### **Lest We Forget**



### Fit And Alert, Don't Drive Tired.....



This is the second week of our Driving Essentials Campaign 'Fit and Alert' and this week we are looking at Driver Fatigue and the danger of driving tired.

Fatigue is a major contributory factor in crashes, with too little sleep radically affecting driver attention, awareness, reaction time and ability to control the vehicle. Studies have found that up to one in six crashes resulting in death or injury on major roads are fatigue-related; unlike alcohol and drugs, police can't test for tiredness.

Peak times for fatigue-related crashes are within the hours of 2.00am-6.00am and 2.00pm-4.00pm when drivers are naturally more tired.

About 40% of fatigue-related crashes involve commercial vehicle drivers.

Please discuss and share these materials with your teams and remember that driving is something most of us undertake – not just our truck drivers. The poster is at the end of this UK News or in the download section on the website.

### **Look After Your Hands**



Whilst there were no Lost Time or Reportable Injuries for Europe West Materials last week, over the weekend a contractor driver in Spain suffered an injury to his hand which required three stitches.

At this stage it appears that, while washing down his truck after delivering a load of concrete, the driver trapped his finger between the chute and wash container. An investigation is underway to establish the causes of the

incident and how we may avoid future injuries while carrying out this activity.

### **CEMEX-Tec Award Receives 600 Proposals From More Than 30 Countries**



CEMEX announced that it would continue to accept high-impact project proposals in sustainable development from entrepreneurs and social innovators from all over the world until 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019, after receiving more than 600 proposals to date.

Since the award's inception, the CEMEX-Tec de Monterrey Centre for Sustainable Development has received 2,700 registered proposals from 44 countries in America, Europe, Africa, and Asia, from which 99 projects won awards benefiting 73 communities through social enterprises.

### **CEMEX Signs Final Agreement To Divest Aggregates And Readymix Assets In Germany**



CEMEX announced recently that it has signed the final agreement to sell its Aggregates and Readymix assets in the North and North-West regions of Germany to GP Günter Papenburg AG for approximately €87 million. CEMEX currently expects to close this divestment during the second quarter of 2019.

The assets in Germany being divested consist of 4 Aggregates quarries and 4 Readymix facilities in North Germany, and 9 Aggregates quarries and 14 Readymix facilities in North-West Germany.

The proceeds expected to be obtained from this divestment will be used mainly for debt reduction and for general corporate purposes.

### **Information Safety**



This is to let you know about a new initiative to ensure the security of our information in line with our policies.

During May 2019, we will introduce Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA), which will improve safe access to CEMEX data and institutional applications. It requires a second form of authentication when

accessing your CEMEX account via your mobile devices or personal PC.

In the next few days you will receive an email from <u>CEMEX Collaboration Services</u> and/or <u>CEMEX Security Culture</u> with further instructions to configure the parameters in your Office 365 portal account, as well as instructions to download and setup the MFA process. There are three different options you will be provided as your primary way to confirm your access: Mobile application, SMS Text Msg or phone landline.

It is mandatory to comply and follow this policy to guarantee access to your Outlook email account and Office 365 applications.

If you have any questions or experience any problems during the installation process, please contact the local GSC/Helpdesk.

### **Get Healthy And Cycle To Work**



CEMEX has been supporting the Cycle to Work Scheme for a number of years and the 2019 'window' will open on 13 May until 12 June.

Cycling to Work can have many positive benefits as long as you put SAFETY first so we would advise anybody considering the Cycle to Work Scheme to ensure that they are a competent cyclist before setting out on busy roads and that they have the proper safety equipment as advised by the Bike Store.

This is a Government Scheme that allows employees to save 32% tax and NI (for a basic taxpayer) on a new bike and accessories up to the value of £1,000.

If you are interested the first thing you need to do is select the bike you are interested in and how much you want to spend on your bike and safety equipment.

Then you need to register on the CEMEX lifestyle portal <a href="www.cemexlifestyle.co.uk">www.cemexlifestyle.co.uk</a> and follow the process to create a Hire Agreement that you will need to send to Compensation and Benefits at CEMEX House, Evreux Way, Rugby, Warwickshire, CV21 2DT.

Once the approval process is completed you will be sent your Letter of Collection which you take to your Bike Shop to exchange for your chosen bike and safety equipment. You will then start paying for your bike and safety equipment over a 12 month period from the first pay day after the process is finalised which could be July or August 2019.

CEMEX owns the bike and you are hiring the bike from CEMEX. At the end of the 12 month period you are then given a number of options which includes buying the bike at market value or continue to using the bike at no cost until the market value reaches zero and then the ownership of the bike transfers to you.

# **NEVER FORGET...STAY SAFE**

Monday 13th May is the second anniversary of the death of our colleague Jimmy Brownlie. Jimmy was 64 years old and had worked for us for over 20 years. He had come to work on the Saturday morning, but never returned home to his wife, children and grandchildren.


Jimmy was carrying out general maintenance with two workmates at West Calder Block Works. Tragically, he died when he was crushed by a block centering machine, which wasn't locked out and was activated automatically by a

It is essential we don't forget the lessons we learnt from this tragic incident...



To mark Jimmy's death, we are distributing copies of the new MPA Guide to Energy Isolation and LOTOTO (Lock-out – Tag-out – Try-out)

Please review this booklet with colleagues and have a safety conversation, as a team or one to one, to ensure your isolation procedures are robust. Some typical questions you could ask yourselves, include:



### Demonstrate the isolation process:

- Are procedures clear, accessible, understood? Do they include an authorisation process?
- Is there an isolation station with suitable equipment and individual padlocks with unique keys?
- · Are switches, valves, equipment, etc. clearly labelled?
- · Is it possible to isolate all forms of stored energy?
- · Are isolation tags displayed at each isolation point?
- · Are spare and master keys prohibited?
- Do we isolate as much of the equipment as possible, including upstream and downstream in the process?
- Is the "on" / "off" operation of the switches clear? Have we ensured switches cannot be locked in the "on" position?
- How do we "test start" the equipment to ensure isolation is effective before commencing work?
- . Where practicable is there a "Manager in Charge" lock?
- Is there a formal check to ensure equipment is in a safe condition before the isolation is removed?
