Safety Essential #5 – Manual Handling

Throughout 2024 each month we are visiting each of our 12 Safety Essentials to remind ourselves of the ways to keep ourselves and our colleagues safe.

The fifth Safety Essential is Manual Handling.

Manual handling is a part of many job roles, but it's crucial to carry out these tasks safely to prevent lifelong musculoskeletal injuries.

> Mechanical aid or a helping hand from a colleague can significantly reduce the risk of harm. It's not just about lifting with your knees it's about knowing the maximum safe weight you can handle as well.

Supervisors have a responsibility to assess risks and minimise injury potential by providing clear instructions, training, and mechanical aids where possible.

It's a team effort to maintain a safe workplace, and every worker must respect the set weight limits for manual handling, utilise the mechanical aids available, seek help when needed, and always use the correct lifting technique.

Use mechanical aids or ask for help to reduce risks. In this way, you can prevent musculoskeletal injuries that can cause impairment for life.

From 1st June, NSS orders will change to a single weekly delivery per site, reducing to fortnightly next year, and Lyreco orders will change to a single monthly delivery per site, on the last Thursday of each month. Wellbeing | Men's Health | Prostate and Testicular Cancer

Our Men's Health campaign aims to bring awareness to health issues that affect men disproportionately and focuses on encouraging men to become aware of problems they may have or could develop and gain the courage to do something about it.

This week's focus is on **Prostate and Testicular Cancer**.

While some people do confuse them, prostate and testicular cancer are separate conditions that have different risk factors, symptoms, and outcomes.



Prostate Cancer is much more common than testicular cancer and is the most common cancer in men. Some FACTS:

- Most men with early prostate cancer don't have symptoms because of the way the cancer grows.
- Prostate cancer is not always life-threatening, but when it is, the earlier you catch it the more likely it is to be cured.
- The chances of developing prostate cancer increase as you get older, most cases develop in men aged 50 or older.
- Prostate cancer is more common in black men and less common in Asian men.
- Obesity increases the risk of prostate cancer.

Testicular Cancer is cancer that's found in the testicles. It is most common in men aged 15 to 49. How serious testicular cancer is depends on the type of testicular cancer, how big it is and if it has spread.

Main symptoms of testicular cancer:

- a lump or swelling in your testicle
- your testicle getting bigger
- an ache or pain in your testicle or scrotum (the skin that covers the testicles)
- your scrotum feeling heavy, firm or hard

Other symptoms include:

- an ache or pain in your back or lower tummy
- losing weight without trying
- a cough
- difficulty breathing or swallowing
- a sore or swollen chest

These symptoms are very common and can be caused by many different conditions. Having them does not definitely mean you have testicular cancer but it's important to get them checked by a GP. This is because if they're caused by cancer, finding it early may mean it's easier to treat – it is therefore important to <u>check</u> <u>your testicles</u> regularly. Successful Collaboration Delivers State-of-the-Art Flagship Plant



After several years of design, build and more recently testing stages, Swinderby quarry's new processing plant is now being handed over to the local operation team to begin business as usual operations – a momentous end to a long and challenging project.

The impressive new plant will enable the quarry to process significantly higher quantities of high-quality sand and gravel, with the potential to produce up to 700,000 tonnes a year, nearly doubling production. The successful delivery of a project of this scale was mainly due to the outstanding collaboration between the Cemex Operational site and Engineering team, along with contractor CDE, the company who designed and built the new plant.

The Engineering team included Senior Project Manager, David Hakes, and from the end of 2022 Engineering Project Manager, Jamie Ewing, who is CDM (Construction Design and Management) site Manager for the construction of the new processing plant on the Swinderby project. Vanessa's team included Gary Pell, Assistant Quarry Manager, Neil Robinson, Supervisor, Alistair Longdon, Supervisor, John Feast, Plant Operative, Tomasz Bielanski, Plant Operative, Mark Bell, Plant Operative and Darren Clay, Plant Operative.



This strong relationship began back in 2021 when the first phase

of the redevelopment began with the installation of 1,600m of field conveyor by Canning Conveyors. Quarry Manager, Vanessa Smithson, and her team continued to operate the existing plant, processing high quality sand and gravel for both internal Readymix plants and external customers, many of which collect their own materials. Meanwhile they were working very closely with Jamie Ewing to help manage the new site construction. One of Vanessa's first priorities was to re-organise the site to accommodate the variety of contractors and the increased traffic, with Health and Safety and Wellbeing a top priority. This was discussed by the team resulting in an improved traffic management plan being implemented and demarcation between both sites being fully defined, benefiting both the day-to-day operations of the quarry and the installation of the new plant. The whole redevelopment has been completed with zero injuries.

With Jamie's in-depth knowledge of the project, and being based onsite at Swinderby, together with Vanessa, they build a very strong working relationship built on excellent communication, expertise and agility. Each day Jamie and Vanessa would discuss items such as traffic management, building management and staffing. Together they were able to make quick decisions to solve problems and overcome all the challenges that the huge operation created daily. These included lack of available contractors, bad weather and issues in the supply chain causing delays in phases of the construction, plus redesigning elements of the plant to improve safety and efficiency.

Vanessa and her team have now taken over the daily operations of the new plant from CDE, running it themselves, while still making improvements and dealing with small issues. Jamie is now at the beginning phase of dismantling the old processing plant, with many parts being repurposed at other Cemex sites.

The successful collaboration between Operations, Engineering and the Contractors have resulted in the delivery of a multimillion state-of-the-art processing flagship plant that the teams are very proud of. In a recent visit from Operational and Commercial colleagues from Cemex Spain, the local team were able to showcase the new plant's advanced ergonomic and ease-of-maintenance design features, along with the digital monitoring sensors and health and safety features.

Well done and congratulations to everyone involved in this flagship plant, which will be producing quality sand and gravel for their customers for many years to come.

UK News: Voting Information, General Election 4th July 2024



As you'll all have seen, a General Election has been called and Britain will go to the polls on Thursday 4th July. In order to have your say on the decisions that will shape the country for the next five years, we'd urge you to go out and vote.

Below are some key details and dates that might be helpful in making a plan to vote:

• <u>Registering to Vote</u>: You will need to be registered in order to

vote in the General Election. If you've never registered before, have moved house or have changed your name, you will need to re-register. **The deadline to register to vote in the Parliamentary general election on Thursday 4th July is Tuesday 18th June**.

- A link to register to vote is <u>here</u>.
- <u>Voter ID</u>: You will need some form of photo ID to cast your vote, a passport, or photocard driving license will do. If you don't have either of these, you can apply, free of charge, for a 'Voter Authority Certificate'. The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate to vote in the Parliamentary general election on Thursday 4 July is 5pm on Wednesday 26 June.
 - Register for a free of charge 'Voter Authority Certificate' <u>here</u>.
- <u>Proxy Votes</u>: If you know that you won't be able to get to the polling station on polling day, **you can** ask someone you trust to cast your vote on your behalf. This is called a proxy vote and the person casting your vote is often referred to as your proxy.
 - The person voting on your behalf can either go to your polling station to cast your vote, or can apply to vote on your behalf by post. The deadline to apply for a proxy vote in the Parliamentary general election is 5pm on Wednesday 26th June. You must also be registered to vote by 11:59pm on Tuesday 18th June.
 - Register for a proxy vote via Gov.uk with the link, <u>here</u>.
- <u>Postal Votes</u>: If you know that you won't be able to get to the polling station on polling day, **you can also vote by post**. You can apply for a postal vote if you're away on holiday or because your work schedule means you can't get to polling station. You can also choose to vote by post simply because it would be more convenient for you. You will be sent a postal vote ballot pack before the election.
 - The deadline to apply for a postal vote in the Parliamentary general election is 5pm on Wednesday 19th June. You must also be registered to vote by 11:59pm on Tuesday 18th June.
 - Register for a postal vote via Gov.uk with the link, <u>here</u>.
- **Polling Stations & Local Democratic Services:** If you would like to check where your polling station is and beware, these can differ from one election to the next, check which candidates are standing in your local area, or for any further details, please check your local council's website.

Summary

As a business we are constantly looking for ways to reduce our environmental footprint and improve our sustainability credentials. The Procurement team have been in discussions with our approved stationery supplier – Lyreco – and PPE supplier – NSS – to identify ways in which our purchasing habits can help improve our environmental footprint by reducing the number of site deliveries, thereby reducing CO_2 emissions. The following changes are being made to how we order PPE and stationery. These changes will take effect from **1**st **June**.

NSS (PPE) Ordering Changes

- From 1st June a single weekly delivery per site, reducing to fortnightly next year.
- Order cutoff time is Mondays at 2pm. Orders will normally be dispatched early Tuesday, ensuring delivery to sites by Wednesday of the same week.
