Stay Wider Of The Rider



Did you know more than a third of people killed or seriously injured on UK roads are those travelling by bike?

Cyclists and motorcyclists are among the most vulnerable road users in the UK, with more than 100 riders injured every day in needless, preventable crashes. The dangers (and opportunities) posed by bicycles and motorcycles are distinct but those on two wheels are united by the urgent need to reduce their risk of death and injury on our roads.

Cycling is one of the healthiest, cheapest and most environmentally-friendly forms of transport available with the benefits to health, congestion and the economy and the number of us taking to our bicycles each year is increasing at a rapid pace.

19th – 25th November is Road Safety Week sponsored by the road safety charity 'Brake', with the focus about the safety of those on two wheels and encouraging everyone to be **Bike Smart**.

CEMEX are supporting the week by running a 'Stay Wider of The Rider' campaign; developed by the London Cycling Campaign in partnership with Continental Tyres. The campaign gives advice on how we all can give riders a safe distance when overtaking with specific guidance at various speeds. The campaign is endorsed by the triathlete brothers, Alistair and Jonny, who share a comedy clip about not getting too close.

Great Britain Safe But Could Be Safer.....



The HSE recently released Great Britain's annual injury and ill health statistics. Here is a summary of their findings:

Too many workers in Britain's workplaces are still being injured or made ill by their work a new report shows.

Annual statistics from the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) show 1.4 million workers were suffering from work-related ill health and around 555,000 from non-fatal injuries in 2017/18.

The annual statistics, compiled by HSE from the Labour Force Survey (LFS) and other sources, cover work-related ill health, workplace injuries, working days lost, costs to Britain and enforcement action taken.

Despite Britain continuing to be one of the safest places to work, key figures for Great Britain show that in 2017/18 there were:

- 144 fatal injuries at work
- 1.4 million working people suffering from a work-related illness
- 30.7 million working days lost due to work-related illness and workplace injury
- 493 cases were prosecuted and resulted in a conviction. Fines from convictions totalled £72.6 million

Workplace injury and new cases of ill health cost Britain £15.0 billion a year with 30.7 million working days lost. There have been no significant changes in the industries in which workers are most likely to be injured by their work, with construction and agriculture among the higher risk sectors.

These figures confirm the scale of the challenge HSE faces in making Britain a healthier and safer place to work and shows that there are still areas to improve on to prevent death, injury and ill health in the workplace.

Martin Temple, HSE Chair, said of the findings: "These figures should serve as a reminder to us of the importance to manage risk and undertake good health and safety practice in the work place. Great Britain's health and safety record is something we should all be proud of, but there is still much to be done to ensure that every worker goes home at the end of their working day safe and healthy. Collectively we must take responsibility to prevent these incidents that still affect too many lives every year and continue to all play our part in Helping Great Britain Work Well."

Aggregate's Just Ci programme rewards sites for the best ideas. Well done to Angerstein Wharf (the

second consecutive time they have won!), and Taffs Well Quarry and Hatfield Quarry for winning the last two monthly JUSTCi Best Ideas competitions.



Brief descriptions follow:

Angerstein Wharf - trialled reintroducing silt into their sand products after the wash cycle is complete. The successful trial showed they could keep within their Customer Specifications and has the added benefits of:

- Savings on flocculant chemical.
- Savings on running the silt press, pumps and motors.

- Savings on not paying the cost of sending to landfill.
- Increase in volume produced more finished product.
- Less fuel used on mobile plant to load trucks/double handle stock.

Taffs Well Quarry - installed a walkway to the Primary Crusher which not only makes it much safer to walk to the equipment but also increases production volumes during scheduled running and reduce the amount of Non-Value Added 'Motion' waste to rectify issues.

Hatfield Quarry - have installed a Rubble Chute to safely guide spillage that was falling onto the walkway below and significantly improve staff morale.

The UK has also performed brilliantly in the Global Ideas competition where we are leading the way with monthly winners!

Congratulations to Maurice Burrell and the team at Middleton Quarry for their BAP (biodiversity) report. Sean Cassidy, Regional Environmental Manager, commented: "A massive improvement from last year. Biodiversity Index Score has gone from 45 in 2017 to 218 for 2018. This is due to better record keeping and an improved habitat rating (due to the presence of rare species). The Quarry managed to hit the species 100 target – with 101 species spotted!" The Quarry has done well to help preserve a habitat that sustains some rare species.

30 Years Thumbs Up For Rob Greenfield!!



This week we caught up with family man, Rob Greenfield, UK Planning and Development Manager, as he celebrates 30 years service with the company. Now based in the Rugby Office, Rob has worked in many different roles and at various locations. He has always focused on a positive balance between working hard and playing hard with his three children. He is physically active, competing in half-marathons, steeplechases and triathlons, often with his family too.

Rob's moved around a lot since joining RMC in 1988 – his children were all born in different counties! Originally from Newport South Wales where he met his wife Ruth,

Rob joined RMC's Wales region in 1988 as a placement from his IT college. Based out of Bridgend office he worked on daily stock control and collated concrete cube test results. When a brand-new lab facility was built at Bridgend he became the Lab Supervisor, and this showpiece technical facility attracted visits from local technical colleges. Rob helped facilitate and teach the visitors and soon realised he had a natural flair for training and development.

In 1998 RMC developed its Thorpe HQ into an International Training Centre and he successfully applied to become Technical Training Manager which meant a house move to Reading, Berkshire. He remembers on his first day arriving two hours late after leaving home at 6.30 am - a rude welcome to the congested south-east motorway network. Over the next five years Rob and his team hosted hundreds of training courses for employees throughout the country – they built a centre of training excellence for the industry.



A reorganisation in 2003 saw Rob move into the Technical team as a Trainer which meant another relocation to Rugby where he lives now. The next period was quite turbulent with Project Rock, the acquisition of RMC by CEMEX, and the need to standardise systems to the CEMEX Way. Rob grasped the opportunity and has worked in training and development in the human resources team since 2008.

Rob has valued the diversity of roles offered during his three decades of service – he was always encouraged to try new challenges, often

in at the deep end, but fully supported by his line manager. He's proud to have survived through three major recessions and has enjoyed the diverse opportunities within our large global organisation. He loves getting into the detail and doing something well.
