Remember to Get a Grip in Winter...



Slips, Trips and Falls incidents are our main concern at this time of year especially. As the winter season is starting please prepare carefully to minimize the risks:

- **Grit Salt** Readily available, with arrangements and equipment in place for clearing walkways, etc. as appropriate
- **De-icer** Stocks available to ensure good all round visibility can be maintained on vehicles at all times
- **Walkways** Demarcated, well-lit, free from trip hazards and standing water
- Housekeeping Work areas kept clear and tidy at all times
- Footwear In good condition, with suitable grip
- Get a Grip Hold the handrail on steps and stairways and check the surrounding area when stepping down from vehicles
- **Frost Protection** Minimise the effects of frost on production sites, draining down equipment, using lagging, trace heating, etc.

Latest Safety Alerts



Please ensure that you and your teams have seen the latest Safety Alerts and followed the link to our latest Video Safety Alert.

It would be appreciated if you would review the Alerts and, where they are relevant, discuss them in detail with your teams.

One alert outlines an injury to a contract forklift operator while staking bulk bags; where comparable operations take place on sites, racking systems similar to that detailed in the Alert should be considered a requirement.

The other alert details an incident where a remote control defect caused a mobile conveyor to move unexpectedly, both ourselves and a competitor have experienced fatal incidents with similar equipment in the past; it is essential operators of this type of equipment are trained in the safe system of work intended to keep everyone out of the line of fire, and these systems are enforced.

Finally, the Video Safety Alert relates to a High Potential incident in our operations earlier this year, where a truckmixer driver slipped and fell as he got out of his cab. We are encouraging site teams to use the Alert, not only as a reminder of the need to Get A Grip on steps and stairways, but also to consider lone working arrangements, particularly for Drivers, and more generally the importance of following the Safety Essentials and Stepping In if we see anything we believe may be unsafe.

Winter Flu Vaccinations



With temperatures dropping as we go further into October why not be prepared and go and get your flu jab?

Flu is an unpredictable virus that can cause mild or unpleasant illness in most people. It can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying health condition.

Over time, protection from the injected flu vaccine gradually decreases and flu strains often change. So new flu vaccines are produced each year, which is why people advised to have the flu jab need it every year too.

So now is the time of year when people are advised to have a vaccination jab to help protect from or reduce the symptoms of flu. Some people in the higher risk categories get the immunisation free via the NHS. For others the jab is widely available through local pharmacies or local GP's. **As usual, CEMEX will reimburse the cost of the vaccination for those that are not entitled to a free jab. All**

employees have to do is provide their line manager with an itemised receipt and they will arrange for you to be reimbursed the cost of up to a maximum of £20.

Flu jab side effects

Serious side effects of the injected flu vaccine are very rare. You may have a mild fever and aching muscles for a couple of days after having the jab, and your arm may be a bit sore where you were injected.

There is also evidence to suggest that the flu jab can reduce your risk of having a stroke.

As well as flu vaccinations, you should make sure all your 'jabs' are up to date; not only those you had as a child, but if you are planning to travel abroad. Ask your doctor which vaccines are right for you. Please display the Health Essential Poster and brief your teams in the importance of keeping vaccinations up to date.

Never forget



Next Monday, 28th October, marks the eighth anniversary of the death of Joanna Braithwaite, a cyclist who died as she cycled to work at the local church in a collision with a truckmixer that was working on our behalf. This tragic incident deeply affected those local to the operations at the time and for many years later.

The investigation into the incident identified a number of learning points, including the need to ensure dashboards are kept clear so as to maximise the driver's field of view...Sadly, recent media reports of a court case following a similar fatality involving a Doctor, Suzanna Bull, highlight the importance of never forgetting the learning points from previous incidents.

Both incidents are summarised in a recent safety alert email from Andy Taylor. Please take a moment with your team to review these incidents, consider the consequences for the family and friends who lost loved

ones, and encourage everyone to speak up and **STEP IN** if they see any examples of drivers windscreens being obscured.

Have your health and well-being check up

For several years CEMEX UK has offered well-being tests on health alongside the legally required health surveillance. As well as ensuring that work does not impact on health and that employees are fit to carry

out their duties without harm; the well-being checks offer individuals a wider range of health checks that are an indicator of general health.

The personal health reports that employees receive will indicate if there is any potential medical issue which requires further investigation by their GP.

Over the last few years we have had employees telling us that having these checks has highlighted an issue which they were previously unaware of helping them get early effective treatment.



A couple of our drivers have chosen to share their stories to encourage their colleagues to look after their health and take up health checks when they are offered.

Remember, all medical information is confidential between the healthcare provider and the individual, CEMEX do not receive any personal information.

Marine leaders in Business programme




