Two TRIs.....



Unfortunately, two colleagues went home injured last week. We have had two Recordable Injuries (TRIs), one retrospectively from the previous week.

In the first incident, a contract truckmixer driver had been standing on the bumper of his vehicle at the end of his shift to clean the rear chute, as he stepped down he went over on his ankle. He attended hospital in the early hours of the following morning due to the pain and swelling and was not able to do his full range of duties later that day. While the ground conditions were good, the incident highlights the need to either work from ground level where possible, or ensure suitable access is available when cleaning/maintaining trucks or mobile plant.

The second injury involved an employee who was releasing the bonnet on a forklift truck to check the fluid levels, which is a routine job. The bonnet is released by pressing a button located in an access hole, situated beneath the driver's seat. The operator used the middle finger of his left hand to press the button; however, it slipped off and got trapped between the access hole and the mechanism. In an attempt to free himself the operator closed the bonnet again, but this applied further pressure and cut into his finger. In pulling his hand free, the operator suffered a deep cut to his finger which required hospital treatment.

Investigations in to both incidents are underway. In the second case it will involve the forklift truck manufacturers. We wish both of those injured a speedy recovery and will share all relevant learning points on completion of the investigations.

Michel Andre, CEMEX UK President, commented: "These incidents should encourage us to redouble vigilance and to renew our commitment to consistently apply our Health & Safety principles, always thinking before acting and always stepping in when we observe a risky situation. Let's be constantly alert and conscious of our own vulnerability.

I also encourage everyone to participate to our health and wellbeing initiative throughout the month of May and to take full advantage of the materials we provide, not hesitating to trigger conversations at home with your beloved ones."

RoadPeace And CEMEX UK Join Forces To Support CLOCS



RoadPeace, the national charity for road crash victims, and CEMEX UK, are calling on the construction industry to join the Construction Logistics and Community Safety (CLOCS) scheme. They have produced a video aimed at the construction industry, highlighting the reasons why the scheme is so important.

There are now over 600 CLOCS champions from the construction industry, but with almost 300,000

construction companies working within the UK, it is clear that many more still need to join. Around 500 pedestrians, cyclists and other vulnerable road users are killed or seriously injured each year on our roads by HGVs. The CLOCS standard seeks to reduce this number in three ways:

- 1. By reducing the imbalance between on-site health and safety and work-related road risk.
- 2. Encouraging wider adoption of best practice across the logistics industry.
- 3. Improving the safety of vehicles.

To further demonstrate the need for CLOCS, RoadPeace is giving a voice to people who have been injured or bereaved by construction vehicles, as part of this campaign.

Victoria Lebrec, RoadPeace spokesperson and victim of a construction lorry crash, says: "In 2014 my life changed forever when I was hit by a tipper truck whilst cycling in London. I lost my leg in the collision and have had over 12 operations and months of physiotherapy. I urge all construction companies to join up to CLOCS and take on board some simple, effective methods to make their vehicles safer. If signing up means saving someone the pain I went through then it is absolutely worth it."

Andy Taylor, Health and Safety Director CEMEX UK, says: "We are delighted to be involved in this video and would encourage everyone in our industry who isn't a member of CLOCS to become members. Over the years the construction industry has shown great commitment and done an excellent job of raising Health and Safety standards on sites. Now it is time to go beyond the sites themselves to roads and site access to raise the level of safety by sharing best practice and implementing innovation and change."

Derek Rees from CLOCS says: "I am delighted that RoadPeace and CEMEX UK have joined forces to create a hard-hitting video calling on others within the sector to join up to the scheme. As an industry, the construction sector takes Health and Safety on site really seriously but very few clients, principal contractors and sub-contractors seem to recognise their legal and moral responsibilities for the vehicles servicing their sites. As soon as that lorry leaves the site the same rules don't seem to apply. The CLOCS scheme is a way of introducing workable solutions which help everyone in the industry protect the wider community, their colleagues and themselves."

Op Ex Is A Well Oiled Machine In The NE!!



"When we started our Ci (continuous improvement) journey in the North East one of the first areas we collectively tackled was to transform our oil and lube stores," comments Darren Eversedge, Aggs Weighbridge Operative, Divethill. "Sometimes down the line the difference is plain to see - not only do we now have much safer, effective and fit for purpose stores but we are sustaining them as such.

The use of visual maximum and minimum levels ensures cost effective stock keeping whilst potentially

increasing OEE (reduced chance of downtime due to running out of replacement oils etc). We have used colour-coded jugs for filling to avoid the possibility of cross contamination - a simple idea that works very well!

Correct bunding is in place leading to improved Health & Safety - reducing the chance of any slips, trips and falls but also gives the benefit of less risk of causing any environmental issues. Visual management allows us to sustain the good work we have already done e.g. the use of checklists and pictures of how the area is required to be kept.

This just goes to show what good team work coupled with the correct methods can achieve! More to come from team NE shortly..."

Tilbury Tidy Up Too



The Operational Excellence gurus have been working at Tilbury by turning their attention to the offices. There has been great progress already in the other areas of the Plant and the team are showing their usual enthusiasm to raise the standards and see problems as opportunities to make further improvements.

Port Of London Authority Invest In Northfleet



The first new investment by the Port of London Authority (PLA), as part of its recently launched Investment Plan, is over £3 million support for the installation of a new conveyor system at CEMEX's Northfleet terminal, on the Thames.

The new conveyor will improve the discharge performance of the material from the dredger onto the Northfleet site for processing. The site currently handles approximately 500,000 tonnes of material a year. CEMEX Marine dredgers bring sand and gravel from the North Sea and other off-shore locations into three wharves along the Thames including Northfleet, primarily for use in the London construction market.

The PLA's Investment Plan is aimed at diversifying the PLA's income streams and delivering the goals of their Thames Vision, which targets greater river use,

alongside an improving environment. The Investment Plan aims to support commercial investments which support the river and port use, long term investments which deliver public benefits and public benefit investment with no financial return.

PLA Chairman, Christopher Rodrigues CBE, said: "We have built up a strategic cash reserve over many years to provide us with scope to make beneficial investments. We're going to turn that reserve to active use, sustaining and growing river use and improving the environment. The Thames Vision sets out really ambitious goals and this is us doing our bit to kick start development and growth."

CEMEX's Marine Director, Laurence Dagley, comments: "We welcome the opportunity to partner with the PLA to improve cargo handling on the Thames. London is an important market for us and this investment will provide a platform for continued use and future growth. The capital needs approximately 10 million tonnes of sand, gravel and crushed rock every year to build, maintain and improve housing, buildings and infrastructure. The use of water to transport building materials to the heart of the city reduces the need for long distance lorry movements, with every dredger reducing the need for 250 lorries on our busy roads."

CEMEX Supplies Cement For Montenegro's Construction Boom



CEMEX announced that CEMEX Croatia is actively participating in Montenegro's infrastructure boom by supplying building materials for several infrastructure projects, including three mixed-use resorts and a highway.

For the Smokovac-Mateševo section of the Bar-Boljare highway - the largest engineering project currently under development in Montenegro - CEMEX has already supplied over 280,000 tons of Cement, and continues to participate in this project. This 41-kilometre-

long section of highway, part of Bar-Belgrade-Budapest Corridor, is expected to require the construction of 32 tunnels and 45 bridges and viaducts - rising from 63 to 1,100 metres above sea level.



CEMEX is also supplying over 200,000 tons of Cement for the Portonovi, Porto Montenegro, and Luštica Bay projects. These three mixed-use resorts offer luxurious accommodations, including a marina and yacht clubs, to attract high-end tourism to the Adriatic coast.
