UK Marine Wins Safety Sword

The UK Marine team faced some tough competition from across the business, with the UK Asphalt, Readymix Yorkshire, and Supply Chain Rail and Sea teams also nominated.

This year, the award was judged by Robert House, Health and Safety Director for EMEA, who visited the nominated sites before making his decision. Robert praised the strong sense of line management ownership for Health and Safety from the nominated teams, who are clearly dedicated to keeping people safe, while being very open to ways to further improve.

Mark 'Steps In' to Help Save a Life



Mark Nichols, Wharf Supervisor and first aider at our Brighton Wharf, showed exemplary behaviour by 'Stepping In' to try to save a man's life after a horrific incident last week.

Mark had been working on site but out of sight of the nearby public main road when he heard a loud bang. Without hesitation Mark and two colleagues nearby ran to investigate and found a horrific road traffic collision



between a van and a motorbike. While Mark's two colleagues

redirected the rush hour traffic away from the scene, Mark, along with a passing motorist, assessed the injured motorcyclist and finding him not breathing, decided to take action. Taking it in turns, Mark and motorist administered CPR until paramedics arrived on the scene some 20 minutes later.

Unfortunately, the injuries were too severe, and the motorcyclist died two days later in hospital. The paramedics were, however, full of praise for Mark's calm and quick action and said that with Mark's intervention the man had some chance of surviving and without Mark he would have had none.

Terry Gent, Mark's line manager commented: "We are incredibly proud of Mark who 'Stepped In', stayed calm under a stressful situation and took immediate action. He used his First Aid training to help a person in real need. Well done Mark!"

Are you Getting Enough Sleep?

The American Academy of Sleep Medicine and the Sleep Research

Society recommend sleeping seven or more hours per night for adults between 18-60 years old.

DSM Up to the Challenge



CEMEX DSM have commenced work on the next phase of the North Yorkshire Polyhalite Tunnel project. The £3.2 billion project is constructing Woodsmith Mine – south of Whitby, North Yorkshire – to extract polyhalite, and a tunnel system to transport it to a materials handling facility and harbour at Teesside.

The polyhalite deposit is the world's largest and highest-grade fertiliser of its type. This is one of the final sections of tunnel and the most complex to construct. We have supplied our Spray Concrete in Silo Solution to this project in the past and our versatile solution lends itself to complex, difficult to reach sites; with this final

section involving tunnelling under the North Sea we were called upon again to innovate.

The requirements of the site are such that there are a number of specific challenges, the spraying is taking place under the North Sea 17km from the point of production at the site silo. The dry silo concrete is manufactured/mixed wet via the silo and mixer into an 8m3 rail configured torpedo mixer which takes 90 minutes to travel the distance along the tunnel to discharge into the concrete spraying pump.

Due to the time it takes to make the delivery it is necessary to have an extended open life; the additional hydration control admixture is added by liquid into the mixer via a calibrated pump, and to measure the amount of product being discharged into the torpedoes the silos are on load cells which are able to calculate the weight of the product made.




At Dagenham Wharf we have seen both the primary and dewatering screens replaced.
