Steps to Good Bowel Health



April is recognised nationally as Bowel Cancer Awareness Month. Bowel cancer is the fourth most common cancer in the UK and the second biggest cancer killer.



What is bowel cancer?

• Bowel cancer is also called colorectal cancer. It affects the large bowel, which is made up of the colon and rectum.

• Most bowel cancers develop from pre-cancerous growths, called polyps. But not all polyps develop into cancer. If your doctor finds any

polyps, they can be removed to prevent them becoming cancerous.

• Cancer cells may stay in the bowel or they might spread to other parts of the body, like the liver or lungs.

In last week's <u>UK News article</u> we shared some resources which you can find <u>here</u> with lots more information about Bowel Cancer, who it affects, what are the symptoms, what to do if you notice any symptoms and about screening in the UK.

This week we are sharing some simple steps for good bowel health. This is important as these small changes will help your digestive system to work well and could reduce your risk of bowel cancer.

The bowel is part of your digestive system, which turns food and liquid into energy that your body can use. Eating healthily helps your digestive system work well and can reduce your risk of bowel cancer.

The Government's Eatwell Guide shows you how much of your daily diet should come from each food group. This includes everything you eat during the day, including snacks.



To stay healthy, we should:

- Eat at least **five portions of vegetables and fruit every day**.
- Choose wholegrain varieties of bread, rice and pasta.
- Enjoy more pulses, such as beans and lentils.
- Eat some fish, chicken, eggs and tofu but limit red meat and avoid processed meat.
- Eat some milk and other dairy foods but choose those without added sugar.
- Choose unsaturated oils and spreads and use in small amounts.
- Limit food and drinks high in fat or sugar such as sweets, cakes, crisps and fizzy drinks. They are not needed for a healthy diet and should only be eaten in small amounts.

Fibre is an important part of a healthy diet and helps reduce your risk of bowel cancer. Fibre keeps everything moving easily through your digestive system. Try increasing the amount of fibre in your diet gradually. Not everyone will be able to tolerate a high fibre diet.



As well as containing fibre, vegetables and fruit may also help to protect against bowel cancer because they contain antioxidants, which are substances that help to delay or prevent cell damage. We all know eating five portions of vegetables and fruit a day forms part of a healthy, balanced diet but do you know how to get your **5 A Day**?

We need **protein** in our diet to help our body repair cells and make new ones. There are many good sources of protein shown in the Eatwell Guide. These include chicken, fish, peas, beans, tofu and lentils. But there is strong evidence that eating a lot of red and processed meat increases your risk of bowel cancer.

Alcohol is linked to seven types of cancer including bowel cancer. Alcohol can damage cells, making them more likely to become cancerous. For cancer prevention, it's best not to drink alcohol at all.

People who are more physically active have a lower risk of bowel cancer. **Being active** can help you keep to a healthy body weight and helps to make you feel good.

Being overweight or obese and carrying a lot of weight around your waist can increase your risk of bowel cancer. Measuring your BMI (Body Mass Index) is a simple way of finding out if you're a healthy weight for your height.

This Sunday at 3pm - Nationwide Test of Emergency Alert System



The new UK government's Emergency Alerts system will be tested nationally, this coming Sunday on 23rd April at 3pm.

The Emergency Alerts system will enable people to be contacted via their mobile phone when lives are in danger. It will be used to warn you in emergencies such as severe flooding.

An Emergency Alert is a loud, siren-like sound with a message on

your mobile phone screen. Listen to the sound <u>here</u>.

Reasons you might get an alert:

- severe flooding
- fires
- extreme weather

Emergency alerts will only be sent by:

- the emergency services
- government departments, agencies and public bodies that deal with emergencies

What happens when you get an emergency alert

Your mobile phone or tablet may:

• make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent

- vibrate
- read out the alert

The sound and vibration will last for about 10 seconds. An alert will include a phone number or a link to the GOV.UK website for more information.

You'll get alerts based on your current location - not where you live or work. You do not need to turn on location services to receive alerts.

Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones when there's a danger to your life, health or property in the area you're located. They don't track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data. Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you receive an alert, you will hear a loud siren-like sound for up to 10 seconds and a message will appear on the screen until you acknowledge it.

If you're driving or riding when you get an alert

- You should not read or otherwise respond to an emergency alert whilst driving or riding a motorcycle.
- If you are driving, you should continue to drive and not respond to the noise or attempt to pick up the mobile phone and deal with the message.
- Find somewhere safe and legal to stop before reading the message. If there is nowhere safe or legal to stop close by, and nobody else is in the vehicle to read the alert, tune into live radio and wait for bulletins until you can find somewhere safe and legal to stop.

It is illegal to use a hand-held device while driving or riding.

Cemex Philippines Reaches Milestone in CO₂ Reduction



Cemex Philippines (CHP) achieved a 50% reduction in CO₂ emissions generated by its two cement subsidiaries, Solid Cement Corporation and APO Cement Corporation, from 1990-2022. Based on public declarations, this is the highest CO₂ emissions reduction in the industry, establishing Cemex's commitment to decarbonising its operations through its Future in Action program.

From 2020 to 2022 alone, CHP reduced 18% of its net CO_2 emissions, representing 36% of the total CO_2 reduction since 1990,

demonstrating the company's accelerated efforts to further reduce its cement operations emissions.

"This milestone CO₂ reduction was possible because of our team's high commitment to achieve net zero. We are on track to meet our ambition of less than 430kg of net CO₂ per ton of cement by 2030 and deliver net-zero CO₂ concrete by 2050," commented Luis Franco, Cemex Philippines President, and CEO.

Cemex Investment to Further Support Safe and Sustainable Rail Mobility Needs in UK



Cemex has completed a significant investment into its rail solutions facility at Somercotes in Derbyshire. This development was undertaken to meet increasing customer demand for its concrete bearers for switches and crossings.

As a result of this investment, Cemex will be able to manufacture an additional 18,000 linear metres of bearers for switches and crossings every year. This additional capacity is vital to meet the requirements of Cemex's clients in the rail sector.

The improvements entailed the construction of a building which houses a new crane for moving products and the existing stressing frames were repositioned into this facility. This allowed for space in the main building for a new 50m twin cell rail bearer mould. There is also space for further expansion when this is needed.

As well as rail bearers, the new development can produce the heavily engineered, low volume complex sleepers that are required for key rail infrastructure projects. This will further allow Cemex to better facilitate the complex, bespoke characteristics of its rail solutions, while meeting the highest standards in terms of safety and sustainability.

The new Somercotes facility was officially opened by Cemex's EMEA President Sergio Menendez on his recent visit to the UK (photo).

Investments at Selby



Investment at Cemex's Selby Asphalt plant and depot has resulted in a new capacity bucket reducing loading time whilst increasing efficiency, the shovel meets tighter emission control regulations thus helping to reduce the site CO₂ emissions.



Additionally, investment in 2022 led to three new bitumen tanks, as an energy reduction trial – being

coloured black, the sun heats the outside of the tanks improving energy efficiency.

APRIL FOCUS: TAKE 5 TOGETHER

As a team, get together for between half an hour and an hour in a suitable location. Start by watching the film and then have a short discussion about Take 5 Together.

TALKING POINTS

- What benefits does Take 5 Together bring?
- Do you find it is difficult to intervene with a colleague?
- Would you allow a colleague to intervene with you in case of danger or even doubt
- In the film, it is said "Take 5 Together is my Duty"! what do you understand there?
- Why in the film, do the colleagues shake hands after their interaction?
- Is Take 5 Together only applicable between colleagues?
- How can we encourage each other to always 'step in' and apply Take 5 Together?
- Do we regularly share our interaction activity levels to help maintain focus on this subject?

NEXT STEPS

- Practise doing a Take 5 Together, step in, identify the risks together, think together about the appropriate control measures.
- As you go about your day remember "We don't let anything go". Be sure to "Step In" systematically, in case of danger, deviation or even doubt.
- Remember: we stand together as a team, we systematically intervene, even in the case of a minor deviation.
- Make this Take 5 Together mobilisation last throughout April by systematically interacting individually or as a team.
- Make this Take 5 Together campaign part of your meetings, conversations, and interactions throughout April.
- Consider having a weekly review of the campaign with your team
- Consider using the training package if you feel a refresher is needed and utilise the posters to further promote it at your site.
