Latest Safety Alert - Contractor Hand Injury

The latest Safety Alert relates to an incident on one of our sites where a contractor unfortunately sustained a hand injury while commissioning a jib crane. The incident occurred when the Engineer's hand was trapped by the hoist trolley, resulting in a wound to his index finger that required stitches. Effective planning,

pre-job risk assessment and improved communication between the two contractors involved would have helped reduce the risk of injury.

Site Security Over Easter

For the attention of all Quarry and Site Managers:

In anticipation of the forthcoming Easter Holidays, when we tend to see an increase in trespass incidents coinciding with better weather and school holidays, it is timely for site teams to check their safety and security arrangements, ensuring suitable fencing and signage are in place around site boundaries and at higher risk areas such as lagoons, checking appropriate rescue equipment is available, such as throw ropes and life rings, that mobile plant is safely parked up and secure when not in use, along with any fuel storage.





Checks on site security and precautions to deter trespass should form part of site inspection schemes, with repairs being documented and photographed where possible.

Going FORS Gold



Cemex UK has once again been awarded the Gold FORS Award for its fleet management.

The Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS) is a voluntary accreditation scheme for fleet operators which aims to raise the level of quality within fleet operations, and to demonstrate which operators are achieving exemplary levels of best practice in safety, efficiency, and environmental protection.

Gold accreditation is only awarded to exceptional operators who have met exacting targets.

On sharing the certificate with the teams Hugh commented: "Thanks to all on the ground who helped getting us through this year's application, despite the increasing demands from FORS for information. The cooperation and teamwork from all ensured we got through our Silver and Gold for another year. Well done."

Major Safety Improvement at Northfleet Wharf

The team at Northfleet Wharf on the Thames has recently completed a major safety improvement to allow access to the Ship to Shore hoist on the Luffing conveyor so that it can be inspected under LOLER (Lifting Operations and Lifting Equipment Regulations 1998).



This work involved the installation of a temporary underslung scaffolding platform to allow the permanent underslung access platform to be installed.

The team worked well together to ensure each part of the installation was completed safely. This involved safety harnesses being worn at all times, a man rescue recovery tripod and restricted manned controlled access to the area.

All of the work was carried out 'Working at Height' while over the Thames with a rescue boat on standby and was completed safely. Throughout the project there was excellent communication between all parties - Engineering/Operations/Marine and The Port of London Authority.

The Project was completed on time and within budget, and with no effect on sales – all due to a fantastic 'One Cemex' cross team working together.

Updated Guidance for Using Defibrillators

After conducting reviews throughout the business, it has been identified that there are inconsistencies in our first aid arrangements for sites that are equipped with a defibrillator.

In order to standardise our approach, and to ensure uniformity across our UK sites, please use the new updated guidance which you can find on the UK News download page <u>HERE</u>.

The updated changes relate to:

- inspection of equipment
- replacement of date limited pads
- the use of Aspirin in suspected heart attack situations

For all sites that have a defibrillator, it is important that regular inspection and testing of equipment is carried out and documented together with replacement of pads which have an expiry date. The use of Aspirin is limited to when there is a suspected heart attack and should only be administered under the direction of a medical practitioner. Aspirin should not be stored in a normal First Aid box but kept secure with the Defibrillator equipment.

Support for Common Sleep Problems

Sleep is a critical component of overall health and well-being. Here are some statistics highlighting sleep patterns and issues in the UK:

- **Prevalence of Sleep Problems**: Approximately 30% of UK adults experience sleep problems. Additionally, 10% suffer from chronic insomnia, characterised by difficulty sleeping at least three nights a week for over three months.
- **Sleep Duration**: The average UK adult wakes up twice a night, with common disturbances including temperature discomfort, stress, and a snoring partner. Only 36% achieve the recommended eight hours of sleep, while 47% typically get a maximum of six hours.



Impact on Well-being: A study involving 2,000 UK adults found that 48%
reported significant improvements in overall well-being when achieving a
decent night's rest. However, only 31% have adjusted their sleep schedules to align with their fitness
goals.

Do you suffer from any of the following? If so you may be suffering from insomnia.

- find it hard to go to sleep
- wake up several times during the night
- lie awake at night
- wake up early and cannot go back to sleep
- still feel tired after waking up
- find it hard to nap during the day even though you're tired
- feel tired and irritable during the day
- find it difficult to concentrate during the day because you're tired

If you have insomnia for a short time (less than three months) it's called short-term insomnia. Insomnia that lasts three months or longer is called long-term insomnia. Short term insomnia can be helped with self-care techniques, some of which are listed below. However, if you have long-term insomnia you will benefit from speaking to a doctor.

SAFETY ALERT CONTRACTOR HAND INJURY

DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT

An upgrade project at a Block Plant included installation of two vertical strapping machines. The coils of plastic strapping that feed the machines weigh approximately 70kg, therefore, a jib crane with electric hoist and lifting attachment is required to lift the coils onto their holders.

As part of the commissioning of the jib crane, two Service Engineers were carrying out deflection tests, an activity which involves putting a weight on the lifting hook and travelling the trolley across the runway beam. One Engineer was at height in a mobile elevated work platform inspecting the beam, while the other Engineer controlled the movement of the trolley via a pendant control at ground level. As the Engineer at ground level operated the trolley to travel slowly across the beam, the Engineer inspecting the runway beam had hold of the beam, with his hand too close to the trolley and the trolley trapped the end of his index finger. The resulting wound had to be closed with dissolving stitches.

HOW COULD THIS HAVE BEEN AVOIDED

- Encourage contractors to adopt a STOP & THINK mentality by carrying out pre job risk assessments before tasks commence and again if there is a change in working method.
- Ensure risk assessments and method statements consider key activities where coordination and communication needs to be clear; both Engineers should have communicated with each other before operating the crane to ensure they were clear before carrying out the deflection test.
- Ensure we STEP IN / Take 5 Together if we see anyone who may be at risk of injury.

KEY REVIEW POINTS

- Do the RAMS/SSoW detail how of to carry out commissioning procedures. In this case, the procedure of how to carry out a deflection test in detail.
- Do contractors need 2-way portable radios when carrying out tasks at different height levels.
- Ensure pre job risk assessments are carried out (e.g. Take 5) before tasks start to ensure all hazards and risks have been identified and necessary precautions are in place.

Partnership Update

I visited Denge Quarry on the Dungeness Peninsula earlier this week with Sean Cassidy, Cemex EMEA Biodiversity Manager. It feels like the end of the world in this landscape where land, sea and sky all seem in such proximity to each other. Like a stoney beach stretching inland, this is a unique and rare habitat. Vegetated coastal shingle is a specially protected habitat in England. It's a fragile habitat but its plants must be tough to survive where water and nutrients are scarce and there's little shelter from the elements.

There is a history of past quarrying on the Peninsula, creating waterbodies used by birds, such as at the nearby RSPB Dungeness

reserve. Most of the area is now a National Nature Reserve.

I was hoping to see some Spring migrant birds, but didn't expect a Hoopoe – see photo right! It's a colourful and funny bird (crest on its head, floppy flight), about the size of a dove, it's a rare migrant in the UK.

More expected (but still special) birds seen were Lapwings on the islands; Great Crested and Little Grebes, Shelducks, Gadwalls on the lake; Kestrel, Stonechats and Skylarks around the margins.

Spring is a great time of year to go for walk to see the great reawakening of nature. I especially enjoy hearing the birds sing, and that the variety and volume of song increases as resident birds are joined by summer migrants from late March onwards.

One of the earlies Spring migrants to return in March and start singing is the Chiffchaff. This is a species of warbler, a family of birds known for their songs; warble means a song or to sing. Bird song can seem difficult to learn, but here the Chiffchaff is very helpful in singing its name – two alternating notes that sound like 'chiff chaff'. Part of its Latin name means money counter; its song was thought to sound like the chink of coins from one pile to another. It's a common summer migrant and likes areas with trees. So, see if you can hear a Chiffchaff this Spring.
