UK Health And Safety Incident Performance 2019 - A Record Year




Andy Taylor gave this brief summary of the health and safety incidents across the UK last year. In summary, we made another significant step towards ZERO4Life performance:

- No recordable fatalities
- Just one employee Lost Time Injury (LTI), something we only achieved once before, back in 2013; we mustn't however overlook the three contractor LTIs!
 - Employee LTI frequency rate of 0.2, within the challenging CEMEX Global target
- Total Recordable Injuries (TRIs) reduced by 26% compared with 2018, employee TRIs down from 11 to 7 and contractor TRIs down from 8 to 7
- We achieved our lowest Employee TRI Frequency Rate on record!

Thanks go to everyone for continuing to Look After Themselves and Each Other during a time of significant change. Hopefully, under the leadership of the National Health and Safety Committee, and with everyone's support we can continue to build on this improving trend.



It's Friendly February





I Declare This Dry Discharge System Officially Open!



The new £3.8million dry discharge system at CEMEX's Northfleet Wharf in Kent has been officially opened. We partnered with the Port of London Authority (PLA) on the investment, which will ensure a more sustainable and flexible operation.



Following this investment CEMEX's marine dredgers, which bring sand and gravel from CEMEX's licensed offshore locations in the North Sea and the

English Channel into Northfleet, will be able to arrive fully laden for the first time. This will increase capacity of the site by approximately 350,000 tonnes per year to between 800,000 and 850,000 tonnes. This will allow us to provide more material to our on-site building products plant, reducing the need for Aggregates to be transported in from other locations. This offers considerable sustainability benefits, as every dredger load reduces the need for 250 lorries on the region's busy roads.

Prior to this investment, the wharf at Northfleet was the only wet discharge system remaining in CEMEX's UK portfolio, and was prone to blockages and limited the products and capacity that could be brought into site. The new dry discharge system will increase the reliability and flexibility of the wharf, reducing the risk of blockages and ensuring ships can bring in exactly the right materials needed. The site can therefore better balance stocks and ensure quality, providing CEMEX's customers with an improved service.



Laurence Dagley, CEMEX UK Materials South's Managing Director, said: "We are grateful for our positive relationship with the PLA, and thankful for their support. Not only will this investment allow us to better serve the London market, opening up opportunities for growth and securing the future of the wharf, but it also promises a considerable sustainability benefit by taking trucks off the road.

CEMEX's UK strategy focuses on London and the other metropolitan markets across the country, as we believe increasing urbanisation will drive greater demand growth in these markets. It is therefore vital that our sites in these areas are developed to ensure they can support this strategy.



Thanks to the funding from PLA, we have been able to invest our own resources into other assets, such as CEMEX Go Innovation, our state-of-the-art marine dredger which will arrive in the UK later this year."

Robin Mortimer, PLA Chief Executive, said: "This investment is central to our long-term Thames Vision work to maximise the use of tidal river between Teddington and the coast, for both freight and passenger transport."

Local MP, Adam Holloway, attended the opening event, commenting: "It is genuinely an honour to cut the ribbon on this wonderful project, which is such a great collaboration between the PLA and CEMEX. The river has always been a mainstay of Gravesham's economy and this very welcome new investment. It's also contributing towards the work the nation needs to undertake to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2050."

CEMEX A-Class On Climate Change Transparency And Action



The CDP (formerly Carbon Disclosure Project) raised its rating of CEMEX from B in 2018 to A- in 2019 for our company's commitment to climate protection. The rating upgrade reflects our global improvement in governance, risk management, CO2 emissions reduction initiatives, low carbon products, and value chain engagement.

To date, at a global level, we have reduced our direct CO2 emissions per ton of cementitious product by more

than 22% compared to the 1990 baseline, allowing the company to avoid approximately 8million tons of CO2 during 2019, equivalent to the carbon emissions of 1.6 million passenger vehicles.

In Europe last year alone, we reduced our CO2 compared to the year before equivalent to taking around 65,000 cars off the road.

We are taking the following steps to further reduce our direct CO2 emissions:

- Producing new types of low CO2 clinker, cement, and concrete products
- Increasing our use of alternative fuels as a substitute for fossil fuels



- Using waste from other industries as alternative raw materials as a substitute for clinker
- Expanding and protecting natural carbon sinks from our El Carmen Nature Reserve to all of our quarries
- Developing and testing disruptive technologies like carbon capture, utilization, and storage (CCUS) and other innovative carbon technologies

We are also determined to reduce indirect CO2 emissions from electricity through the company's use of renewable energy. Close to 30% of CEMEX's global power consumption is covered by renewable energy sources, the highest rate among global cement companies.

As climate and sustainability continue to rise on the Agenda, in the coming weeks and months, we have some exciting developments in our region and wider company regarding our climate commitments, so watch this space as there is more news to come.....

Breedon Divestment Update



Since we announced that CEMEX will sell part of its UK business to Breedon Group plc, we have been working hard to verify which employees will transfer to Breedon. We have now completed this exercise and 632 employees have been advised that they will automatically become Breedon employees when the sale completes, which we expect to be in early Q2.

In addition, 11 employees who will stay with CEMEX have been advised that their work location will be sold to Breedon, which means that we need to find them another office to work from. Between now and when the sale completes we will consult with both groups of employees.

Preparations for the nomination and election of Employee Representatives are now underway, so that we can begin consultation later this month. Given the large number of people involved, we will run three consultation groups.

Each group will have its own consultation meetings, but all three will run in parallel, so that the first meetings for each group will take place w/c 24th February, the second meetings 3rd March etc. Each consultation group is divided into constituencies (groups of employees) and each constituency will

have its own Employee Representative who will represent the employees in their constituency at consultation meetings.

We plan to get these meetings underway as soon as possible so that we can provide information and answer questions. We will also continue to keep everyone updated about the consultation process and the planned sale, with regular updates in UK News.
