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CARING FOR FAMILIES

Another Week Injury Free - Keep It Up



Congratulations to everyone for keeping each other safe last week. This makes it our 8th week LTI free, however, there was a retrospective TRI last week. An employee suffered a restricted work injury when a handrail, which he was using to steady himself, collapsed and hit his shoulder causing bruising; the handrail was positioned alongside but above where the employee was working. The employee is making a good recovery and any relevant learning points will be shared via a Safety Alert once the investigation is complete.

Check Boundaries



With the hot weather continuing and the school holidays looming, please take time to check your site boundaries where there is open water, including restoration areas and vacant sites. Site boundaries and signage should be suitable, sufficient and well maintained, with additional security being considered for high risk sites where there is a history of trespass. Any specific danger areas should be highlighted with additional bunding, fences and signage, along with rescue equipment as appropriate. Access to heights, confined spaces, mobile plant, etc. should also be restricted.

It is important to ensure control measures are maintained, with regular documented inspections and photographic evidence of repairs being retained as appropriate.

CEMEX Logistics recently supported the Institute of Traffic Accident Investigators research and at Bruntingthorpe Aerodrome, Leicestershire - providing an articulated tanker with the latest "Pedestrian Road Safety Campaign" livery and a high vision Econic low cab tipper truck - featuring our latest vulnerable road user safety equipment for test ride demonstrations.



The event was attended by over 500 delegates with police officers from various UK divisions, emergency services and accident investigators and experts from both the UK and abroad.

The aim of the Institute is to promote road safety for the benefit of the public by improving the technical and general knowledge and skills of persons involved in the field of investigating road traffic collisions and seeks to improve the standards of safety of vehicles and roads of all kinds.

Our vehicles were there to provide experience and understanding of the direct and indirect vision in trucks and the safety devices, CCTV and safety systems we install to reduce the risk of incidents with cyclists and pedestrians.

The queue for the truck experience was constant all day and our drivers: Bob Lockhart, Darrell Collins and Steve Bateman worked none stop taking delegates around the test track.

CEMEX Participates In Main Wastewater Treatment Plant In Colombia



CEMEX recently announced its participation in the expansion and optimisation of the 'El Salitre' Wastewater Treatment Plant, located



on the outskirts of Bogotá, Colombia. CEMEX expects to supply over 290,000 cubic metres of concrete for this project, which will contribute to the decontamination of the Bogotá River, the main river in the Andean Colombian Savannah.

Since October 2017, CEMEX has provided building materials for the construction of the Plant's piles, slabs, tank walls, and piled walls. Built with low and very low permeability concretes, the facility's tanks have 40-centimetre thick walls with a 7-centimetre coating that are designed to withstand the most aggressive environment.

Microsoft 365 Suite Guidance.....



Earlier this week you will have all received an email giving guidance on how to use Shift, Yammer, Sharepoint and Microsoft 365. In case you missed it here is the note again:

This note is to clarify how to use the new Microsoft 365 digital tools in our day-to-day business, and what is happening with Shift.

MICROSOFT 365 - SUMMARY

Microsoft 365 is our new suite of tools to help us all communicate digitally with each other internally, share information, share files and work more effectively as teams. All the elements of MS 365 are available to us all now we are registered – just go to https://www.office.com and sign in using usual CX email address and password and after you've signed in it remembers you.

- OUTLOOK for our emails and replacing Lotus Notes we're all migrated and using this now
- YAMMER a blogging and chat area very similar to Shift Communities Yammer Group membership can be closed or open and also works with non-CEMEX people
- SHAREPOINT this has a variety of functions. It is the replacement for our shared network drives, but available anytime, anywhere on the cloud. It's a long-term filing cabinet for groups of people to use together in functional or business groups. It can be used for saving, sharing, modifying files folders and news items. It's a true collaboration space where you can quickly create and publish web pages too. Individual business teams will need to decide how they want to use and structure Sharepoint in their local teams.
- **ONEDRIVE** the place for all of us individually to save our files in the cloud think of this as your own personal filing cabinet
- **TEAMS** similar to Sharepoint but for more short lived, multi-functional projects. Much of the functionality is the same as Sharepoint
- WORD, EXCEL, POWERPOINT can also be used as online versions eg Word Online. This is just an option for those who prefer to work online.
- **FORMS** is another great tool used for quick surveys and booking details (as we did for Team Talks last year). Clint wrote and posted a Survey to all Digital Champions and added the link to our Yammer site instant! No more need for Survey Monkey.
- **SKYPE FOR BUSINESS** can be used for group calls and chats, presentation sharing and screen recording. Please contact the GSC to gain registration.

MICROSOFT 365 - WHAT TO DO NEXT

- SHAREPOINT within your business or functional area, talk with your manager and colleagues about how best to design the folder structure to save files relevant to your business/function.
 YAMMER create a Group for your part of the business if it doesn't already exist eg Readymix, Cement, Aggregates, Asphalt, HR, Planning etc. Make it an open group and use this to post news, opinions, blogs and updates for all to see. Some Groups are already established
- 2. **GET HELP FROM YOUR LOCAL DIGITAL CHAMPION** there are 91 Digital Champion volunteers in our business who have started the process of learning how best to use the new 365 tools and share with their colleagues

WHEN TO USE SHIFT

Shift is still available although it is not being actively developed for the future. The plan is for all Shift information to migrate into an Employee Portal using 365, and this is being developed at a global level



by Central Process & IT, Central HR and Central Communications. It is planned for launch in Minimal Viable Product stage by late 2018.

The use of UK Communities in Shift for blogs, news, updates has now slowed – please use Yammer groups in the future.

Until the new Employee Portal is established, Shift is still the portal to access the following items:

- SERVICES eg all UK policies, Payslips, IVCs, Career Development, Success Factors, Learn and Grow, ETHOS, Absence & Holidays
- POLICY CENTRE all global policies
- CORPORATE MESSAGES eg Our Global Voice
- GLOBAL NETWORKS those who are involved will be aware of these
