


COVID-19 Update for UK Employees | 04/09/2020

Regional Differences to Travel Corridor List

This week, the Scottish and Welsh governments decided to remove certain locations from their travel corridors list, while the English government did not. We appreciate this can lead to confusion so wanted to clarify the situation for our employees:



- From 4am on Saturday 5th September, all those in Scotland who return from Greece, Portugal and French Polynesia must self-isolate for 14 days
- From 4am today, all those in Wales who return from Portugal and the Greek islands of Mykonos, Zakynthos, Lesvos, Paros and Antiparos and Crete must self-isolate for 14 days
 - Mainland Greece is currently not subject to the quarantine restrictions
 - The Azores and Madeira islands also currently remain on the travel corridors list
- The differences between England and Scotland & Wales means that employees will need to pay attention to the restrictions at the place of their final destination, rather than the airport they fly into
- For instance – if you fly into Bristol from Crete but live in Wales, you will need to self-isolate for 14 days. If you fly into Cardiff from Portugal but reside in England, you currently do not need to self-isolate

Please ensure you are aware of the respective government guidelines for where you live and do not assume the same requirements will be in place across the UK; as we have seen throughout the pandemic, at times the four governments that make up our country will not always act in alignment.

Remember that hefty fines can be imposed on people who do not self-isolate when they are supposed to or fail to provide accurate contact details. Failure to self-isolate in accordance with the regulations also puts our families, communities and other CEMEX employees at risk and so could lead to disciplinary action.
