Stimulating Simulator Training



A group of Officers from CEMEX UK Marine took part in ship handling training using the simulator facility at MSA Solent in Portsmouth.

The simulator was specifically configured to accurately represent the manoeuvring characteristics of the CEMEX Go Innovation. As this ship has many different features to our existing vessels, the simulator allows the Officers to familiarise themselves with the operation of the vessel and develop their techniques in a safe and controlled environment, in different conditions of wind and tide.

The main benefit of simulator training is that the team can run many focussed and intense exercises during a day, enabling a lot of experience to be gained very quickly.

All of the Officers who attended are looking forward to putting what they have learned into practice in real life. They were pleased to have the Deputy Harbour Master and one of the Marine Pilots from Shoreham Port join them, and they are now looking forward to working together to enable the port to gain confidence in the capabilities of the ship.

This is another great example of CEMEX investing in Health And Safety, Training, Continuous Improvement, Our People & Assets.

Stay Safe, Stay Out!



Last year, there was a significant increase in members of the public visiting inland sites with water. This included quarry lakes and reservoirs which can be viewed by some as a tempting place for a quick dip or other water related activities.

With the start of the half term holidays and the extended Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend, the MPA anticipates that more members of the public may enter sites, particularly non-active or disused sites, for recreational purposes.

MPA is requesting quarry operators be extra vigilant and to review our public safety risk assessments and any site-specific, mitigation measures such as fencing and warning signs.

You can review the MPA's updated '<u>Guidelines for the Management of Public Safety on MPA Members'</u> Operational and Non Operational Sites'.

This week, the MPA will also be promoting a joint campaign by the HM Coastguard and RNLI as they anticipate over 30 million people visiting the coast this year. Their safety messages, particularly about a life-saving technique should you get into trouble, 'Float to Live', will save lives. Their resources explain





how floating on your back can dramatically improve your chances of survival should you find yourself in trouble in water.

Please share this knowledge with your friends and family – it could help save their lives.

Staying Safe in the Sun



With the long bank holiday weekend coming up and the hope of sunny days for the Jubilee celebrations, please remember the importance of Sun Safety.

Stay protected from the sun, particularly between 11am and 3pm.

Did you know – the sun's UV rays are strongest when your shadow is shorter than you!

Too much ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun or sunbeds can damage DNA in your skin cells and cause skin cancer. In the UK almost nine in

ten cases of melanoma skin cancer could be prevented by staying safe in the sun and avoiding sunbeds.

The best way to stay safe in the sun and protect your skin is to use shade, clothing and sunscreen. Shade and clothing are better than sunscreen at protecting your skin.

Sunscreen shouldn't be used to spend longer in the sun but can be useful for protecting the parts of skin not covered by clothing or shade.

Here are some Sun Safety tips:

- Spending time in the shade, especially between 11am and 3pm in the UK.
- Covering up with clothes, a wide-brimmed hat and UV protection sunglasses.
- And using a sunscreen with at least SPF15 and 4 or 5 stars. Use it generously, reapply regularly and use together with shade and clothing.

CEMEX Tests Electric, Zero-Emission Ready-mixed Truck



The prototype Putzmeister iONTRON e-Mixer vehicle will be operated for a week from ready-mixed production plants in Pruszków and Warsaw.

During this time CEMEX employees will assess how the tested vehicle performs in everyday tasks, during transporting and unloading of CEMEX products.

This prototype vehicle is powered solely by electricity. For the purpose of testing, the manufacturer supplies a mobile charging station with which it is possible to recharge the batteries

supplying the concrete mixer during the night from 20 to 100% in eight hours.

This is another step in CEMEX's "Future in Action" strategy to combat climate change!

CEO Visits Rugby Cement Plant



This week, CEMEX announced the inauguration of its new Climafuel facility at the Rugby cement plant. This significant investment will allow the plant to eliminate the usage of fossil fuels, operating 100% on alternative fuels. This is the first CEMEX plant to achieve this important milestone. Climafuel is a waste derived fuel which is made using household residual and commercial waste that would otherwise go to landfills. This is another major milestone in CEMEX's global Future in Action decarbonisation strategy.

CEMEX's CEO, Fernando A. Gonzalez, (pictured here with Phil Baynes-Clarke (photo left), Director of Operations for UK Cement), visited Rugby Cement plant on Monday 30th May, kicking off a week-long tour of European CEMEX sites. He highlighted the success of the Climafuel investment: "I am proud of CEMEX Europe's continued leadership in our carbon action strategy. It serves as the model for the rest of our regions. I expect CEMEX to continue leading the way in our decarbonisation journey. This effort is not only the way to build a better future for the communities in which we operate and society at large but it is also the right thing for the future of the company. I look forward to continued progress on our Future in Action strategy from all of our regions."

Also commenting on the investment, Sergio Menendez, President of CEMEX Europe, Middle East, Africa & Asia, said: "With the completion of this considerable development, we have set new records in alternative fuel substitution, the highest of any of our plants and eventually expect to phase out completely the usage of fossil fuels at the plant. We expect the Rugby plant to be a model for other CEMEX Cement plants around the world."



'Cold Water Shock'

Sudden immersion in cold water can cause you to gasp involuntarily and inhale water, a rapid increase in breathing and the onset of panic. A deadly combination that can drown even strong swimmers within seconds of entering the water. Cold water shock can occur in water at 15°C or below. In midsummer, the water in many quarry lakes will be well below this temperature.

Immersion in cold water also causes finger stiffness (making it difficult to climb out), reduced coordination (making it difficult to swim/tread water) and general muscle weakness. In combination these physiological responses to cold water significantly impact on the capabilities of even strong swimmers and one's ability to get out of trouble.

BE WATER AWARE

6 TIPS TO KEEP YOU AND YOUR FRIENDS SAFER

- If you are suddenly plunged into cold water stay calm - float on your back for a minute to allow your body to adjust to the water temperature – look for a place to exit the water - call for help.
- Stay away from the edge of quarry lakes or quarry faces – they could give way. Over 40% of people who drown in the UK never intended to enter the water.
- If you've had alcohol don't enter the water, avoid walking alone and avoid routes near water
- Never enter the water to try and help a person or animal - always call 999 and use any water rescue equipment if it is available
- If you are spending time near water whether at home or abroad make sure you are familiar with local safety information and children are fully supervised.
- Remember warning signs and fencing are there to protect you

10 reasons why water in active & former quarries can be dangerous

- The water in quarry lakes can be very deep
- The water in quarry lakes can be very cold
- Sudden, unexpected changes in depth due to shelving
- Steep or crumbling sides making it difficult to exit
- Submerged machinery or rocks that can injure jumpers or swimmers
- Underwater plants, machinery or debris that can trap you
- Currents or powerful underwater pumps making it difficult to swim
- Dead animals/excrement in water causing disease
- Pollution/high alkalinity causing rashes, irritation and stomach problems
- Poisonous algae
