Please Check And Use The Right Chargers....



Unfortunately, we had an employee Lost Time Injury last week. The circumstances of the incident were quite unusual but very relevant to safety in the home as well as at work, and could have led to a very serious eye injury.

A rechargeable head torch, fitted to a safety helmet, was placed on charge in a tea room first thing in the morning. During a break the team heard a buzzing noise, turned and saw flames coming from the head torch; the lead of the adjacent microwave was also on fire. In the attempt to extinguish the fire one of the Operators picked up the safety helmet and the battery pack on the head torch exploded and a piece of hot material was projected into a colleague's eye. The

injured person received first aid and was taken to hospital where he was diagnosed with a scratched cornea and burns to his lower eyelid; it was very fortunate his injuries were not even more severe.

An investigation is underway and a Safety Alert will be issued, however, at this stage we know that the wrong charger was being used with the battery pack; the charger, which was for a TV box, was rated at 5.99v whereas the lithium ion batteries were 4.2v. It is important to always use the correct chargers with electrical systems both at work and at home. Any personal electrical devices/equipment brought to work should be authorised and PAT tested (Portable Appliance Testing). Michel Andre, CEMEX UK Country President, commented: "I am very sad to report a further LTI in our operations, the second of the year, making our overall performance as poor YTD as in 2017. It is not a good start of the year, the worst of CEMEX European countries.

A full RCA of this further incident has yet to be conducted before we draw any conclusions. As an immediate action, I am asking everyone to check that electrical chargers he/she is using have been PAT tested (Portable Appliance Testing) and are connected to the proper equipment.

Furthermore, even though no fire extinguisher was used to extinguish the flames, we will revise thoroughly our policy, instructions and training procedures related to fire extinguishers as their use in some circumstances could create even riskier situations.

Please take care of yourselves and your colleagues, always applying Stop, Think & Check principles and always step-in when you observe any risk or improper behaviour."

VFLs Help Reduce Potential Slips, Trips & Falls



At Hyndford Quarry they carried out a VFL with several drivers that came into site, contract haulage drivers and collects.

They identified that when exiting the site the drivers had to exit their cabs and descend a set of stairs to get their tickets from the weighbridge, as well as checking their weights.

Kevin Hill, Quarry Manager, explains: "If they were overweight or underweight they would need to go back and tip off or be reloaded - this meant going up and down to and from their cabs and the weighbridge. We have since installed a scale display that shows the drivers their gross weight when in their cabs which, if it identifies they are overweight or short of material, they simply go back without exiting their cab, therefore, reducing the potential for slips, trips and falls."

Quality Progress Recognised With New Certificate



2017 was an important year for Quality across all CEMEX UK businesses. Working as ONE CEMEX, the project to create and launch our new ONE CEMEX Quality System came to fruition. This was strongly supported by the launch of the dedicated Quality App on World

Quality Day in November.

The App gives instant access, online and offline, to Quality Management Systems for all our products through an intuitive flow chart interface. 2018 has also started strongly for Quality. In January, senior representatives of the Materials, Cement and Building Products businesses went through a thorough transition audit with Construction Products Certification (CPC), a specialist certification body for Quality Management Systems. The assessors carried out a detailed review of the new system, ensuring that we had covered every nook and corner of the new version of ISO 9001. They were more than satisfied with what they found and very complimentary about our Quality App.

Following successful completion of the transition assessment CPC confirmed on 6th March that certification for conformity with BS EN ISO 9001:2015 had been granted. The new certification means more than just an incremental update of our Quality Management Systems. Quality products and quality service are crucial to Customer Centricity. As well as an in-depth knowledge of how our processes and controls affect quality, the new system helps us to understand and meet customer needs more directly. This in turn helps the Quality function to work to deliver the strategic objectives of our business – Best For Customers!

Following on from our first ever ONE CEMEX Quality Review in January, the individual businesses have been holding their own Quality Reviews under the new system, to review the past year and identify risks and opportunities for the year to come. Operational Excellence – Just Ci's Best Ideas



Our Aggregates business give a Just Ci (continuous improvement) award of the month each month to the ideas from the business which contribute to making us more effective and efficient. For the month of January there was a joint winner – Denge Quarry and Raynes Quarry. Here are their winning ideas:

Denge Quarry's improvement was to have the ability to float their excavating equipment so they can use previously inaccessible raw materials in their production - this has resulted in increasing the life of the Quarry from three to four years to between eight to ten years and an estimated OCF of £8/£10m with this new way of working.

Raynes Quarry wanted to reduce their Contract Crushing costs and their idea was to replace their single deck screen with a double deck screen to reduce Contract rework. A surplus screen was utilised from within the North West Area and installed at a cost of £120K - the results have been so good that we were able to completely cancel the Contract Crushing costs saving £230K in year one and £350K from year two onwards.

Local Rugby MP Meets Our Apprentices



Local MP, Mark Pawsey, has visited three of CEMEX's apprentices based in Rugby - Luke Low, Jamie Collins and Joshua Sargent - to find out about the opportunities an apprenticeship offers.

Mark's visit came during National Apprenticeship Week 2018 which celebrates the great benefits to both employers and young people that apprenticeships offer. Since 2010 there have been over 6,700 apprenticeship starts in Rugby with over 1,000 new apprentices starting in 2016-17.

During Mark's visit to CEMEX he was joined by Barrie Flitton,

CEMEX's Cement Logistics Operations Manager, and Dave Hart, CEMEX UK Logistics Director, to speak to three of the firm's apprentices who are nearing the end of their 12 months training programme at their Rugby site. Luke, Jamie and Joshua all spoke about how they had worked closely with experienced drivers to secure their HGV license and learn the tricks of the trade, including unloading the full cement tankers at their destination.

Speaking after meeting the apprentices, Mark said: "It was very clear from meeting the longstanding members of staff at CEMEX helping to deliver apprenticeship training how enthusiastic they are about offering a new generation the skills the experience that they have built up over the years. However, as was highlighted by Barrie Flitton, young apprentices often bring a new set of skills with them, including a familiarity with modern technology which CEMEX are increasingly incorporating into their vehicles."
