UK Cement Celebrate 1 Year ZERO LTIs

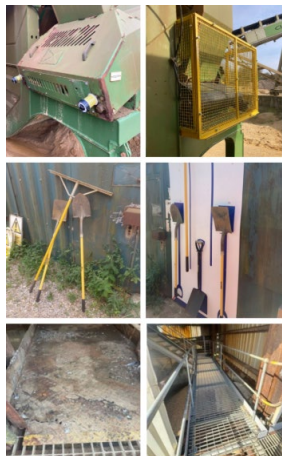

Smart Glasses or Wearable Technology Prohibited

In response to a serious road traffic incident involving a commercial vehicle driver from another company who was watching video content through AI-powered smart glasses while driving, Cemex has introduced new guidance prohibiting the use of smart glasses and any other wearable technology while driving.

As wearable technology becomes more common, devices such as [AI smart glasses](#) can look almost identical to standard prescription glasses or sunglasses. However, they can display information directly in the wearer's field of vision and offer features including messaging, video playback, navigation, recording and other applications, creating a significant distraction.



To help keep everyone safe, **the use of smart glasses or any wearable technology is strictly prohibited while driving and in any situation where distractions could create a safety risk.** This applies to all employees and contractors across our operations.

Whether you're behind the wheel, operating plant or equipment, or carrying out any task on site, your full concentration, without distractions, is needed at all times. Even a momentary distraction can have devastating consequences for you, your colleagues and members of the public.

Please take a moment to reflect on the importance of staying focused. By eliminating distractions and remaining fully attentive, we can all play our part in ensuring everyone goes home safely every day.

Safety Starts With Us



At the recent MPA Health and Safety Awards in the UK, the event was opened with a fantastic video featuring Lex Russell, Cemex UK Materials Managing Director and MPA Chair, and BBC TV presenter, Mike Bushell.

This video takes viewers on location to our Dove Holes quarry in Derbyshire where Lex and Mike discussed the importance of a strong safety culture, built on personal responsibility, behavioural safety, and

visible leadership. While touring the site and speaking to Cemex colleagues, they also talked about how a health & safety culture is focused on preventing complacency, empowering everyone to stop unsafe work, and ensuring systems are designed to support safe behaviours.

New Swindon DSM Plant is Open for Business

Our new state-of-the-art facility in Swindon Wiltshire, dedicated to lower carbon dry mortar and sprayed Concrete production, is now open for business.

Our new Plant will enable Cemex UK's Mortar business to increase production capacity in the South East and South West, and ensure it can offer nationwide supply of both Dry Mortar and Sprayed Concrete.

Following significant investment, the new Plant includes a state-of-the-art drying process which has been specially developed to reduce heat and significantly save fuel. Supplies into the new plant will be received in a dedicated under-cover storage area which will enable additional shelter and protection from wet weather conditions.

Lex Russell, Managing Director UK Materials, comments: "We have seen our Mortars business grow from strength to strength in recent years, with demand exceeding capacity for Dry Mortar and Sprayed Concrete at Dove Holes in Derbyshire and at our Dry Mortar plant in Braintree, Essex."

"We're therefore delighted that the opening of our new Wiltshire Plant will enable us to increase capacity and penetrate new regional markets, while expanding and better serving our existing customer base."

To mark this fantastic milestone, Matt celebrated with members of his team (pictured), recognising his dedication and the positive impact he has made over the years.



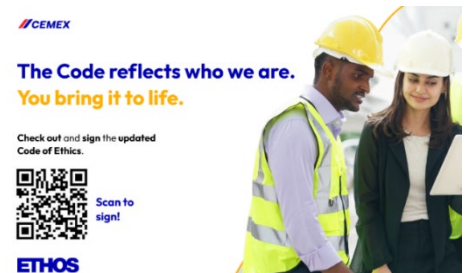

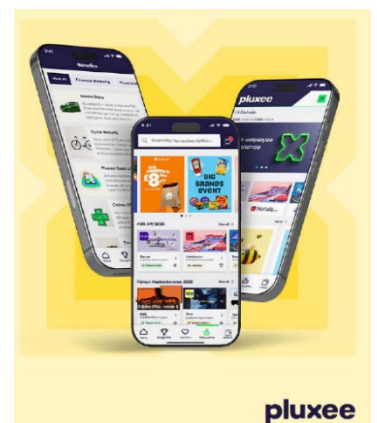
Pluxee App – Getting Notified

Cemex & RSPB Partnership Blog July 2026

Partnership Update

In June, I joined Sean Cassidy (EMEA Biodiversity Manager) on site visits with Lucile Panet, an intern from Cemex France. Together we visited Swinderby, Willington and Dove Holes quarries to see the historically and more recently restored areas, and operational areas to see how they contribute to biodiversity and Cemex's Nature Positive work programme.

The visits focused on wetland habitats at Swinderby and Willington, and upland calcareous grassland at Dove Holes. We recorded an impressive range of wildlife, including lots of dragonflies (Emperor, Brown and Southern Hawker, and Black-tailed Skimmer) and damselflies (Azure, Banded Demoiselle, Blue-tailed and Emerald), and butterflies (Common Blue, Gatekeeper, Meadow Brown, Painted Lady, Peacock, Red Admiral, Small Copper and Small Tortoiseshell). A particular highlight was spotting a female and juvenile Marsh Harrier at Willington Quarry.

This wetland bird of prey is expanding into the Midlands, thanks to restored mineral sites creating valuable reedbeds and wetland habitats.

Earlier in the month, Sean and I attended the Mineral Products Association (MPA) Biodiversity and Nature Conservation Group meeting at Tarmac's Langford Lowfields Quarry. Derbyshire Wildlife Trust presented its new vision for the River Trent, building on earlier work developed by Nature After Minerals, the RSPB and the MPA. The vision recognises mineral site restoration, such as at Willington Quarry, as an important driver for habitat creation and the return of species including Marsh Harrier.

A visit to the neighbouring RSPB reserve at Langford Lowfields, showcased the successful restoration of former sand and gravel workings to thriving reedbeds, highlighting the important role mineral restoration plays in creating habitats and supporting species recovery.

Actions for Nature



Discover Birdsong with the Merlin Bird ID App

Do you want to know which birds are singing around you? The free Merlin Bird ID app, developed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, can identify birds simply by listening to their songs and calls.

Using it is easy:

- Download the Merlin Bird ID app to your smartphone.
- Open the app and select Sound ID.
- Allow microphone access and tap Start.
- Hold your phone still while the app listens.
- Merlin identifies birds in real time, highlighting each species as it sings.

Whether you're at work, walking in nature or relaxing in your garden, Merlin is a brilliant way to discover the wildlife around you.

Focus on Lakes

There has been a significant historic loss of wetlands across lowland Britain due to a combination of land drainage, river canalisation and changes in land use. Creating more space for water is now essential to support the recovery of wetland species. Lakes are becoming increasingly important for wildlife, providing reliable access to water as warmer climates and more frequent heatwaves put greater pressure on natural habitats.

Creating new wetlands from scratch is costly, but mineral extraction followed by restoration provides an ideal opportunity to shape the land and create lakes, pools and associated wetland habitats. A key consideration in lake design is the gradient of the banks and shoreline. The shallower the banks, the greater the area exposed when water levels fall. This exposed area, known as the ecological drawdown zone, is vital for biodiversity. Shallow margins support a wider variety of waterside plants, provide easier access for amphibians, and create mudflats that benefit specialist plants, insects and feeding birds.

A varied shoreline, with features such as inlets and spits, creates a greater diversity of habitats, while varied underwater topography provides fish with valuable areas for feeding and shelter.

Areas of taller marginal vegetation, including reedbeds and fens (as shown in the photo above of Willington), provide rich habitats for insects, birds and mammals. Including islands within lakes creates safe nesting sites for birds, protected from terrestrial predators. Shingle or sparsely vegetated islands are ideal for nesting terns, gulls and waders, while islands with scrub and trees can attract breeding colonies of herons and egrets.
