It is a concern to have to report our second Recordable Injury (TRI) in as many weeks. An employee on one of our sites suffered a double fracture to his thumb, when he tried to steady himself as he stumbled forwards; a contract tanker driver had asked for help with a loading issue, unfortunately the employee fell as he turned to go back up the plant steps at the loading spout.

When considered alongside the increase in high potential near misses we have seen in the last few weeks, it is apparent that we need to ensure we are all following the Safety Essentials at all times, taking time to STOP, THINK & CHECK before starting any new task, and always reporting near misses and hazards so action can be taken to prevent future injuries. We wish our colleague a speedy recovery.

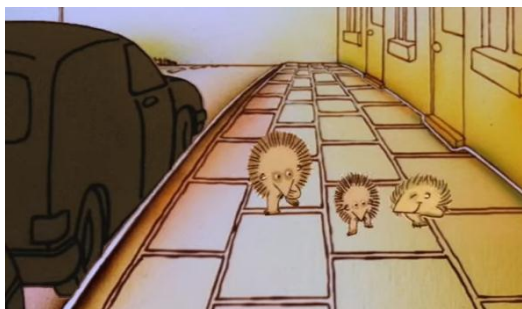

With school holidays behind us now – let's have a look at some Travel Safety Trips for BACK TO SCHOOL

BACK TO SCHOOL TRAVEL SAFETY TIPS

For Parents who drive children to school:

- Make sure all children and adults in the car are buckled up.
- Obey the speed limits, do not pass other vehicles, change lanes, or make U-turns near the school.
- Watch for pedestrians, especially children who are walking, biking, or waiting at bus stops. Children often are unpredictable, and they tend to ignore hazards and take risks.

For Children who take the school bus:

- Arrive early at the bus stop and stay away from the road while waiting.
- Remain seated at all times and keep your arms and heads inside the windows while on the bus.
- When exiting the bus, walk, don't run and if possible use a designated crossing point,
- If a crossing point is not available, cross in front of the school bus, but only after establishing eye contact with the school bus driver.

For Children who walk or ride their bike:

- Parents should walk with their children until they know the route and can do it safely.
- Children should take the same route every day, and go directly to school or directly home.
- Ideally, children should travel to and from school with a friend.
- Parents should teach children to obey traffic signals, to use crosswalks (supervised by a school crossing guard where available), and never to cross the street from behind parked cars, etc.
- If cycling to school, children should always wear hi visibility clothing and a cycling helmet.



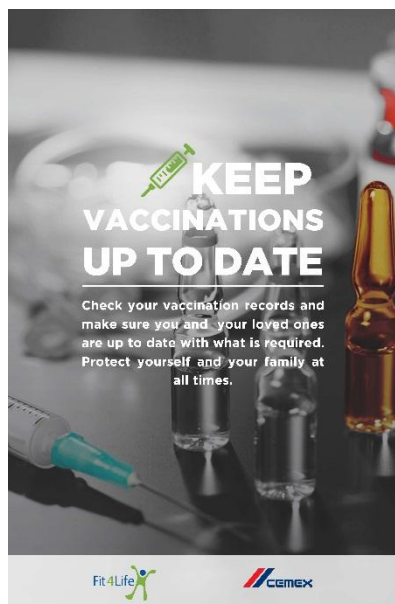

Believe it or not it's time to think about a flu jab



Winter Flu Vaccinations

Well, the 1st September brought with it the first day of Autumn! So why not be prepared and go and get your flu jab.

Flu is an unpredictable virus that can cause mild or unpleasant illness in most people. It can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying health condition.

Over time, protection from the injected flu vaccine gradually decreases and flu strains often change. So new flu vaccines are produced each year, which is why people who are advised to have the flu jab need it every year too.

So, now is the time of year when people are advised to have a vaccination jab to help protect from or reduce the symptoms of flu. Some people in the higher risk categories get the immunisation free via the NHS. For others the jab is widely available through local pharmacies or local GP's. As usual, CEMEX will reimburse the cost of the vaccination for those that are not entitled to a free jab. All that

employees have to do is provide their line manager with an itemised receipt and they will arrange for you to be reimbursed the cost of up to a maximum of £20.

Flu jab side effects

Serious side effects of the injected flu vaccine are very rare. You may have a mild fever and aching muscles for a couple of days after having the jab, and your arm may be a bit sore where you were injected.

There is also evidence to suggest that the flu jab can reduce your risk of having a stroke.

As well as flu vaccinations, you should make sure all your 'jabs' are up to date; not only those you had as a child, but if you are planning to travel abroad. Ask your doctor which vaccines are right for you.

Please display the Health Essential Poster and brief your teams in the importance of keeping vaccinations up to date.

New CEMEX Go Readymix Functionality



Work faster & smarter.

From September 10th we will have two new functions in CEMEX Go which will help improve Adoption and give a more superior customer experience –

Quotation Request – this enhances current Job Site request, enabling customers to state volume and mix requirements.

Our response will be to return a quotation within 30 minutes (currently 3 hours with the Job Site request). Customers will be able to accept or reject the quotation and if accepted a contract will be created straight away against which orders can be placed. If rejected we will need to call the Customer back. Location request will remain in order to keep active history locations.

Repeat Order - allows Customers to repeat an order for same Job Site but with flexibility of changing things like date, time, quantity. This works the same as Repeat Order on the Track App so is limited to the same mix line on the contract. Please remember the importance of prompt responses to request for prices from the Field Sales Teams.

efficiency and downtime issues.

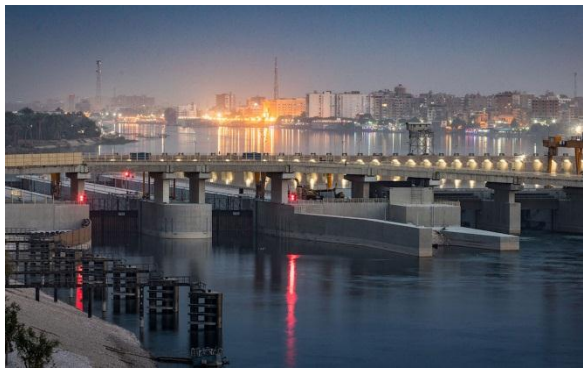
