During the demonstrations employees from Aggregates, Readymix, Building Products, Dry Silo Mortars, and our Head Office had the opportunity to experience various scenarios through VR headsets. These scenarios included abseiling down an aquarium, working on top of the Blackpool Tower, and navigating a confined space tunnel. The immersive experience provided a unique and engaging way to learn about safety protocols and procedures.

The Health & Safety Technologies Group are always on the lookout for innovative solutions and new technologies to help Cemex continuously improve our Health & Safety performance. The group at Dove Holes was particularly engaged, and the VR training sparked numerous ideas and lively discussions.

Following the sessions the team, including Lee Wearing from the Health & Safety team, believes that VR training could be the future of safety training for both new entrants and seasoned employees. By





simulating environments that closely resemble our local sites, we can provide more effective training for activities such as working at height and confined space activities.

Know the Symptoms

UK Environmental Briefing - Simpler Recycling, Waste Segregation Changes



The latest Environmental Briefing is about new waste segregation requirements in England called Simpler Recycling. This is a new legal requirement applicable to all sites in England which follows similar legislative changes in Wales last year. The Simpler Recycling changes must be implemented on all sites by **31st March 2025.**

The main change is that all sites including offices, require a Food waste bin alongside the current General and Mixed Recyclables bins. Also, Glass waste is prohibited from existing bins, and we recommend that glass waste is eliminated wherever possible. Where glass waste is generated, a separate glass collection service must be obtained. Our approved waste contractor, Biffa will shortly be rolling out the food waste bins to all sites. Where alternative waste contractors are used, please confirm the suitability of the proposed service with the Procurement or Sustainability team. Information posters can also be downloaded to show what waste types can be disposed of in each bin.

Simpler Recycling – New Legal Obligations in England

Summary

The UK Government has implemented the new Simpler Recycling legislation to reform waste collections and recycling across England. This follows segregation requirements already introduced in Wales which will remain unchanged. This new regulation aims to clear up confusion over recyclable and non-recyclable materials, standardise recycling practices for workplaces, reduce landfill waste, and tackle illegal waste activates, promoting a more sustainable and environmentally conscious approach to waste management.

By March 31st 2025, all Cemex sites are legally obliged to have provision for the separate collection of recyclable waste streams. It has been agreed with Biffa that to meet the legal requirements the following separate bins will be required:

- General Residual (non-recyclable) waste
- Mixed Recycling Dry recyclables (paper, card, plastics, metals)
- Food
- Glass (only if glass waste will be generated we are not expecting sites to need this)

The significant change is that all sites will be provided with a new Food Waste collection bin to supplement the Dry Recyclables bin (paper, card, plastics, metals) and General Waste bin (residual non-recyclable waste) already provided. **No provision will be available for the disposal of glass unless specifically requested locally.** No glass will be permitted in the General, Dry Recycling or Food Waste bins.



Key Points

- Poor management could lead to environmental prosecutions. The EA and NRW could audit sites at any time to confirm compliance.
- > Poorly segregated waste could also cost us more through wasted journeys and refused collections.
- Good segregation could lead to reduced general waste costs.
- Our compliance with Simpler Recycling can only be assured through the use of Biffa waste services. If an alternative waste management contractor is used then compliance must be confirmed with the Procurement and Sustainability teams.
- You will be receiving an additional food waste bin before 31st March 2025.
- No glass will be permitted in the General, Mixed Recycling or Food Waste bins. A separate glass bin will need to be requested locally if required, but it is recommended that all glass waste be eliminated from sites.
- Further information on the Biffa roll out will be made available via Procurement and Sustainability in preparation for compliance by March 31st 2025.

Food waste container, what goes in?

Remember

Make sure all food waste is free from contamination such as plates and cutlery. If the waste contains any material that is not food it cannot be recycled.



Recycling container, what goes in?





- Shredded paper Paper or cardboard contaminated with food/oil/grease/paint • Tissues/paper towels/kitchen roll
- Till receipts
 Laminated paper cups

Remember

No hazardous waste. Make sure all material is clean, dry and uncontaminated. If the recycling waste is wet or contaminated with oils, foods etc, it cannot be recycled.



General waste container, what goes in?







- Clean paper, card, tins, cans or plastic containers Food
- Glass Electrical or battery-operated devices and products

Remember

If it can be recycled, put into the correct container ensuring it is clean and dry. Anything that cannot be recycled needs to go into the general waste.

Partnership Update

I'm gradually visiting more quarries and my recent visit to Dove Holes Quarry was fascinating. I've been most familiar with sand and gravel quarrying, so Dove Holes was an eye opener. My

involvement there is focusing on monitoring the Twite, a special bird found at the site. To many, a Twite will look like a LBJ – little brown job. It looks like a slimmer sparrow, streaky brown with peachy colouration around the face. They like weedy areas of uplands, feeding on flower heads and seeds and scrubby areas for nesting. The loss of these areas has led to their decline and they're now a rare breeding bird in England (more common in Scotland).

Despite the national trend, Dove Holes has maintained a Twite presence. Cemex, working with the RSPB, has created good quality habitat for Twite in their surrounding fields. The site acts as a stop off point for birds migrating back to their breeding grounds in the Spring. In winter, they leave uplands for coastal salt marshes, but Dove Holes acts as a "service station," providing supplementary food to help sustain them on their journey. This careful feeding program supports monitoring efforts, ensuring their needs are met without unintended consequences (see Actions for Nature).

I'm back at Dove Holes in March to meet up with a local birdwatcher who monitors Twite using the fields near the quarry.

Actions for Nature

A reminder to clean bird tables and feeders to keep birds healthy. Ideally, birds would find natural food, but habitat loss makes supplementary feeding essential, especially during the spring "Hungry Gap" when food is scarce. Dirty feeders can spread diseases like avian pox, bird flu, and finch



trichomonosis, which has severely impacted Greenfinch populations. Use mild detergent to clean feeders, move them occasionally to prevent food buildup, and remove any mouldy food. Feeding birds safely helps



connect us with nature, benefiting mental well-being. Monitoring garden birds also reflects the overall health of our environment.

Problem, context, environment, status

Most plants have some small minor air leaks. Unless the plant manager remembers to turn off the compressor when he has a gap in loading, the compressor will keep on running.

Description of the initiative

We have fitted a solenoid valve to stop the air at the outlet of the air receiver. This means if there are any small air leaks, that haven't been repaired, the compressor will automatically shut off when the pressure meets the target in the air receiver. The solenoid is linked to HTC batching system, when the batch gets to the finalisation screen a output is sent to the solenoid to shut. A second solenoid is also in line that is linked to our silo protection system, so if we're not batching, but have a cement delivery, the air can still operate the shut off valve. On top of this we have fitted a manual valve, just in case either of the solenoids fail, or we have a need for maintenance.
