







How to Recognise Stress



Use of Oximeters Following COVID Diagnosis



We have been informed by our health & wellbeing advisors, New Leaf, that Oximeters may prove useful to certain people who have been diagnosed with Coronavirus.

If you or your family members test positive for the virus, and have anything but mild symptoms, it is worth seeking medical advice at an early stage and, when doing so, ask about the suitability of the COVID Oximetry @home service.

This involves the remote monitoring of patients with coronavirus symptoms. Patients use a pulse oximeter, a small monitor clipped to their

finger, to measure their oxygen saturation levels three times a day. Patients are supported by clinical staff locally, so that if they need further treatment they can be admitted to hospital at the right time.

The team will move onto full scale type test trials at Dove Holes in the near future.

CEMEX Leads in Climate Action by Switching to more Sustainable Energy Sources



On International Energy Day CEMEX is proud to be a sector leader in switching to renewable energy sources.

Since 2019, CEMEX UK has used 100% renewable electricity at all sites supplied by energy, services and regeneration group ENGIE, who have been providing electricity to over 150 CEMEX UK sites for more than 10 years. The commitment helped to drive the decarbonisation agenda in the UK, and CEMEX also takes

advantage of ENGIE's demand-side services, such as load management to avoid peak tariffs and rapid frequency response.

Then in 2020 CEMEX announced a similar commitment for its 32 plants in Poland. All electricity purchased now comes from renewable sources, including wind energy, via its long standing energy partner PGE Obrót. In September of the same year CEMEX announced that together with partner Synhelion, an innovative technology has been developed that eliminates carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions in the cement production process by using solar energy. CO2 emissions will be captured and then converted into synthetic fuels using Synhelion technology.

CEMEX is perfectly positioned in Europe to also lead the construction materials sector in cutting emissions following many years of diligent carbon reduction and alignment with EU regulations and environmental policies. In 2020 it aligned with new EU aspirations to reduce CO2 emissions by at least 55% by 2030, and reached the Company's global 35% CO2 reduction target a decade early.

CEMEX's Climate Action strategy launched in February 2020 outlines the company's vision to advance towards a carbon-neutral economy and to address society's increasing demands more efficiently. In



CEMEX, we believe that climate change is one of the biggest challenges of our time and support the urgency of collective action.

WHAT IS IT?





STRESS MANAGEMENT

STRESS

It is the body's reaction to situations that burden it. They exceed the body's ability to deal effectively with them and disturb its balance.

Stressors, i.e. disruptive events, appear in the external environment. Their source can be both physical, e.g. noise, disease, and social, e.g. family problems, loss of a loved one.

TYPES OF STRESS

MOBILISING STRESS

An example may be the performance of a task for which we need to properly prepare. It is then positive and encourages us to act. By implementing them, a hormone called adrenaline is released, which makes it easier for us to complete the task.

LONG-LASTING STRESS

Prolonged stress or constant stress stimuli (so-called stressors) exhaust us physically and mentally. This type of stress affects our entire body badly and stress turns into a negative state. Its effects are: irritation or mental breakdown, sometimes even depression.

STRESS MANAGEMENT



PROPER PREPARATION

If you are stressed by a conversation with a person - write down all problems that you think may arise. Think carefully about what you can say and how to act. This will make you feel more confident. Treat difficulties as challenges! We can always learn something from them and find energy in it.



EAT AND HYDRATE **PROPERLY**

How we eat affects how we function. Lack of the right amount of vitamins and minerals is another factor that has a huge impact on your well-being. Drinking water and eating regularly can also help with stress management.



BE ACTIVE AND LEARN HOW TO RELAX

Physical activity has a positive effect on our entire body. It also has a beneficial effect on coping with stress. Do what you like? Run, meditate, exercise, go cycling. During physical activity, endorphins, i.e. happiness hormones, are released.



SMILE

Each type of smile has a positive effect on the body. The attitude we face in everyday life has a huge impact on the course of events. Smiling lowers the heart rate in stressful situations. One big smile can give us a lot of energy and motivation!



DO SOMETHING THAT **MAKES YOU HAPPY**

Go for coffee / tea, go for a walk, do some shopping. Sometimes simple things that we forget on a daily basis can cheer us up and make us stop worrying and forget about unimportant matters.




GET HELP

Environmental Activism Employee Guidance

Security Incident

On Thursday 28th January, the man pictured was observed taking photographs of Rugby Cement Plant, Southam Quarry and the lorries coming and going from both sites. When challenged by a vigilant driver, the male covered his face with a balaclava, refused to speak and continued photographing the driver and his lorry. Police have been informed.

It is believed this man may be linked to Environmental activists, particularly those opposed to HS2 who may seek to disrupt business. As a result the threat level of possible protest action against CEMEX is now **HIGH.**



Health and Safety will always be the #1 priority for CEMEX. This applies to everyone, including protesters.

What do I need to do?



All staff must remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity or signs that a protest may be developing.



If faced with protest action all CEMEX deliveries should proceed with extreme caution and only complete the delivery if it is safe for all concerned to do so.



If there is a police or security presence, drivers should comply with the directions of police and or site security.



If safe completion of the delivery is not possible, drivers should retreat from the site and seek immediate advice from their CEMEX manager



Under no circumstances should CEMEX representatives engage with protesters.



Do not attempt to film the protests with your phone or tablet as this is likely to antagonise the situation.

Details of any protest related incident should be debriefed via CEMEX UK Security, including vehicle borne CCTV coverage if available.





What to Look For

- Suspicious activity including photographing and observing site activity and vehicle movements
- **Lorry surfing** Protesters will risk their own safety by attempting to board supply chain vehicles.

In such circumstances the vehicle should be brought to a safe stop immediately and remain stationary until the issue is addressed by police and it is safe to continue

- Walking road block Protesters will seek to prevent or frustrate the supply chain by conducting a slow paced walking road block at the site or on approaching roads.
- Static road/site entrance block Protesters will seek to block access to the site using a variety of means



Lock-Ons – Protesters lock themselves to each other or to buildings, trees or similar fixtures, frustrating site activity. 'Lock-Ons' require specialist police teams to dismantle. They are effective and cause considerable and lengthy disruption.

Tree House Occupation – across various sites, protesters have taken up long term residence in tree houses, aimed at frustrating the clearing of the site.
