LTI Milestone Achievements



Congratulations to everyone in UK Materials North West who achieved 3 years LTI free. Also, congratulations to UK Asphalt West who achieved 9 years LTI free. These are significant milestones – well done.

Health & Safety Improvement – Quick Win at Swansea



At CEMEX's Swansea Wharf site edge protection was a key health & safety issue.

Nigel Street, Wharf/Minimix Transport Manager Readymix, reached out on Yammer to share a great solution to address this health and safety issue with a quick win, very low-cost solution.

On the Wharf there was around 100m to 150m of exposed wharf edge with no physical barrier in place to prevent vehicle access or to set a boundary for the non-pedestrian area. This was an issue as CEMEX is not the landowner and access is required to the wharf edge by Stevedores, ship's crew and ABP staff.

Nigel explains: "I remembered a visit I had to Concrete Products at Wick as part of my role and business familiarisation back over 19 years ago, when I had a tour of Wick Products with Sue Townsend. I was aware of multiple sites in Readymix and Aggregates that had previously sourced 'lego blocks' externally at a significant cost and used them for demarcating areas. I remembered from my visit to Wick they used to have waste concrete moulds. I spoke to Sue who willingly agreed to start producing the Jersey blocks for us at Swansea.

The blocks were delivered and put in place by a local haulage contractor, FG Bond, who Wick Products used. By reaching out across different business areas within CEMEX, and with full support form Sue, we only had to pay for delivery and placement costs. This offered us a great solution to the problem at a very low-cost using waste concrete.

The benefits mean the movable edge protection will allow safe access for Stevedores and port staff without fixed structures requiring permission of third-party site owner. They can be handled by forklift or telehandler for placement around site, and for ease of movement during cleaning/housekeeping.

We have since discussed another batch to be delivered to our CEMEX Cardiff Wharf for similar uses and with other boundary demarcating purposes.

Well done Nigel – a fantastic initiative which will help towards achieving our Zero 4 Life goal.

CEMEX Achieves Milestone CO2 Reduction in Europe



CEMEX achieved a milestone 41 per cent reduction* in the CO_2 emissions generated by its European cement business in 2022, demonstrating its dedication to increasing the sustainability of its operations through a concerted climate action strategy; Future in Action.

A fifth of the total reduction attained since 1990 happened in the last two years, with a drop of over 12% from 2020 performance; clearly showing the acceleration of CEMEX's efforts to cut emissions.

Sergio Menendez, Regional President for CEMEX EMEA, commented: "We are very proud to have reached a 41% reduction in CO₂ emissions generated by our European cement business, and this is all thanks to the commitment of our teams to pursuing climate action, circularity, and natural resource management.

As we begin to implement the next stages in our climate action strategy, we now expect to exceed our 2030 aspiration of hitting a 55% CO2 reduction in our European operations. While we are progressing important carbon capture projects and policy advocacy for our ultimate net zero target, these 2030 interim aspirations are not reliant on this technology."

This is certainly a challenging target, but I am confident that with innovative thinking, close collaboration between our different business areas, and further development of our regulatory framework, it is both feasible and profitable. This sustained effort is vital if we are to meet our global, primary objective of becoming a net-zero CO2 company by 2050. We will continue to provide regular updates on our progress."

Jessica Morden MP Visits Newport Site



Making a Difference to Those in Need

Thank you again for helping to bring hope and joy to so many families in difficult situations. But once again, a huge thank you for the work and support, packing and processing the OCC shoeboxes. Your help was so appreciated. Over 30,000 online shoeboxes were packed in Oldbury and you were a vital part of the team."

Operation Christmas Child is one part of the work of a larger charity – Samaritan's Purse, which is currently involved in relief / medical work in the war affected areas of Ukraine, and the earthquake devastated areas of Turkey and Syria.

Here is another question sent in for Lex, along with Lex's response:

Q: Every quarter, we encourage our customers to fill in our NPS Surveys and the response rate (though slightly improved in Q4 2022) is usually quite low. As a consumer myself, I am constantly sent similar questionnaires from supermarkets, online shopping sites, etc. asking to give feedback. I must admit that I only ever do so when there is some sort of tangible reward offered (usually entry into a prize draw for some vouchers). Otherwise I just delete them. Is this something we should offer customers when sending out NPS surveys? I would suggest that the

potential lure of, say, £500 of Amazon vouchers would see a marked increase in customer response rate.

A: We agree that customers are potentially more likely to respond to our NPS surveys if there is an incentive and so the Customer Experience teams have been exploring ways to offer this. To encourage participation while also supporting our local causes and communities we are therefore working on a charitable incentive for every survey that is filled out. We will be able to confirm the charity in the coming weeks.



Once you have enrolled, you will be able to access your payslip via spark:

- 3. You will see the Payslip link here.
- 4. Click to open
- 5. Select 'Client Employee'
- 6. Once you have enrolled, this will then take you to your payslips

Historical payslips (from November 2022 and prior) will still be available in Shift if you need them.

Future Disruption Due to Rail Strikes



Once again, the RMT have announced strike action affecting Network Rail employees.

They will be taking 24 hours of strike action on **Thursday 16th March.** The RMT have also announced strike action affecting passenger trains on Thursday 16th and Saturday 18th March and then Thursday 30th March and Saturday 1st April.

There is also an **Overtime Ban for Network Rail employees**

following the strike action. This is split into two halves, Maintenance staff and Operations staff. We understand that there could be an impact to our operations from the Operations staff overtime ban.

This will be in effect on the following dates:

Sunday 26th March to Saturday 1st April Sunday 9th April to Saturday 15th April Sunday 23rd April to Saturday 29th April

These strikes will affect a number of rail operating companies, including Network Rail. The disruption this is going to cause to our business is significant. Please can you ensure you are advising customers of the potential impact to supply.

The Supply Chain team is working hard to mitigate the impact to our operations wherever possible and is in contact with the relevant business areas around this.

However, for employees who are planning to use the rail network on the above dates, for instance for meetings or training, it is worth exploring alternative methods of transport or potentially rescheduling.






The following shows the performance of the Asphalt and Materials Businesses in 2022

In 2022, the UK businesses achieved and average NPS score of 36 which is marginally lower than the 42 achieved in 2021.

Although not all of the objectives were achieved in 2022, we were constantly very close with some good improvements made throughout the year.
