Stay Focused On Zero Harm



As we finish the first quarter of the year it is encouraging to see a reduction in our most serious injuries across Europe, with Lost Time Injuries down from 8 to 3, compared to the same period last year, and Total Recordable Injuries down from 21 to 16.

In the UK we have maintained an LTI free start to the year, whereas at this stage last year we had already suffered 2 LTIs. Unfortunately, we have not seen the same reduction in TRIs where we have reported 6 this year, the same as the first quarter of 2018.

Hopefully we can continue to build on the overall improving trend... we have seen from the high potential incidents we have suffered this year that at times we have been relying on luck to keep us safe, something we cannot afford to do if we are to deliver on our ZERO harm commitment.

Isolation Procedures Safety Alert



With many sites continuing to review isolation procedures in line with current Improvement Plans the Safety Alert attached to this document or in the download section of the UK News website describes a recent Near Miss incident in Related Businesses, is a good reminder of the need to ensure isolation procedures consider all potential hazards/risks.

While there were no injuries in this incident, it is easy to envisage how the gap in the procedures and breakdown in communications could so easily have led to tragedy.

Where operations have hoppers, etc. that are fed by trucks/mobile plant, site teams must ensure robust isolation procedures are in place, detailing what measures are required to prevent materials being discharged where maintenance is ongoing.

SS Explorer Preservation



I am Allan Dickson, a Second Engineer onboard the CEMEX dredger, Sand Fulmar. When on leave I volunteer with the SS Explorer Preservation Society, a charity which is preserving and aims to restore the ex-fishery research ship, Explorer.

The Explorer is a historically significant ship, one of the last ten ships to be built by Alexander Hall & Co before the company was taken over, and the last Alexander Hall ship to have a British

built steam reciprocating engine fitted. The Explorer was also Scotland's first purpose-built fishery research ship. The ship is listed on the national Historic Ship Register.



We plan to restore the vessel to a working museum, moored alongside in Leith and open to the public and for the use of the local community as a small event and

conference venue and educational resource.

Spot The Species 2019



Last year 13 of our sites reached the 100 species spotted mark for our 'Species 100' initiative. Cambusmore in Scotland was the most biodiverse site with Raynes quarry in North Wales the most improved.

We spotted rare flowers, butterflies, farmland birds, a Hen Harrier (Britain's rarest raptor) and rare mammals such as Pine Martens and Red Squirrels. The reports are extremely useful for CEMEX and the RSPB to develop site action plans.

Sean Cassidy, Regional Environmental Manager, is launching the initiative again this year. He is asking us to list the species you see on site and put it in your site report.

EFFECTIVE ISOLATION – HOPPER MAINTENANCE

DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT

As part of planned maintenance, contractors were repairing a conveyor belt under a hardstone feed bin. A loading shovel operator had been instructed to load the bins but mistakenly loaded the wrong set.

Whilst the contractors were not working in the line of fire, the noise from the discharge of material startled those in the area and caused them to leave the area hastily.



KEY FINDINGS

- Despite verbal instructions given to all members of staff onsite at the time, there was a miscommunication which led to the incorrect bins being loaded.
- The requirement for a physical barrier had not been identified in the isolation cards; risk assessment; worksafe or permit to work.


HOW COULD THIS HAVE BEEN AVOIDED?

Through the use of a physical barrier, cordoning off the working area and appropriate signage.

KEY REVIEW POINTS

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- Ensure isolation cards consider controls for all forms of energy, including physical barriers to control mobile plant material handling.
- Ensure Worksafes carried out at point of work, consider all forms of energy and traffic management.
- Clear communication and team briefings.



Don't let anyone act unsafely, always stop unsafe practices.

Isolation Procedures

Never work on live or moving machinery – always 'lock out'.

Safe Systems

Follow safe systems of work, site rules, signage and traffic signals.



Incident/Hazard alerts

Report all incidents/hazards immediately.
