

Latest Safety Alerts



The two latest Safety Alerts relate to recent incidents in our operations.

In one incident a contractor suffered a cracked tooth as he walked past an operation where cement mill metal media balls were being cleaned and sorted, when one was ejected towards him. The second incident thankfully only required

first aid, however, it has been reported as a High Potential (HiPo) incident after a driver trapped his hand in a remote-controlled lorry tailgate.

Please discuss the Alerts with your teams, reminding everyone of the benefit of reporting Near Miss / Hazard Alerts, particularly where there is high potential for injury, as this gives us the opportunity to share learning points and take action before someone gets hurt.

Remote controlled equipment has been a factor in a small number of serious incidents across our industry in the past, including at least two fatalities. Where operations use equipment that is controlled remotely, the second Alert provides a good opportunity to review the safe systems of work and ensure everyone involved in the operations understands the hazards, risks and essential precautions to keep themselves and others safe.

Firstly, it underscores the importance of self-care, for which we have a



requires every worker to be guided by three key steps: Stop, Think, Act. To accomplish this, they need to conduct a risk assessment before starting tasks in their day. This process will help them think about the task they are about to do, identify risks, and implement necessary controls to perform the job safely.

The second component involves looking out for others. In this regard, workers are encouraged to use the 'Take 5 Together' procedure which involves them stepping in when they observe a colleague taking any risks and supporting them by carrying out a 'Take 5' risk assessment together.

To foster an interdependent safety culture (caring not only for oneself but also for others), it is crucial to follow this Safety Essential consistently.

Richard's Cycle4MND Charity Bike Ride



Gloucester RFC, Kingsholm Stadium Gloucester to Leicester Tigers RFC, Welford Road, Leicester By Richard Boult.

Last year we shared how Richard Boult, Commercial Technical Manager, Commercial Cement, joined eight other cyclists to cycle from Leicester to Gloucester over two days to coincide with the Slater Cup. This year a larger and possibly crazier group of keen cyclists and Rugby fans have once again taken to the road to raise awareness and funds across three charities dedicated to Motor Neurone Disease; the MND Association, The My Name'5 Doddie Foundation and 4ED.

This year Richard, along with 26 other riders, consisting of a mixture of Gloucester and Tigers fans and explayers and dignitaries including Pete Glanville, Freddy Tuilagi, Harry Roberts, Dean Ryan, Lee Fortey and Rob York plus support crew, left Gloucester accompanied by two police outriders at 8.00am on Friday 22nd March. They cycled the 88 miles to Leicester with the intention of arriving in Leicester in plenty of time for that evenings Slater Cup Match. With coverage on local radio in Gloucestershire and East Midlands throughout the day and appearances on local TV news channels the riders slogged their way through the lanes and hills of the Cotswolds and a surprisingly hilly northern section of the route briefly stopping at Broadway, Leamington Spa and Stretton under Fosse along the way for much needed food and refreshments. The riders regrouped around a mile away from the Mattioli Woods Welford Road stadium where all 27 rode in together, adorned in specially produced half and half shirts sponsored by The Seven Stars pub in Rugby, to rapturous applause from home and away fans alike.

During the build up to the game a team of charity bucket collectors were out in force collecting further funds to add to the haul brought in already by the JustGiving pages set up by organiser Mike Dixon. It's amazing to report that at the time of writing the team have raised just short of an incredible £20,000 from the event which will be spread across the three beneficiary charities.

The team were photographed on the pitch at half time during the match in front of a packed Welford Road with Gloucester running out eventual 25-27 winners to take the cup back to Kingsholm.

Richard said: "It was a pleasure and honour to join the team to support the three charities that do so much to assist sufferers of this terrible debilitating disease and help raise awareness of it. Whilst there is currently no cure, the funds we have raised will go some way to helping the charities in their efforts in searching for one. £20,000 is a fantastic amount of money to raise and I didn't think we'd ever raise anything like that amount! To steal a quote from our team leader and organiser Mike it just goes to show that 'with greater awareness, comes amazing generosity' and I can't thank those people who've donated enough!". Watch out for more cycling feats in the next year or so!



Tools and Equipment

Safe Systems

Follow safe systems of work, site rules, signage and traffic signals.



SUMMARY OF THE INCIDENT

A contractor was in the vicinity of media ball grading activities at a Cement Plant when a small media ball was displaced whilst cleaning and contacted one of his front incisor teeth. This tooth was subsequently cracked. He continued to work on site with no restrictions; however, following a dental visit and a review of reporting requirements, it has been determined that this incident falls into the category of a medical treatment case.

INCIDENT FACTS

- The IP (injured person) was engaged in fork truck duties moving media barrels.
- Another employee was cleaning the media grading machine.
- The IP had finished moving the media barrels and disembarked from the fork truck.
- The IP walked over to the vicinity of the media grading machine.
- Whilst the cleaning operation was being undertaken, a trapped media ball fell through the chute and contacted the hammer being used, expelling it from the chute in the direction of the contractor who was passing by, around 8ft away.
- The small media ball hit the IP in the mouth, causing a crack to the tooth.

• The IP reported the incident.

HOW COULD THIS HAVE BEEN AVOIDED

Although the likelihood of this incident occurring was extremely low, it is acknowledged that space constraints on site and the design of the media grader could impact its operation during wet weather (as the task is completed outdoors). The UK experienced the wettest weather in decades during the week in question. Consequently, cement accumulated on the discharge chutes, and the operator had to break it up by tapping a hammer on the coating. This action led to a trapped media ball falling through the chute and making unexpected contact with the hammer, causing it to be expelled from the chute towards the contractor.

To address this issue, newer grading machines with improved designs, less susceptible to material buildup during adverse weather conditions, will be hired for future use. Adhering to the ERIC-P principle, this change in equipment is expected to eliminate or significantly reduce the potential for a similar occurrence.

Note: Access to the area was being controlled but the photograph is post completion of the task and demonstrates positioning of personnel at the time of the incident only.



DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT

A driver's hand was trapped in the tailgate of his belt trailer when cleaning down build up after discharging the load. He was still holding the remote-control unit for the trailer which also was trapped.







Remote Stop/Isolation button

Tailgate Close button. This must be held to close the door.

Cause	The driver unintentionally pressed, and held, the tailgate close button while cleaning down.
Reaction	The driver felt the tailgate hit the back of his safety helmet and instinctively moved his head away from being trapped by the tailgate.
First Aid	Bruising of the hand was the only injury. The driver returned to work the next day.
Safe Systems of Work (SSOW)	The driver failed to isolate the remote control prior to approaching the vehicle.
Training	The driver has held his class 1 license since 2021, has a valid MP Connect card, valid site induction and recently completed his Zero4Life for Driver's training.
PPE	Full PPE was worn, including gloves, which reduced the potential for injury.
Improvement	The delivery occurred early in the morning when low light levels made it difficult to see clearly into the trailer despite the driver having a head torch.

HOW COULD THIS HAVE BEEN AVOIDED

• Isolating the remote control would have prevented the tailgate moving.

KEY REVIEW POINTS

- SSOW modified to make it clearer that the remote must be isolated
- Retraining of drivers in the SSOW change
- Improved lighting in the area
