Stay Safe 2019 – Hot Weather Alert



The drowning of a 12 year old girl in the River Irwell, Greater Manchester, together with two men in their 20s being pulled from the sea off Torquay in a 24 hour period last week, has caused Police to warn of the dangers of playing or swimming in rivers, lakes and reservoirs.

With high temperatures recently, please check your site fencing, signage, safety devices and security arrangements at both operational and non-operational sites. The MPA (Mineral Products Association) also recommend you check your public safety risk assessments are up to date for both operational and non-operational sites.

Eight members of the public drowned in UK quarry lakes last year (none of them CEMEX owned) seven of which were in disused sites not in industry ownership. Most of these deaths occurred during periods of warm weather.

Trip/Fall LTI At Rugby Plant



Unfortunately, we suffered an employee LTI in Rugby Cement Plant when an employee parked his fork lift truck (FLT) tight up against a stack of palleted bagged cement (out of view of direct CCTV). This location is not a designated parking area and the employee failed to reverse park, positioning his vehicle in a blind spot. On exiting the

vehicle, the employee has reported that he tripped over a scaffold clip, injuring his right foot which resulted in a fracture of the 5th Metatarsal bone. There were no witnesses to the incident. We will share all learnings of the incident when investigation finishes.

With this incident we are closing June with two LTIs having now a total of four year to date, all of them in last two months. We need to reverse this trend quickly and come back to the performance we had in the first four months of the year, focusing all of us in Safety Essentials and showing a strong Safety Leadership making progress with our improvement plans that we have defined.

Remember it is up to everyone to STEP IN if they see anything unsafe.

Focus On Contractor Safety

This third quarter we are launching a campaign focusing on contractor's safety. Statistically, during Q3 there is an increase of contractors incidents and to avoid this trend we will focus some safety activities on them. Last year this was done with a success, for this reason we are going to repeat the same this year. This is a CEMEX global campaign.

During this three months we are going to increase our VFL tours with contractors, targeting between 50% - 75% of total VFL in this period. This will help us to be closer to these workers and understand and address better their safety issues.



What price do I pay?

For **aggregates** produced in the local area, the price will be from £6/t. This cost does not include VAT and haulage, which will need to be added to each order.

For **readymix concrete**, **screed and mortar**, prices begin at £50/m³, with VAT and haulage also payable.

Are there any limitations to the amount I can order?
