Il spread illness to the community
- The specific vaccines you need as an adult are determined by factors such as your age, health condition (e.g. diabetes, lung diseases, etc), job, lifestyle, locations of travel and vaccines you've received in the past.
- Ask your doctor which vaccines are right for you



- If you plan to travel abroad, and specially to risk areas, speak with your physician about vaccinations to consider (e.g. Hepatitis A, Yellow fever, Hepatitis B, etc)
- Having an up-to-date record is important because it shows if you are protected against vaccine- preventable diseases
- Your doctor can order a blood test to check your level of protection in case you don't have your record vaccinations
- Vaccine side effects are usually mild and go away on their own. Severe side effects are very rare
- You're never too old to get vaccines. Sticking to a vaccination schedule as you age gives you the best shot at long- term health



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
