#### **Teamwork Makes Marine Work...**



It's one thing to be locked down at home with our families, but another challenge entirely for the crews on our dredgers to manage getting back to families during lockdown.

In the shipping press, and increasingly in the mainstream media, we are seeing reports of seafarers being trapped on board their vessels due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Some seafarers have now been on board their ships for over 12 months now, without seeing their families, and limited communications to keep in touch. Due to hard work and perseverance the CEMEX UK Marine team

have been able to ensure that all of our crews have managed to get home safely to see loved ones.

We have maintained our crew change schedule as far as possible throughout the pandemic, and although there have been some delays to seafarer travel due to various Government restrictions, and a reduced number of flight options, we have been working hard to do what we can to get seafarers home to their families. Members of our office based team have also worked tirelessly throughout this period to ensure that the right balance is maintained offshore.

Capt. Matt Bland, Fleet Safety and Development Master, commented: "As seafarers, we are used to problem solving, and as Ernest Shackleton, Master Mariner, said "Difficulties are just things to overcome, after all."

This week we are pleased to be able to report that there are now no seafarers on board company vessels who are overdue going on leave. The company appreciates the patience and cooperation of all our seafarers during this constantly evolving situation."

Kurt Cowdry, Director CEMEX UK Marine, added: "We have constantly reinforced the need to keep doing the basics and doing them well, COVID-19 is only one thing that we need to manage. The Masters and Senior Officers of each ship have been fantastic, offering solutions that have always been considered.

There have been some problems along the way but as a team we have held frequent and structured calls to discuss the following: people, ship reviews, crewing, furlough, ships alongside Falcon & Fulmar, market demand and engineering.

We put these calls together to ensure that we capture and maintain the right balance for our people throughout a period that originally was a step into the unknown for all of us. Through a great demonstration of teamwork, sticking together, thinking outside of the box and working in a different way, some of what we have learnt we will keep on developing.

We have also adapted to a number of different platforms: Microsoft teams, Zoom, Skype (some of us were already familiar) but others have embraced technology and more use of Yammer, Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn. They have been difficult times but a great learning experience."





As lockdown eases and shops and hospitality businesses open up again, it is vital that we all remain vigilant to the ongoing risks of the pandemic.

It is great to have the opportunity to go out more, but we must all do what we can to keep our families and others safe so we can prevent other people from becoming ill like Jhon and his family.

To help with this, CEMEX Global has created a Playbook focused on our time away from work. This Playbook utilises the four behaviours that save lives, which have been **well-adopted throughout the business and are now in place at our CEMEX sites.** 

It's key that outside of work, we all use the same four behaviours with our family and friends:

- Keep washing and sanitising your hands and maintain physical distance wherever you are.
- If you experience any **symptoms**, **stay at home in quarantine** and gain medical advice if symptoms worsen.
- Follow government guidelines on travel and if possible use your own transport – avoid planes, buses, trains and if travel is essential, take precautions and protect yourselves.



- Keep using online services if possible to avoid shops, banks, busy public spaces.
- Follow latest **government guidelines on social gatherings** with family and friends.
- Reinforce behaviours with your other family members, particularly young children and more vulnerable people.

#### **Decision on Proposed Mothballing of South Ferriby Cement Plant**



On 12<sup>th</sup> May 2020 we announced a proposal to mothball South Ferriby Cement plant. This followed analysis of our European Cement assets which identified an opportunity to reduce our operating costs and improve the utilisation of CEMEX's European Cement network through the mothballing of South Ferriby Cement plant.

We have been collectively consulting with Employee Representatives and during this process many questions have been

raised and answered and a counter proposal was submitted and examined. Individual consultations are also taking place with affected employees.

After very careful consideration of everything raised during consultation, the company has made the decision that it will mothball South Ferriby Cement plant.

Now that a firm decision has been taken, the Collective Consultation process has concluded. We would like to thank the Employee Representatives and Unite, the Union, who have worked with the business to ensure that the proposal has been subject to scrutiny and challenge.

This decision means that approximately 110 employees are at risk of redundancy and we anticipate that the majority will leave the business during July. A small number of employees will be needed during August to mothball the plant.

We would like to thank all of our colleagues at South Ferriby for their valued contribution to CEMEX and we appreciate this continues to be a very difficult time for them. CEMEX remains committed to the UK and its European business, which is one of the company's largest regions, and will continue to have a strong national presence.

## **CEMEX-Tec Award Closes its Global 2020 Call with Record Number of Entries**



The CEMEX-Tec 2020 Award announced that its 10th edition received 1,678 entries; the largest number of projects registered in the history of the event.

The CEMEX-Tec Award is celebrating its 10th anniversary, and for the third year, it opens its global call for entries with four complementary categories: Transforming Communities, Social Entrepreneurs, Community Entrepreneurship, and Collaborative Action. The Social Entrepreneurs category received the highest number of entries with 870 projects; followed by the Community Entrepreneurship category with 372 projects; Transforming Communities with 258 projects; and Collaborative Action with 178 projects.

This year, projects from 31 Mexican states were registered, for a total of 717 projects from 143 universities. In addition, 170 universities from 61 countries participated, with Colombia, the Dominican Republic, and Argentina accounting for the highest number of registrations. Likewise, the CEMEX-Tec Award continued to enjoy high participation from European countries, such as Spain, France, Germany, the United Kingdom, and the Czech Republic, among others.

Of the total number of agents of change who applied for the CEMEX-Tec Award, 51% were women and 49% were men, with an average age of 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the CEMEX-Tec Award has received entries from 5,443 projects from 90 countries, with more than 8,600 people participating in the initiative.

For the 2020 edition, the winning projects will not only receive a grant, but also participate in a twoweek virtual bootcamp called "Experience Week," which will take place from 21<sup>st</sup> September to 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Through Experience Week, participants will receive specialised training, one-on-one mentoring with international experts, cultural activities, and networking spaces with partners such as Ashoka, MassChallenge, MakeSense, Unreasonable Mexico, Impact Hub, and Sirolli Institute.

"We are very proud of the trajectory of the CEMEX-Tec Award over the past 10 years. To see the transformation of this initiative, increasing its impact and expanding its reach to projects in 90 countries that are now part of the CEMEX-Tec community," said Martha Herrera, CEMEX's Global Director of Responsible Business and Director of the CEMEX-Tec Centre for Sustainable Communities.

The CEMEX-Tec Award reaffirms its global commitment to building a better future by encouraging and promoting high-impact sustainable development proposals and projects through innovation and social entrepreneurship. 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## Back to Offices – Update on Progress



The preparation for our return to the main UK offices continues to progress well. Since our update last week, the teams have been working hard to complete the required actions and ensure our office locations are safe to use when the time is right for us to return.

#### **Rugby Office**

- Decluttering (to help keep spaces clean) is still on track to finish this month, with people currently clearing the 1<sup>st</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> floors to follow the benchmark set by the 4<sup>th</sup> floor
- Once decluttering is complete, certain teams will be reallocated to other areas of the building to ensure they have a suitable space when the office reopens
- Signs to enforce physical distancing are in place and communicate a one-way system for movement
- Sanitiser stations arrive this week, and will be in place on every floor
- A Perspex screen for the reception area is due to be installed next week
- A 'Cloud Filing' trial is being explored with the 4<sup>th</sup> floor, to manage the ongoing use of paper filing systems

- Designated managers at each site are working hard with their teams to keep plans on track

#### **Next Steps**

We are aiming to have all required work completed at each of the main offices by the end of July / early August. Once the offices are ready, a team will return to Rugby office for a short trial period of a week or two in mid-August. Every member of this team will be communicated with individually in advance of the trial to ensure they feel comfortable with the proposed return and we can take their comments into consideration.

Once the trial begins, we will be continuously talking to the team to get their feedback and make any adaptations to office operations that are needed.



Dependent on any changes to the national situation and government guidance, we are then looking to reopen offices on a managed, partial return based upon business needs from September.

Thank you again to all those who are working remotely – we appreciate that this can have its challenges. The business continues to operate well and we are grateful for your ongoing commitment, however we have identified that some teams need to return to offices to work more efficiently. We are working hard to ensure this can be done as soon as possible while ensuring the safety of our employees remains our number one priority.


