



Snow And Ice - Let's Not Slip Up



With wintry weather across much of the UK this week it is vital that we all take extra care and avoid unnecessary risks. Where journeys cannot be avoided motorists should allow extra time and drive in accordance with the road and weather conditions, keeping speeds down and leaving plenty of space from the vehicle in front. Arrangements should be in place to ensure pedestrian routes are kept clear of snow/ice and suitable footwear is essential. It is also important that we all take responsibility for reporting potential slip/trip hazards via the Near Miss/Hazard Alert Reporting System, so that action can be taken to eliminate or reduce risks at source wherever possible before someone gets hurt.

Often our natural instinct is to beat the weather and get things moving. Whilst it's important to do that – it's also very important that we do it SAFELY. Safety

comes BEFORE production, it comes before everything.

In recent months we have talked a lot about hazards existing all around us at work, in our sites, out on the road, in our offices, and indeed on the way to and from work. These weather conditions simply add to those hazards so please be aware of the additional dangers that snow and ice can cause for us all. Only last week someone was injured in the UK business as a result of a slip on ice. It's almost Christmas, a time when most of us will be able to take a well earned rest – let's get there safely! Please be aware of the hazards around you and TAKE CARE of yourselves and each other. If it's not safe – don't do it.

Last Friday the attached materials (in the download section of UK News website), which highlight the risk of slips, trips and falls in the winter months, were circulated across the Region. Site teams are encouraged to display the posters as appropriate and also review the practical advice guidance.

DSM's Partner In Safety



Area 7 came up with the idea of Partners in Safety a couple of years ago. The idea behind it is if a customer goes above and beyond to keep our staff safe when delivering or working on the customer's site, we should highlight this effort by nominating them for an Award.

Barratt Homes (Nottingham) have had two silos on their development site for two years now and apart from servicing the silos we have not had to send an Engineer out to this site for a breakdown. This is practically unheard of in the Dry Silo Business, you nearly always find someone has forgotten to drain down in the winter or the mixer has not been cleaned out

properly which often results in an Engineer having to go to site and repair the problem.

Andrew Parfrement, Telehandler Driver/Silo Operative, takes such good care of the silos that these issues don't happen. He commented that the mixer and silo CEMEX use is second to none; he has worked with most of our competitor's silos and he much prefers the kit CEMEX use.

Barratt Homes has gone one step further by installing a reinforced barrier along the front of the silos to stop any accidental damage by the site machinery, and this keeps an exclusion zone in front of the silos to keep Andrew safe whist operating them.

Eat And Be Merry But Don't Drink And Drive



It's been 50 years since the first anti-drink driving commercial aired on British television. Since then road deaths, due to drink driving, have fallen from 1,640 in 1967 to just 230 in 2012. Although this is a dramatic drop in statistics 230 deaths is still too many.

Please, therefore, as we go into this festive period, watch and display this short film on TV monitors on site. The film follows a tragic crash scene and the sequence of events that follow. Throughout each scene Kool and The Gang's iconic, 'Celebrate' song, and is reluctantly sung by the emergency services whilst they perform their duties. We see the victim being cut out of the overturned car, the desperate revival efforts of the paramedic and ambulance team, and the horrific moment when the widowed mother is told the news by police officers.

The message is clear: there is no place for celebration until there are no deaths due to drink driving.



Dry Silo Mortar have been supplying Dragados at Bank Station capacity upgrade





for just under a year now with spray applied concrete via on-site silos and mixing units.

Around 16,000 tonnes from over 540 deliveries have been supplied to the site and the tunnels and caverns which now run along the existing London Underground Northern Line. The further open spraying is happening at the moment over 500 metres away from the surface and is due to continue for another 18 months.

A small team was set up to monitor work closely with Dragados. Bill Buckley is our Customer Service Officer maintaining the silos and mixing equipment, and Briony Potter is the Distribution Co-ordinator. Briony looks after their delivery requirements which have increased to over 200 tonnes and day, including night deliveries. This is also backed up by operational staff at the supply plants in Dove Holes (Mick Stafford and Dan Ball), and Bletchley (Wayne Hall). Briony works closely with our contactor haulage company, NJ Docksey. Whilst Dragados are buying the product they have contracted out the spraying to Joseph Gallagher. The feedback given to Bill and Briony when they visited the site on Friday was very encouraging and they were extremely pleased with the surface finish and the lack of fall down.



The site is located directly on London Bridge! – It is very difficult to access and a special lane separates pedestrians and other vulnerable road users away from site traffic. Each silo holds up to 100 tonnes of dried sprayed concrete blown in by the road tanker.

CO2 Savings Are Better For Everyone



Eurovia and Cheshire East Highways recently visited the Dove Holes Asphalt Plant and Quarry. These two key clients came to meet CEMEX to discuss the CO2 savings made on the council contract in 2017, and to have key staff members see how our materials are produced as part of their Continual Professional Development.

Estimated CO2 savings were 3.8 kgs per tonne of asphalt material achieved by using an ECO binder and natural gas in production. This equates to

49,400kgs of CO2 saved on this contract alone. The meeting was collaborative and resulted in continuing these commitments into 2018.

Cheshire East Highways commented that it was: "An extremely informative and interactive day which enhances our commitment to our home grown talent and their Continual Professional Development. This undoubtedly reinforces our continued drive to reduce C02 emissions on all aspects of delivery in the Borough of Cheshire East."

Steph Fox from Cheshire East Highways also found the day very worthwhile and commented: "The visit to the Quarry gave us an insight into the process of making the material that we so regularly use in the Capital Delivery Team. All of the employees from Eurovia and CEMEX were very knowledgeable and explained all the processes at the Quarry. Many thanks to Eurovia and CEMEX, and all involved."

Thanks to all who attended the meeting with special mention to Dove Holes' Hayden Gill and Stephen Leigh, for both their hospitality on the day and their input during the meeting, and to Paul Fletcher for compiling all the CO2 figures for the presentations. Travellers - Preventative Measures..... Act Now!



The very nature of our business renders our land vulnerable to trespass and, in particular, unlawful encampments of the travelling community. The process of eviction can be very costly in terms of bailiff fees, lost time and the clean up once travellers have moved on.

As the photographs show, our site at Kingsmead, near Heathrow Airport, recently suffered in this regard with travellers angle-grinding the hinges from two sets of iron gates to enter and set up camp.

In the space of just three days our unwanted visitors took to fly-tipping on an industrial scale, dumping in excess of 100 tonnes of building and house clearing type waste. Despite our prompt action to have them evicted, in this short space of time the total cost to remove the travellers and the dumped material amounted to over £28,000!



Please take time to consider - is your site vulnerable, or even worse, attractive to travellers? Would it be easily accessed? Are there items of scrap value lying around unnecessarily which might be of interest to the travellers? What measures can you put in place in simple, safe and timely fashion to prevent an unwanted and very expensive unlawful encampment on your site?

Preventative measures might include:





- Effective gating, if necessary reinforced with sleepers particularly where gates are otherwise unused.
- Secure gates at all times and where possible box off or weld locks and hinges to limit access and thwart attack.
- A combination of bunds, trenches and chicanes are inexpensive measures that can prevent access to outsized vehicles and in particular trailers and caravans.
- Ensure old plant and scrap is disposed of appropriately or at least positioned out of sight.

The law in relation to the removal of trespassers occupying land is complicated and seeks to balance the rights of both the land owner and the



alleged trespassers. If you become aware of trespassers occupying or attempting to occupy your site, prompt action is vital.

In the first instance make a note of the numbers of people and vehicles involved and any damage that has been caused to gain entry. Inform the local police and CEMEX security. Do not confront the travellers except to politely point out they are on private land and request them to leave. Under no circumstances should staff engage in any negotiations for travellers to leave by an agreed time.


