#### **Europe Now A Safety Hot Spot**



Worryingly the European region is now a safety hot spot after having 5 LTIs in the last 11 weeks after 4 months LTI free.

Sergio has asked that we all have a safety stand down across our operations to re-focus. Everyone has a responsibility to STEP IN and prevent unsafe behavior at all times. Please redouble your efforts and ask your Line Manager when you are having your stand down.

Unfortunately, we had an employee LTI in Croatia, Sv Kajo Cement plant last week. Last Thursday a Shift Supervisor went into the kiln to supervise employees during a coating demolition. At one moment he walked over demolished material and he slipped. The fall resulted in a bone displacement on his left foot and he

needs 3 weeks off work. A full investigation is on-going to share learnings of this incident.

#### **Contractor Safety Leaflet**



The Contractor Safety Campaign is ongoing in across Europe. VFL tours are going on and there is a new leaflet to share key facts and messages about Contractor's safety (see download section of the UK News website or Yammer). Please download it and use it in your operations.

We need to remember that, 5 of the 12 (42%) fatalities within CEMEX in 2018 were contractors. We all have an opportunity to show our personal health and safety leadership by regularly discussing Health and Safety with contractors, ensuring they

work safely and taking the time to Step IN if we see something we believe may be unsafe.

#### **Mental Health Support Line**




Sales Executive, Erin Frank, gave this feedback about the recent mental health training programme being run from the Rugby office:

#### A Sacrificial Ham Sandwich



Long server and history lover, Dennis Atkinson, came across an unusual find in Pallett Hill quarry's dig last week when an Altar stone and a number of animal bones from the Roman occupation of the British Isles were unearthed.

West Yorkshire Archaeological Services (WYAS) tell us that the artefact is at least 1,600 years old and was thought to be used in sacrificial rituals.



It initially stood at the edge of a lake which the nearby Roman Marching Camp used to draw water from. After confirming with a metal detector that there were no gold coins buried around the area, Pallett Hill staff assembled around the altar and sacrificed a ham sandwich to the Quarry Gods in hope of a plentiful harvest of sand and gravel in the coming months.

The altar is now on its way back to WYAS' high tech lab to be cleaned up, and to determine if the Latin inscriptions on the altar can be decrypted.

In the past 3 years, 37 Contractor Drivers have been involved in fatalities worldwide while working for CEMEX.

Common causes include: speeding, traveling too close to vehicles in front, vehicle maintenance, not concentrating – especially near pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists.

In the past 3 years, 11 Contractors working on CEMEX sites around the world have been involved in fatal incidents.

Common causes include: being in the line of fire, not following the rules/procedures, procedures not in place, not isolating machinery/equipment.

At CEMEX, each of us is responsible for ensuring that all Drivers and Contractors return safely to their homes every day.

Contractors provide many benefits for CEMEX and are a critical part of our business. Everyone has a part to play in ensuring that all employees and contractors return home safely each and every day.



Let's do it. All together.

#### **Contractors have to be effectively** managed at all times

#### **ALWAYS APPLY THE FOLLOWING:**

- 1. Only use approved and qualified contractors
- 2. If relevant, check individual qualifications before starting work
- 3. Provide an appropriate formal site-specific induction to all Contractors prior to them starting work
  - 4. Ensure the job is properly planned and correct controls are in place. Review their safe method of work and risk assessment
  - 5. Check that they have the correct PPE and safe tools & equipment
- Issue a formal Permit to Work for relevant activities
  - 7. Closely monitor Contractors for the duration of their work
- 8. STOP the works if Contractors are not working safely. **Every CEMEX employee is authorized** to do so if there is imminent risk of injury
- 9. Recognize positive H&S performance and behaviors
  - 10. Have a formal handover of the job and provide feedback about their performance
