Value Adding and the 8 Wastes ..remembered by

the acronym..













In this update we explain the concepts of value-adding and non-value adding activities, the 8 different types of waste which suck the value out of our business, and how to identify and eliminate waste -

Transportation - Excessive movement of materials, products & information from one location to another





Waiting - Delays caused by shortages, seeking approvals, waiting for something to happen



Inventory – Excessive raw, inprocess or finished materials. products or information

Over Production – Producing quicker or more than required on the assumption that we can sell it



Motion - Excessive movement and / or poor ergonomics that force excessive reaching, twisting, bending



Over Processing – Adding more value or putting more into the product or service than the customer is willing to pay for



Human Talent / People - The untapped skills, knowledge and potential of our most important 'appreciating' asset




Defects – An unplanned waste or fault, something not done 'Right First Time' or needs to be done more than once



Think about the 8 WASTES in your role and workplace....






Do we ask for other peoples' ideas for improvements?
