Keep Safety In Mind At All Times



Well done to everyone who kept themselves and each other safe last week. We did have one TRI in Asphalt. Unfortunately, one of our employees suffered a cut to his forearm whilst carrying out plant maintenance. The wound had to be sealed with glue and steri-strips which is classed as medical treatment, and this has been recorded as a TRI.

The injured employee was working alongside a contract fitter and part of the work involved the removal of a steel beam. Sadly, when removing the beam, it fell and struck the employee's arm. It has been confirmed that a Risk Assessment and Worksafe had been completed ahead of the task and the plant was fully isolated. The investigation will consider whether there was sufficient consideration of the difficulty handling the beam, considering the weight and restricted area, and whether mechanical aids or greater assistance could have been used to reduce the risk. Any learning points will be shared via a Safety Alert on completion of the investigation.

ROSPA Family Safety Week



Over the years we've made huge strides in our workplace safety and safety on the roads, however, **do we take safety home with us?** Sadly, accidents remain the biggest killer of children and young people, up to the age of 19 yet it doesn't have to be like this.

One area of focus in our 2018 UK Health and Safety Improvement Plan is our families and keeping them safe in their own homes and daily environment, particularly those who are most vulnerable – including children and the elderly. As part of this initiative we have teamed up with ROSPA in support of their Family Safety Week which runs from 23rd to 29th April

In the same week we are also supporting, as a member of the MPA, the National Fire Chief's Council Drowning Prevention and Water Safety Week – with a focus for CEMEX on trespass and Quarry safety. Across the UK there are circa five fatalities per year in Quarries involving members of the public, the majority of which are water related and occur in disused sites. These tragic statistics are a reminder of the importance of being vigilant at all the sites we are responsible for.



So, keep an eye out every day next week for promotional materials including posters and videos, which you can take home and share with your loved ones to make home a safer environment. We will be covering Safety in the Home, including Safe Bed Time, Safe Play Time and Safe Leisure Time – so let's all **Stay Safe!**

We Are Going In The Right Direction?



Reflecting on our quarter on Quarter Safety Performance, shown in the chart below, it is encouraging to see we have made some progress reducing the number and severity of incidents (Lost Time Injuries down from 5 to 2; TRIs down from 7 to 6).

However, whilst the majority of our operations continue to build on their long-term injury free records, thanks to the commitment of the local teams to ensure nothing comes before their Health and Safety, incidents

like the one last week highlight the need for

continued vigilance if we are to maintain ZERO Harm performance in the long term. We must build on our improving trend and ensure consistent high standards and safe behaviours across the whole of the business.



Everyone must take the time to STOP, THINK & CHECK

before starting a new task, to ensure all necessary safety controls are in place, and understand we all have a moral duty to STEP IN if we see anything unsafe.

QR Code For Electronic Reporting



Following on from the recent accident that happened at one of our sites when a rail hopper truck door was jammed, it was clear that no one had an understanding of how big an issue sticking doors were. Jason Barker started keeping a manual log from the train manifests as well as updates from Site Managers.

Jason continues: "This process is quite time consuming, open to error and underreporting. In the mantra of better never stops we have created a system that lets anyone electronically report a problem using a QR CODE on their smart phone.

This system doesn't replace our current system of INTELEX - it supports it by encouraging people to easily report an issue in real time which allows us to then review and sort the data."

Collaboration across the West Midlands team in Oldbury, Kings Norton and Aston saved the day recently when the loading shovel at Oldbury suffered a breakdown 50m3 into a 420m3 pour. This meant the Plant ceased production.

The team sprang into action. Trucks were moved; Aggregate and Cement diverted, and a replacement shovel ordered which resulted in the customer finishing their pour, as scheduled, with only a 45 minute interruption. Not bad!!

More NAM Training From The RSPB



The RSPB group, Nature After Minerals (NAM), is going to be running a second day's training course on 'Calcareous grassland, enhancement, creation and management'. This will take place on Thursday 5th July at Dove Holes Quarry in Derbyshire. Booking for the original 4th July course is now closed.

The outline of this course (as appeared in our original promotional leaflet) is as follows:

"An introduction to grasslands – creation, establishment and aftercare – aimed at the minerals industry. Join us to learn about creating and managing calcareous grassland habitat to benefit a wealth of species. We will be covering: grassland creation techniques; choosing what is right for your soils; establishment; common issues and "what good looks like", as well as the importance of aftercare management.

The course will focus on calcareous grasslands surrounding CEMEX Dove Holes Quarry in Derbyshire and will include a light lunch and afternoon site visit."

By law, from April 2018 the employee contribution rate for members of the Auto Enrolment pension scheme will increase from 1% to 3%. The employer contribution will increase from 1% to 2%. This change will happen automatically.

Think about the 8 WASTES in your role and workplace....




Do things get moved around or double-handled?
