Recycled Materials at Newport



In line with our Future in Action strategy, Cemex UK are looking to increase the use of recycled materials, contributing to both reducing our CO₂ emissions and building a circular economy through partnerships with other industries, authorities, and communities. Our objective is to maximise the use of other industries' non-recyclable waste and by-products.

To support this strategy, our Newport Readymix Plant in South Wales has recently taken three truckloads of recycled sand from Neal soils. This sand was then used in

Cemex materials produced at the Plant. Once the delivery trucks had offloaded the sand, two of them then reloaded with new material containing some of the recycled sand, and delivered to two Cemex customer sites. The third truck was used to take away a load of wash waste from Newport Plant's wash pit to be recycled at the sand supplier's depot. This is an excellent example of circle economy and truck utilisation between both parties, saving costs and the environment.

With excellent planning and by growing the use of recycled aggregates, our sites are positively contributing to Cemex's Future in Action goals to become net-zero CO_2 by 2050.

EPD Publication Success



Cemex UK has published Environmental Product Declarations (EPDs) for products at its Rugby and Tilbury Cement Plants. The EPDs have been gained for cement delivered in bulk tankers, covering more than 80% of manufactured cements.

Paul Fletcher, Head of Sustainability for Cemex Europe, comments that: "Achieving third-party verification through the International EPD System provides independent and transparent information of our cement's environmental performance over the entire lifecycle of the product.

The EPD factors in all raw materials, energy inputs and water usage

throughout the manufacturing process and therefore provides us with a holistic validation of our products to support our net zero ambitions."

Its CEM II/A-L 52,5N (Cemstone) is a factory produced Portland composite cement with the addition of limestone, containing around 80% clinker. It provides benefits in a wide range of concrete, mortar, render, screed and grout applications being suitable for use as an alternative to Portland cement in most types of concrete.

Its CEM I 52,5N cement is a traditional Portland cement, containing 95% - 100% clinker, and is now being replaced by Cemstone across most customer segments due to the lower carbon intensity of Cemstone.



Both cements can be used to produce precast and prestressed concrete elements and can be used in readymix concrete. Recent changes to BS8500, the complimentary British Standard to the European concrete standard EN206, now allow Cemstone to be used in combination with other additions to produce concrete suitable across a wide range of Exposure Classes and therefore specifiers and concrete producers can select and produce even lower carbon concretes that supports the industries drive to Net Zero by 2050.

Craig Williamson, Cement Commercial Director for the UK: "This is another important step on our journey to produce more sustainable cement products for our customers and provide them with the confidence they need to ensure that they are able to meet their own sustainable building and construction ambitions."

The CEM II A-L variety (Cemstone), sits within Cemex's Vertua[®] product portfolio which includes building materials with attributes that demonstrate either a lower carbon embodiment, the use of recycled materials, improved thermal efficiency, increased water conservation or design optimisation.

The Big Butterfly Count is a UK-wide survey aimed at helping to assess the health of our environment simply by counting the amount and type of butterflies (and some day-flying moths) we see.

Why not take part! It only requires 15 minutes of your time and it's easy to use the App to record your observations. Insects have been in serious decline for decades and this project is helping Scientists understand the reason behind the losses.

Cemex works with Butterfly Conservation at several sites and they've always been helpful and encouraging, their advice has seen new habitats created that help support butterflies and moths.



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Psychoactive Substances in the UK: Understanding, Effects, and Support

Psychoactive substances, commonly known as "legal highs", are a broad category of drugs that alter a person's perception, mood, or consciousness. These substances can range from synthetic cannabinoids to synthetic cathinones, and their effects can vary widely. They mimic the effects of traditional controlled drugs like cannabis, cocaine, amphetamine, and MDMA (ecstasy).

While the term "legal" might suggest safety, these substances are often unregulated and can pose serious health risks due to their untested and unknown nature.



Effects of Psychoactive Substances:

Effects can include anxiety, paranoia, hallucinations, rapid heart rate, and even psychosis. Long-term use can lead to addiction, mental health problems, and physical harm.

As with alcohol, colleagues under the influence of psychoactive substances present an injury hazard to themselves and also place their colleagues in danger or in the difficult position of being expected to cover for unsafe work practices.

Co-ordination, motor control, alertness and ability to exercise judgement can become affected by psychoactive substances use. These safety risks are greater where people operate machinery, drive vehicles or plant, or rely on concentration to do their work and can result in:

- workplace accidents, injuries or damage to equipment
- increased absenteeism and reduced productivity
- poor teamwork or workplace relationships
- disciplinary or conduct problems.

If you or someone you know, may be struggling with psychoactive substance use, there are lots of resources available to reach out for support.


