Decision To Furlough Certain Members Of Staff



Since the outbreak of the Coronavirus pandemic we have closely monitored the impact on our business in the UK. During the last two weeks in particular, customer demand for our materials has dropped in almost all areas of the business and very significantly in a number of markets. Unfortunately, we do not see this situation improving in the short term and with the ongoing uncertainty created by the Coronavirus pandemic it has now become necessary to temporarily close a large number of our operational sites.

The company has carefully considered its options and we intend to take advantage of a new Government backed Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme. In doing so, we hope to be best placed to quickly resume operations when demand picks up again, whilst keeping jobs secure in the meantime. The Scheme enables CEMEX to place employees on 'furlough', which is a temporary period of leave, to help us deal with the fact that there is no work or less work available at this time due to the current COVID-19 situation.

Under this scheme it is possible for employers to claim for a grant from HMRC to cover costs for each furloughed employee of 80% of salary to a maximum of £2,500 per month plus minimum pension contributions and employer National Insurance Contributions for each furloughed employee. However, CEMEX has decided to 'top-up' so that employees receive 100% basic pay, excluding overtime and other variable payments or allowances while they are on furlough leave, subject to periodic review.

All heads of UK business units have therefore reviewed the workload of those in their area, and identified which sites will need to temporarily close and those who have no or significantly less work as a result of the pandemic.

Discussions with those identified as potentially suitable for this temporary period of leave have begun and it is expected that some employees will start to be furloughed from Monday, and throughout next week.

We don't expect all employees to be furloughed and not all 'furloughed' leave will commence at the same time, as we expect it will take us longer to evaluate the need to do this in some business areas



and functions than others, and of course the situation keeps changing. All employees selected as potential candidates for furloughing will be communicated with directly by their Manager.

We would like to thank all employees for their commitment to the business. As our vital work continues, thank you to all who will carry on working at our sites and remotely for your dedication and support. We really appreciate everything you do to help our customers, and keep CEMEX UK, and our country, running.

We will continue to keep you updated on all developments in the business. Please do speak to your Line Manager if you have any concerns or questions.

Physical Distancing At Rugby Plant



The team at Rugby Cement plant have implemented excellent new processes to ensure physical distancing during induction and at the security office.

Lee Needham explains: "We have set up a new site induction process for Delivery Drivers which can be conducted by the Weighbridge Operator behind the safety of a glass window. The small room is part of the inbound weighbridge and has an internal door so there is no contact between the Driver and the Weighbridge Operator, and the Weighbridge Operator can carry out the induction in between booking in deliveries.

All induction material is pinned up on either side of the wall so both parties can refer to it. The quiz, to confirm understanding, is completed and shown through the glass before posting in a box for later filing, so no human contact is required.

We have also installed a 'Sneeze Board' in the security cabin so there is a physical Perspex barrier between visitors and security guards to minimise the chance of transferring the virus."

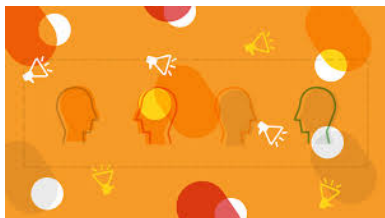
Safety Gear Donation

Harnessing Digital Tech For Our Call Handling

The RSPB reminded everyone last week that the Sand Martins are due to our quarries any day now! Back from their warm winters, ready to breed in our specially selected sand banks.

Dove Holes' Blooming Biodiversity



When it comes to biodiversity and ecology the team at Dove Holes quarry are most known for their work protecting the future of the Twite bird population (more will be happening on that front this summer!) However, they have been working to retain and improve the outcome for all wildlife at the quarry.

Many quarry sites within CEMEX have Biodiversity Action Plans (BAPs for short.) These plans take a holistic look at wildlife within the quarry and incorporate habitat and wildlife aspirations for the site, feeding into the active restoration of the quarry. Each site is reviewed annually against the actions



proposed in these plans, to gauge progress. These results are reported on and feed into CEMEX Europe.

The team at Dove Holes is doing really well against their actions; monitoring and supplementary feeding Twites, enhancing grassland by improving management. They currently manage the grassland with cattle to help the wildflowers flourish.

Limestone and Chalk Grasslands have more flowers than any other type of grassland but have declined by 94% in recent years. These grasslands in turn support specialist butterflies like Marbled Whites and numerous other invertebrates. Other actions include bird and bat boxes in the woodland fringes, with Barn Owl boxes next on the list.

However, the most spectacular result last summer was the success of the annual flower mix that was sown on limestone rubble at the back of the car park! Yep that's right, sown on rubble. Wildflowers like low nutrients and can grow in the most seemingly inhospitable places. This vivid show of colour is not just great for feeding our eyes and soul, but is a fantastic nectar source for bees, butterflies, hoverflies - invertebrates; plus, it shows that a quarry team cares about its environment.

Team Dove Holes have raised the bar and thrown down the gauntlet to other CEMEX chalk and limestone quarries that have the base rock ingredients to create fantastic habitats that are rare and declining. Their positive impact is helping CEMEX buck that trend.

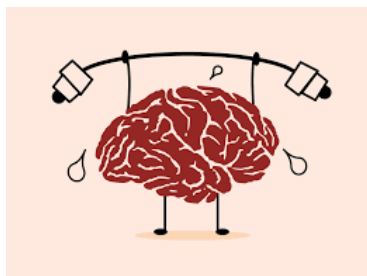

Look After Your Mental Health



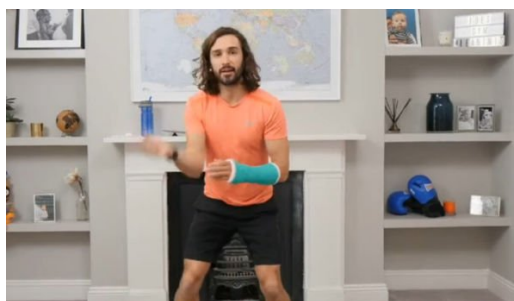

CEMEX Europe Provides Employees With Coronavirus Disinfectant



CEMEX Europe has started to produce hand disinfectants according to WHO specifications: Our company wants to make a contribution in the current crisis and meet its responsibility towards our Colleagues in Europe and Globally. Disinfectants will also be donated to local communities, and support hospitals in procuring raw materials.

Personal hygiene is one of the major weapons in the current COVID-19 pandemic, but commercial hand disinfectants are becoming increasingly scarce. “We decided to investigate whether we have the resources and know-how to produce disinfectants in-house, and fortunately we do,” says

Dietmar Vötsch, Director Mortars & Admixtures.

Marcelo Catala, **CEMEX Europe** VP of Urbanisation Solutions at **CEMEX**, emphasises: “We have extraordinary talent, creativity and expertise in our Teams; scale to leverage... and above all the determination to put our teamwork and solutions at the service of our Colleagues and the Communities in which we operate.”

The production of the new “ISOCLEAN” disinfectants is a joint effort of the Admixtures, Materials and Procurement divisions. This week, the CEMEX Admixtures plant in Salzkotten, Germany will produce sufficient quantities to cover the needs of all the approx. 10,000 CEMEX employees in Europe for the first month. The product will be delivered to all European countries with CEMEX plants. The potent disinfectant mixture is supplied in 5-litre containers together with a user manual and safety instructions. In the next two weeks Admixtures will produce a stock for six months.

Our company will also begin donating disinfectants to local communities and plans to make the disinfectants available to customers on a cost base only. In addition, some colleagues are helping pharmacies and hospitals to secure raw materials.

The Admixtures plant usually produces construction chemicals such as air-entraining agents, water reducers, concrete retarders, accelerators and superplasticisers. The facility and its staff are therefore well positioned to ensure safety and quality.

The formulations are recommended by the World Health Organisation for relatively simple, local production. ISOCLEAN WHO 1 is an alcoholic solution containing 70 to 80% ethanol. The second formulation, ISOCLEAN WHO 2, is based on 70 to 80% isopropyl alcohol. Hand disinfectants in the form of gel or liquid are particularly effective and work quickly.

CEMEX Europe’s cross-divisional team is working in close coordination with colleagues at our company’s headquarters in Mexico, in the wider EMEAA region, in the United States, and in the SCAC region. “We share our findings so that they can be leveraged by our international colleagues as quickly as possible,” explains Marcelo Catala. “We hope that our efforts will help keep our employees and our external stakeholders safe.”

CEMEX R&D, Innovation and Business Development projects are part of the global R&D collaboration network, headed by CEMEX Research Centres, based in Switzerland.



Don't Get Caught Out By A COVID Scam



According to the UK National Cyber Security Centre, cyber criminals are preying on fears of the Coronavirus and sending 'phishing' emails that try and trick users into clicking on a bad link. Once clicked, the user is sent to an untrustworthy website which could download malware onto your computer or steal passwords. The scams may claim to have a 'cure' for the virus, offer a financial reward, or be encouraging you to donate.

Like many phishing scams, these emails are preying on real-world concerns to try and trick people into doing the wrong thing.

For genuine information about the virus, please use trusted resources such as the Gov.UK, Public Health England or NHS websites.

Recent BBC research identifies the following email title examples, each aimed at evoking an emotive response in the reader, leading them to 'click' on falsified and fraudulent links:

- "Click here for a cure"
- "Covid-19 tax refund"
- "Little measure that saves"
- "The virus is now airborne"
- "Donate here to help the fight"

Our organisational response to the coronavirus pandemic is presenting a variety of challenges for us all. Please do not fall for the unscrupulous efforts of those that seek to take advantage of the issue.
