

A Message from Lex Russell, Chair of the UK Health & Safety Committee



On Saturday 13th May it will be six years since our colleague and friend, Jimmy Brownlie, sadly died at West Calder Block plant.

Jimmy was carrying out general maintenance with two workmates. He died when he was crushed by a block centering machine which wasn't locked out and was activated automatically by a sensor.

Jimmy was 64 years old and had worked for us for over 20 years.

This tragic incident had a huge impact on the whole of the UK business, particularly those who worked alongside Jimmy and had known him for a long time.

Please take this opportunity to reflect with your teams and ensure isolation procedures are robust at your sites. Remember that no one should ever work on live or moving machinery – they must always "lock out".

Additionally, always Take 5 before starting a new task to ensure risks are identified and control measures are in place, including LOTOTO. Look out for your colleagues and others on site too - Step In and Take 5 Together if you see someone at risk of injury.

We must all remember that Health & Safety is our number one priority, above anything else. If we work together we can achieve Zero4Life.

Following a recent VFL at Chesterfield Concrete plant, the group discussed an app which lets you know where your nearest defibrillator is – this had come up during the comprehensive site induction.

The free app, <u>DefibMap</u>, guides you to the nearest defibrillator and lists 120,000 defibrillators in the UK. It is available for iOS and Android. We recommend downloading it to your phones – it may save a life!

The app also allows people to log their defibrillators to improve the app. By publishing a free map of all the defibrillators listed in its database, **AEDMAP** helps improving the survival chances of sudden

The app's founder, Joe Robinson, set up the website <u>https://www.defibmap.org</u> and the app following the death of his brother Tom, who tragically passed away in 2018 from cardiac arrest caused by a congenital heart disease. Whilst the paramedics, first responders and bystanders did everything in their power to save him, Tom sadly passed away.

Straight-Line Marathon Trespass Warning



In a recent communication from the MPA Security Forum we have been informed about some mineral sites in Dartmoor National Park who suffered unwanted trespass during working hours by individuals participating in a straight-line marathon organised by a group named "STORROR". There are various YouTube films online associated with them, and they have c.8 million followers.

The route took the participants right through two large mineral sites

where operations were underway. The participants trespass without deviation regardless of obstacle or ownership. Both local police and the Dartmoor National Park Authority were advised of the incursion.

We would like to remind all Site Managers to review their risk assessments and procedures to ensure suitable precautions are in place to deter trespassers. These include fencing and signage at site boundaries and other significant hazards, minimising the risk to trespassers from hazards such as open water, access to heights and excavations, mobile plant and confined spaces.

Cemex France Waste Management Video



In France, public and private stakeholders in construction and land development face a highly regulated context in the management of construction, demolition, and excavation waste.

Thanks to its expertise and integrated industrial system, Cemex France manages the entire process, from the collection of inert waste to its recycling.

Collected demolition and excavation waste is transported to our processing platforms from the demolition sites or from the excavation sites. If the site is close to a waterway, the waste can be loaded directly onto our barges. It is transported to one of our multiservice platforms in the Paris region. For other sites, it is taken to one of our 11 urban ports. Loads are carefully controlled, and traceability is guaranteed. Waste is sorted and sent to approved recycling channels to give it a second life on construction sites. Depending on its characteristics, the demolition and excavation material is transported by river to approved recycling channels or for quarry rehabilitation. At the selected Cemex quarry, reception and traceability are meticulously managed. The excavated material is then used to backfill the areas at the end of the operation, in strict compliance with the site rehabilitation plan.

The emptied barge is reloaded with aggregates and returns to supply CEMEX's ready-mix concrete plants in the Paris region.

Happy Birthday Somercotes



On 12th March, our rail bearer facility at Somercotes was 20 years young.

The operations moved from Washwood Health, Birmingham in early 2003 and with the installation of all the equipment the first concrete was placed on 12th March which would see the beginning of a journey that has taken the facility to be the best in the market.

With the start of production at Somercotes the facility had two twin cell 50 metre moulds giving a maximum capacity of 38,000 metres of concrete bearers of only two different types. Today the facility has a maximum capacity of 95,625.

Terence Clair, S&C Business Manager, commented: "Over the 20 years Somercotes has gone from strength to strength not just in volume and product design but with its safety culture. I am immensely

proud to have been a part of this journey, one that we can all be proud of. Somercotes and myself have been extremely lucky to have good people over the years that have shown the commitment the site demands. We have more than tripled our capacity but also we are now making other products for the rail infrastructure. The product design itself has become more complex with the implementation of many new designs.... I believe we have become customer centricity leaders with our ability to adapt to our customers' needs offering solutions to each change with innovation and ensuring quality being one of our core attributes."

Terence continues: "We have many long serving members of the team which have been key in our development, but two who did follow us to Somercotes from Birmingham and have been with us throughout our time at Somercotes are William Lewis (Bill) and Noel Gibbs. They have both contributed so much over the years and I deeply proud to have worked with them for over 20 years."

NEVER FORGET...STAY SAFE

On the 13th of May, it will be 6 years since our last employee fatality in the UK, when Jimmy Brownlie tragically lost his life in an incident at West Calder Blockworks. Jimmy was 64 years old and had worked for us for over 20 years. He came to work on the Saturday morning, but never returned home to his wife, children and grandchildren.

Jimmy was carrying out general maintenance with two workmates. He died when he was crushed by a block centering machine, which wasn't locked out and was activated automatically by a sensor.

We must continue to do all we can to ensure we don't forget the lessons we learnt from this tragic incident...



Ensure isolation procedures are robust. You may want to ask yourself:

- Are machinery isolation procedures specific, clear, readily available and understood? Do they include an authorisation process?
- Is there an isolation station with suitable equipment and individual padlocks with unique keys?
- Are switches, valves, equipment, etc. clearly labelled?
- Is it possible to isolate all forms of stored energy?
- Are isolation tags displayed at each isolation point?
- Are spare and master keys prohibited?
- Do we isolate as much of the equipment as possible, including upstream and downstream in the process?
- Is the "on" / "off" operation of switches clear? Have we ensured switches cannot be locked in the "on" position?
- How do we "test start" equipment to ensure isolation is effective before commencing work?
- Where practicable is there a "Manager in Charge" lock?
- Is there a formal check to ensure equipment is in a safe condition before the isolation is removed?

Always **Take 5** before starting a new task to ensure risks are identified and control measures are in place, including **LOTOTO**. **Step in** and **Take 5 Together** if you see someone at risk of injury. **Speak Up** and raise a Near Miss / Hazard Alert if equipment isn't properly guarded, or isolation procedures cannot be followed.

Welcome to our seventh edition of Nature around CEMEX Europe - Newsletter.

UK – Preserving the Black Poplar

Willington Quarry in Derbyshire is helping preserve the Black Poplar a native tree species. The species is in decline across North West Europe and because the plant normally grows in isolation the offspring are often hybrids. So to preserve the phenotype, staff at Willington Quarry have created a nursery where the trees are fertilised on site and grown on ready for future planting.

Willington is a sand and gravel quarry which sits on the confluence of the Trent and Dove rivers so conditions on site are ideal for the tree.



FRANCE – Something to Celebrate - 20

years of partnership with the LPO 2023 sees the 20th Anniversary of the partnership between Cemex France and the LPO. Working with the NGO has given both parties many benefits. Cemex now has a deeper understanding of Biodiversity and has many initiatives around making sure species and habitats are enhanced at Cemex sites across France. So much so that in 2016 Cemex France received the ECOCERT label as well as being recognised by the Ministry of Ecology as a "Enterprises Engagées pour la nature". It's a testament to how well the partnership has worked. 20 years is a real achievement. The first National Partnership in the EMEA region and an example for others to follow.



AGIR pour la BIODIVERSITÉ

SPAIN – Sandmartin Management

Sand Martins are protected birds that are often found nesting in sand stocks in active gravel pits. A habitat for this species was constructed at an operational extraction site in northeast Spain. The design took into account all of the Sand Martin's habitat requirements. The habitat consists of a sand stock, built on a platform that overlooks a naturalized decanting pond. This allows the birds to have easy access to food, even during the Mediterranean dry summer. The location is also protected from machine transit and people. The objective of this action is to create a safe space for the birds to nest, and avoid them nesting in active stocks. This way, we aim to promote the reconciliation between mining and biodiversity conservation. This initiative is aligned with the Extractive Sector Species Protection Code of Conduct.



GERMANY – Creating a Meadow Orchard for all to

enjoy.

Growing orchards has become a declining agricultural practice. So to encourage growth of a new meadow orchard Cemex Germany have planted out a new fruit orchard at Museum Park, Rüdersdorf. Traditional orchards support a diverse range of plant and animal species and offer many benefits for Biodiversity. The fruit trees need to be carefully pruned so with expert help from Anke Kurz and Kai Gildhorn from mundruab e.V., Cemex employees and 25 residents from Rüdersdorf have taken part in workshops and organised pruning events. The orchard was planted out in 2019 and the employees and residents are starting to see the fruits of their labour as the trees start to take shape



POLAND – Cemex Falcons

This year, we are continuing and expanding the kestrel (Falco tinnunculus) protection project at Chełm and Rudniki Cement Plants. We started the season by hanging 6 additional nesting boxes at our cement plants, and we donated another 20 to a non-governmental organization cooperating with us. As every year, the birds are supervised by an ornithologist from the University, who will study and ring them during the season. We also conduct ecological education - we inform about how to support the protection of kestrels through social media, press and radio. In addition, on our website we provide an online live broadcast from three nesting boxes and we keep a calendar describing the most important events in the life of birds and interesting facts about them. To engage Internet users even more in the project, this year we organized a competition for the most interesting observations from our nesting boxes.



Croatia: Sites of Community Importance.

Croatia has 6 years to implement species and habitat management plans as part of the legal requirements associated with the SIC – Sites of Community Importance. The quarries at Sveti Juraj and Sveti Kajo sit close to the Mosor, Kozjar & Trogirska zagora conservation areas important for birds but also because of their habitat and species – especially Kozjar. The plan for 2023 is to work with local stakeholders to produce a management plan to maintain the ecological integrity of the site and establish conservation measures to protect species and habitats.



Czech Republic – Spring Cleaning at Prachovice quarry

Last year we reported on work at Prachovice to install 70 bird boxes. These included boxes for smaller song birds, Starlings, bats and Tawny Owls. So its really good to receive an update from the Czech Sustainability Team and the Plant Manager Karol Czubara. After checks by staff and volunteers we can report that close to 100% of the Songbird and Starling boxes where used. 60% of the bat boxes were used and 40% of the Tawny Owl boxes. The Tawny Owls where a significant success with chicks born during 2022 checked and ringed. The occupancy rate during the first year exceeded all expectations. So after such a successful year the team at Prachovice carried out some cleaning and repairs to the boxes over winter, so they were ready for their spring visitors return
